Dear Mrs. Shirley,

I have been looking through the volumes of Archaeologia Cantiana for references to the archaeology of Bridge and Patricxbourne and have found the following sites mentioned.

1. Bifrons Saxon Cemetery. This will be the cemetery that you mentioned in our telephone conversation. It was a rich site and was excavated in the last century; the finds are in Maidstone Museum. It is mentioned in vols. VI, X, XIII.
2. Bridge Hill Iron Age Site. This was excavated quite recently and the finds are in the Royal Museum; it is an early iron age site. It is mentioned in vol. LXXVIII.
3. Vol. XLVI contains an article on the Canterbury - Dover Roman road and describes its course through Bridge.

I don't know whether Bishopsbourne comes in your area, but we have in the museum a Roman glass vessel from the lake in Bishopsbourne Park, and there are Roman barrows in Gorsley Wood, Bishopsbourne. I hope that this is the information you wanted.
