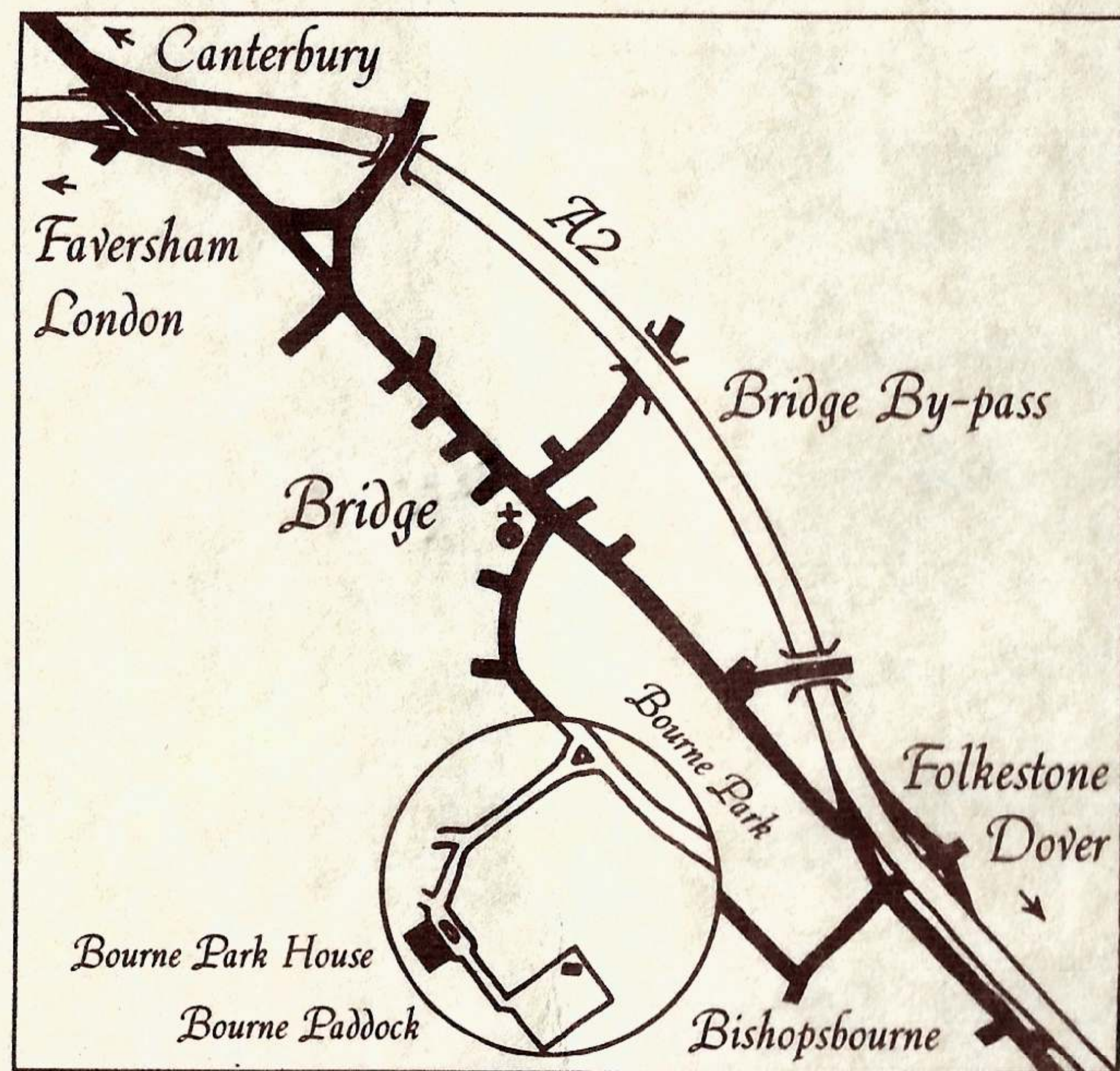


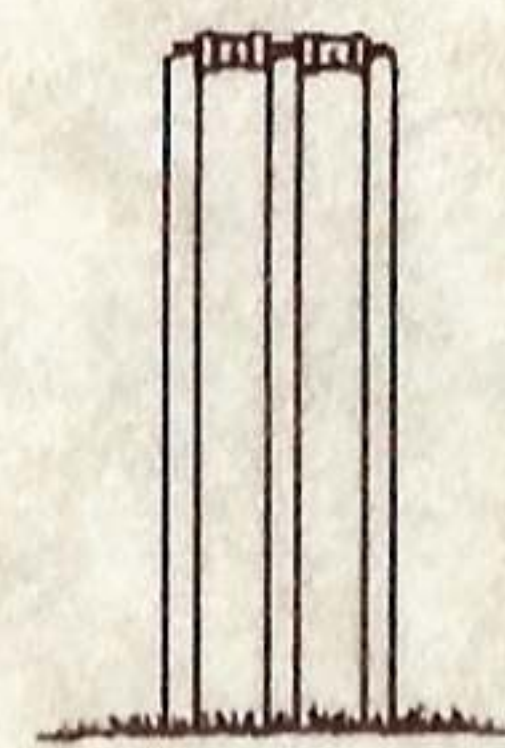

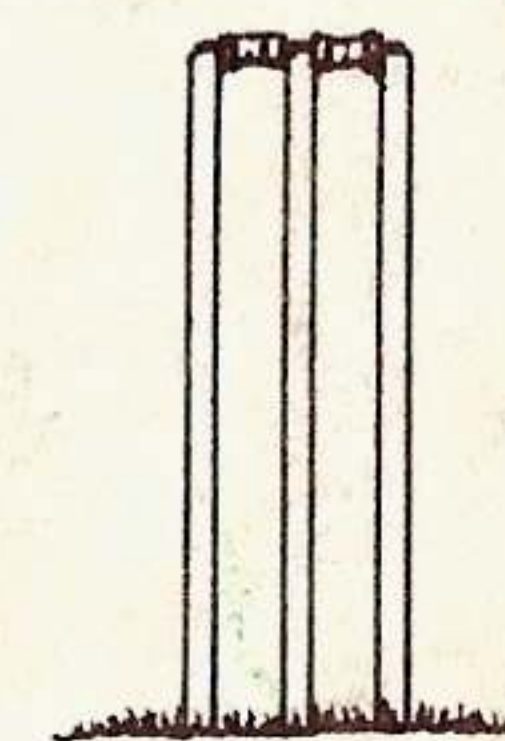

Mozart and Cricket

Mozart, then aged 9, and his family, after a very successful 15 months in England, stayed at Bourne Park House, Bishopsbourne from 24th July - 1st August 1765 as guests of Horace Mann; one of the greatest patrons of English Cricket, whose portrait hangs in the pavillion at Lord's and who founded Bourne Park Cricket Club in 1766.

It is likely that Horace Mann, then aged 21, told and showed Mozart something of cricket. It is enough of a possibility to give us an excuse to celebrate both the music of Mozart, in this the Bicentenary of his death, and that cricket is still being played on this historic ground, known as Bourne Paddock.

Bourne Paddock

In 1989 Bourne Paddock was secured primarily for youth cricket. It is supported by Richard Neame (the owner), the Sports Council, the Kent Playing Fields Association, the Association of Kent Cricket Clubs and more than 100 "friends of Bourne Paddock". The ground is sponsored by Reeves & Neylan and run by the A.K.C.C. (Canterbury District).

Order of events

- 12 noon Grounds open. (Ample free parking and space for your picnic).
Bar opens. Grand Tombola starts. Wilderness Walk open.
- 1.30 p.m. Cricket Match, introduced by E. W. Swanton.
Kent Over 50's versus Sussex Over 50's.
- 3.30 p.m. Home-made Cream Teas for sale.
- 5.30 p.m. Barbecue — Bournebangers and Paddockburgers for sale.
- 7.30 p.m. Open Air Concert of Mozart music by the Beaufort Ensemble
in the garden of Bourne Park House. (Seating is not provided).
- 8.30 p.m. Day ends.

The Cricket Match

Both teams play in the Over 50's competition organised by the National Cricket Association. Kent Over 50's were National Champions in 1989. The players are selected from Kent League and Sussex League Cricket Clubs and include former international and county cricketers.

The Beaufort Ensemble

The Beaufort Ensemble, a young and talented Wind Ensemble of former Royal College of Music students, will give the Open Air Concert of music by Mozart. Their highly acclaimed London debut took place at the Wigmore Hall in June 1990.

Their programme will include the Overtures to "The Marriage of Figaro" and "The Magic Flute" and arrangements of Mozart String Quartets.
