I William
 Warrthrich of Bredege in the Countie of Kent Esquire beinge sicke in Bodie but in
 perfect remembrance thanke be given to Almighty God. Doe make and ordaine thys
 my last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge. That is to saye: first I be-
 queath my soule unto Almighty God my Creator and Redeemer by whose death and
 passion I truste to be saved. and my bodie to be buried in my Chappell in the Church at
 Bredege. And as concerninge the disposinge of all my Landes Tenementes & hereditaries
 not already disposed. I will and bequeath in manner and forme followinge. That is to
 saye. first I geve and bequeath unto Edward Warrthrich my Sonne and to his heires &
 assignes for ever. After the decess of my wife. the reversion of all thos my
 Clost of errable pasture or woodland called or knowne by the name of Higham Clost
 or Higham Garden now or late in the tenure or occupation of John Widdian or of
 his assignes. situate and beinge in Warrthrich in the said Countie of Kent to be
 by estimation two and fifty acres be they more or lesse. And also all thos downes
 commonly called the Comon Downe in Watyngborne a fore saide adjoininge to the said
 Landes called Higham Clost one the laste. Item I geve and bequeath unto Edward
 Warrthrich my Nephewe and to his heires and assignes for ever. All that my messuages or
 Tenementes with all and singuler the appurtenances thereto belonginge situate beinge
 and beinge in East Smythfield within the parische of St. Dunstons without the Citye in
 the Countie of Middlesex. now or late in the tenure or occupation of John Widdian
 Couper or of his assignes. and my will and mynde is that if my said Sonne shall not
 suffer my said Nephewe Edward Warrthrich and his heires quietlie to enjoye the said messuages
 or tenement with the appurtenances that then my said Sonne Edward Warrthrich shall lose
 benefitt of the value of ten poundes of Lawfull Lande by the year of the Lande to him before
 the first presents given and bequeathed wherwith shall be the part of the said Edward
 Warrthrich my Nephewe and his heires for ever. And as concerninge the disposinge of all my goodes
 Chattells as well moveable as immovable what soever I will and bequeath in manner
 forme followinge. That is to saye. first I will and bequeath to Edward Warrthrich
 my Sonne two hundred poundes of Lawfull English money to be payde unto him by
 my next Executors within two years next after my decess. viz. fifty poundes
 the first month next after my decess. and for other fifty poundes within sixe monthes
 next after the first payment. and for from sixe monthes to sixe monthes the some of
 fifty poundes until the sayde some of two hundred poundes be fully satisfied and paid
 Item I will and bequeath unto my said Sonne Edward Warrthrich my seal ringe and my
 gold ringe with the faire Turke stone. and my best gorone. Item I geve and bequeath
 unto my said Sonne Edward Warrthrich one hundred poundes of Lawfull English
 money to be levied of the Dymber and Dymber trees now growinge in and upon the
 manor of Kingstone with the appurtenances in the parische of Kingstone within the
 said Countie of Kent. Item I will and bequeath unto Edward Warrthrich my Nephewe
 one hundred poundes of Lawfull English money to be likewise levied of the Dymber
 and Dymber trees now growinge in and upon the manor of Kingstone a fore saide
 with the appurtenances. Item I will and bequeath unto William Scott my Servant my best
 dublett and hose. Item I will and bequeath unto Edward Warrthrich my Nephewe
 my dublett and hose next in value. Item I will and bequeath unto William Widdian
 my Swante my other dublett and hose next in value. And all other my goodes or Chattells
 what soever my debts beinge payde. I will and bequeath to my wife my well beloved
 wife. whom I doe make my sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament.

 daye of februarye Anno domini one thousand fiftie hundred ffowre score and Seaventye, I
 Nicholas Andrews of the parish of Winstomb in the Countie of Somersett yoman
 beinge sicke in bodie but perfect in mynde and memorye, I haunte be unto Almighty
 God. Doe make ordaine and appoynte this my presente Last will and Testamente
 in manner and forme as followeth: I give bequeathinge my soule unto the Almighty
 and omnipotent God hopinge to be saved by the death and passion of his sonne Iesus
 Christ my sode and onely Redemer. And as to thinge all worldly goodes and Chattels
 and Leases, which yt hath pleased Almighty God to give me withall; I doe devise
 dispose and appoynt yt as followeth: I give to my parish Church of
 Winstomb fiftie shillings: Item I doe give to the parish Church of Shipham fourte shillings
 Item I bequeath unto Thomas Hamman late of Winstomb mynster in the Countie of Dorset
 of whose deceased, did by his Indenture bearinge date the seaventh daye of februarye
 in the Twentieth yere of the Reigne of our most gracious soveraigne Ladie Queene
 Elizabeth the demise grante and to ferme Lett unto one William Perrett of the Citie of
 Bristol drapier deceased, from the feast of St Michaell Charchangell before the date
 of the said Indenture for the terme of one thousand years all those his messuages
 Landes and Tenements, situate and beinge in wintertred within the parish of Shipham
 in the Countie of Somersett and all houses buildynges barnes stables Landes meadowes
 pastures, fedinge Common wodes underwodes durties profits Commodities rents reversiones
 and Service withall and singular the appurtenance what so ever to the said messuages
 Landes and Tenements or any of them belonnyng or in any wise apperteynyng situate
 and beinge within the parish and hamlettes of wintertred Shipham Gorkis and
 Cheddercombe in the Countie aforesaid then late in the tenure of one John Stoked
 and now in the tenure of me the said Nicholas Andrews: And whereas also the said
 William Perrett did afterwarde by his Indenture dated the ffowre and Twentieth daye of
 April in the aforesaid Twentieth yere of the Queenes Maesties Reigne, nowe yet
 demise and grante a l and singular the aforesaid recited messuages Landes appurtenances
 with the appurtenance particularie nammyng the quantite of the said messuages
 Landes and Tenements, and the places where theye by pnto me the said Nicholas
 Andrews my Executors, and assigned from the feast daye of Channuntion of the
 blessed virgyn Marie last past before the date of the said last recited Indenture for the
