The population is about 670, distributed over an area of some 2,230 acres. The living is a Vicarage in the gift of the Master of Eastbridge Hospital, Canterbury, the present occupier being the Rev. G. W. Temple, M.A. Blean Union is situated in the parish of Herne, three miles distant, under which parish the Officers, etc., will be found.

BRIDGE.

Post Town, Canterbury. This village enjoys a pleasant situation about three miles from Canterbury on the main road—the old Roman road—to Dover. There is a station about half-a-mile distant on the Elham Valley line from Canterbury to Folkestone. The Church of St. Peter is a handsome building with tall spire, and the interior is also striking. The village consists principally of one long street, which is intersected by an affluent of the river Stour. The living is a Vicarage annexed to that of Patricbourne, in the gift of the Marquis Conyngham, and is held by the Rev. J. H. R. Kirby, M.A. Bridge gives name to a Union, and there are National Schools for the united parishes of Bridge and Patricbourne. The population is nearly 900. The village is lighted by gas, and possesses a Volunteer Fire Brigade, with the necessary appliances.

CHARTHAM.

Post Town, Canterbury. Chartham is a large parish, with a somewhat scattered population of 2,500. The principal portion lies about three miles west from Canterbury, and has a station on the South-Eastern Railway. The river Stour runs through the village, and on it, near the Church, are the extensive paper mills of Messrs. Howard & Son, giving employment to a considerable number of hands.

The East Kent Lunatic Asylum was erected in 1875 on Chartham Downs, at a cost of £250,000, from designs by Messrs. Giles & Gough. It consists of central entrance, with offices and committee rooms. Two blocks on either side, six in the rear, and a chapel in the centre. There is accommodation for 440 males and 465 females. The average number resident in 1892 was 885. The Asylum forms a conspicuous feature in the landscape from the railway, and for some miles round.

The Asylum forms a conspicuous feature in the landscape from the railway, and for some miles round.

ST. STEPHEN'S OR HACKINGTON.

Post Town, Canterbury. St. Stephen's lies about a mile-and-a-half from Canterbury, adjoining the parish of St. Dunstan. The village is small, but pleasantly situated amidst sylvan scenery. At the *Beverley Arms* are held the meetings of a Trap Club, one of the very few in existence for the cultivation of the old game of "Bat and Trap." The *Beverley Arms* is an ancient hostelry with tea gardens adjoining, and affording good accommodation for the many visitors who walk over from Canterbury or elsewhere. St. Mary's College, Hales Place, was founded in
