BRIDGE is a parish, and head of a union, giving its name to a rural deanery; it derives its name from its situation in a valley on the Roman and modern road to Dover, at a bridge over a feeder of the Stour, and has a station on the Canterbury and Folkestone line of the South Eastern railway, and is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south from Bekesbourne station on the Canterbury and Dover section of the London, Chatham and Dover railway, and $2\frac{1}{4}$ south-east from Canterbury, in the Eastern division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine, hundred of Bridge and Petham, petty sessional division of St. Augustine's, Canterbury, Canterbury county court, rural deanery of East Bridge, archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. The village is lighted with gas by a local limited company. The church of St. Peter is of flint, in the Norman style, with some additions of the Early English period, and has a tower, with spire, containing a clock and 4 bells: the windows are stained: within a recess is a recumbent effigy of a man in robes, in low relief: the church was repaired and partly rebuilt about 1860, and affords 350 sittings, 80 being free. The register dates from the year 1565. The living is a vicarage, annexed to the vicarage of Patricxbourne, joint yearly value £350, with 33 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of the Marquess Conyngham, and held since 1898

by the Rev. Herbert Knight M.A. of Christ's College, Cambridge, who resides at Patricxbourne. The Wesleyan chapel, built in 1894, is of corrugated iron and wood, and seats 150 persons. The principal landowners are the Marquess Conyngham, who is lord of the manor, Earl Sondes and Matthew Bell esq. D.L., J.P. of Bourne Place. The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and hops. The area is 1,168 acres; assessable value, £3,002; the population in 1891 was 850, including 134 officers and inmates in the workhouse.

BISHOPSBOURNE.

Post town, Canterbury. Bishopsbourne is a parish four miles south-east from Canterbury, and about half-a-mile off the Dover road, with a station on the Elham Valley section of the South-Eastern Railway. The parish is also crossed by the main road from Canterbury to Dover. The church of St. Mary, which was restored and re-seated in 1872 at a cost of £1,600. In 1877 a beautiful stone reredos was added at a cost of £300. An object of great interest is a memorial to Richard Hooker (M.A.), author of the celebrated "Ecclesiastical Polity," and who was rector of Bishopsbourne from 1595 to 1600, the date of his death. The living is a Rectory in the gift of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and at present held by the Rev. Thomas Hirst (M.A.). Bourne Park is the seat of Matthew Bell, Esq. (J.P.), lord of the manor. Charlton Park is the seat of the Rev. William Tattersall (B.A.). The Barham Downs Golf Links occupy about 36 acres to the north-east of the village. The club was founded in 1890, and consists of about 100 members. The links are situated on the Barham Downs, commanding splendid views in every direction. It is a nine-hole course. The subsoil is chalk, which ensures a dry course at all times of the year, and the turf is of the finest description. The monthly medal is competed for on the last Thursday in each month, besides which meetings are held in the spring, summer and autumn, when many valuable prizes are offered for competition. The nearest station is Bishopsbourne, on the Elham Valley branch of the S.E.R., about half-a-mile from the links. The distance from Canterbury is three-and-a-half miles. There is a small club-house for the use of members.

Rateable value is £2,296. The population in 1891 was 316.

Or St. Cosmus and St. Damian-in-the-Blean. Post Town, Canterbury, from which it is about three miles distant, and which is the nearest Telegraph and Money Order Office and railway station. The situation of the parish is in a somewhat wild country, surrounded with wooded scenery, hop and fruit plantations; the main road from Canterbury to Whitstable passes through the parish. The population is about 670, distributed over an area of some 2,230 acres. The living is a Vicarage in the gift of the Master of Eastbridge Hospital, Canterbury, the present occupier being the Rev. G. W. Temple (M.A.). Blean Union is situated in the parish of Herne five miles distant, under which parish the Officers, etc., will be found.

ST. STEPHEN'S, OR HACKINGTON.
