Dear Canon Perry

My husband and I, are most grateful to you, for the remarkable information you gave to Mr Cartwright, who forwarded them to us immediately, about my husband's great-uncle - Charles-Louis de Secondat de Montesquieu, and we wish to thank you most warmly for these precious information. We knew only that he had died in 1824, in England, at Bridge-Hill House, near Canterbury, but nothing else!

Here is a very short "digest" of his life: Baron de Secondat de Montesquieu, was an officer. He took part in the Independence American war, in which he fought very brilliantly. General Washington decorated him, himself, of the Cincinnati Medal.

After the Independence American war, he came back to France, but as the French Revolution broke out in 1789, he was so disgusted by the horrors of

this Revolution, that he emigrated to England in
1790, where he met Miss Mary Ann Mac
geoghegan. O'Neil, which he married. She died
only in 1835. He had married her in 1795. She was
of Irish descent. He took no part in the Napoleonic Wars.

When the King Louis XVIII was restored on his
throne, Charles-Louis de Montesquieu, came
back to France. He was made Lieutenant-
General, by this King. But the Royalist
Restoration having lasted a rather short
time, Charles-Louis came back once more
to England. We presume his wife's parents
possessed Bridge-Hill House?

Of course, he owned the famous
Chateau de La Brède, in France, near Bordeaux,
where the Philosopher Charles de Montesquieu,
was born. Charles de Montesquieu, was his
grandfather.

He had no children, and left his
French possessions to his nephew Cyrielle
de Seondat de Montesquieu. My husband is
a great grandson of Cyrielle de Montesquieu.
Also all the Montesquieu members of the
family, living now.

We hope these few indications will
be of some interest to you, and maybe to
the Halatt family, as you happen to
know this family.
