BRIDGE, so named from its situation in a valley on the Dover road at a bridge over a feeder of the Stour, is a parish and head of a rural district, with a station on the Canterbury and Folkestone line of the Southern railway, and is 1½ miles south from Bekesbourne station on the same system, and 3 South-east from Canterbury, in the Canterbury division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine, hundred of Bridge and Petham, petty sessional division of St. Augustine's, Canterbury, county court district of Canterbury, rural deanery of East Bridge and archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. The village is lighted with gas by the East Kent Gas Co. Ltd. The church of St. Peter is of flint, in the Norman style, with some additions of the Early English period, and has a tower with spire, containing a clock and 4 bells: the windows are stained: within a recess is a recumbent effigy of a man in robes, in low relief: the church was repaired and partly rebuilt about 1860, and affords 350 sittings. The register dates from the year 1565. The living is a vicarage, annexed to the vicarage of Patribourne, joint net yearly value £356, with 33 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of the Marquess Conyngham, and held since 1897 by the Rev. Hubert Knight M.A. of Christ's College, Cambridge,

who resides at Patricxbourne. In 1920 a cross was erected in the north-east of the churchyard in memory of 13 men of the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. The Methodish church, built in 1894, is of corrugated iron and wood, and seats 150 persons. The principal land-owners are the Marquess Conyngham, who is lord of the manor, and Earl Sondes. The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and hops; the area is 1,171 acres; the population in 1921 was 699.

CHARTHAM, with **HORTON**.

CHARTHAM is a parish and village, near the road from Canterbury to Ashford, on the river Stour, with a station on the Ashford and Ramsgate branch of the Southern railway, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-west from Canterbury, 11 north-east from Ashford, 65 miles from London by rail and 56 by road, in the Canterbury division of the county, lathes of St. Augustine and Scray, hundreds of Felborough and Westgate, rural district of Bridge, county court district of Canterbury, petty sessional division of Home, rural deanery of West Bridge and archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. Chartham is built round a green, with the parsonage and church on the south side. The church of St. Mary is of flint, stone and brick, chiefly in the Early Decorated style, and has a tower of Perpendicular date, containing a clock and 6 bells: the chancel windows retain much of the original stained glass, and there are numerous brasses, including one to Sir Robert de Septvans, 1306: in 1921 a brass mural tablet was put up bearing the names of the men of the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: there are 300 sittings. The register dates from the year 1558. The living is a rectory, with the chapelry of Horton annexed, net yearly value £700, with residence and 50 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and is now held by the Rev. Morrice Lionel Man M.A. of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, hon. C.F. The Old Tithe Barn was converted into a parish hall by the Rev. F. J. Hazledine (rector 1912-1920). On the village green is a cross, erected in 1920 as a memorial to the men connected with the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. There are three Methodist churches and a Salvation Army hall. A cemetery of 2 acres was laid out in 1899 and a Burial Board of 11 members formed. There is a paper factory. On Chartham Downs were formerly a considerable number of barrows, now ploughed up, in which at various times have been found human remains, pottery and trinkets, mostly of the Anglo-Saxon period, and on the Swarling Downs are three lines of entrenchments. The Chartham Mental Hospital was erected in 1875 on Chartham Downs at a cost of £250,000, and covers with its grounds an area of 204 acres; the buildings will hold 538 men and 569 women. Mystole Park is the residence of Mrs. Virgil Pomfret. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners are lords of the manor. Mrs. Virgil Pomfret, the trustees of the late Henry William Arnold esq. H. D. Barnes esq. and Percy Mount esq. are the largest landowners. The soil is light loam; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and hops. The area is 4,552 acres of land and 17 of water; the population in 1921 was 2,959

Shalmsford Street is a considerable hamlet, adjoining Chartham; Chartham Hatch (or Hatch Green), 1 mile north, is also a hamlet.

HORTON, half a mile north-east, contains 399 acres, and is a chapelry, or hamlet, with 14 houses; Denstead is 2 miles north, in Blean Forest, where also is Petty France; Howfield adjoins Milton; Nickle is 1 mile north-west; Mystole, a mile and a half south-west; Underdown, 1 mile south; Thruxted, 1 mile south.

BEKESBOURNE (or Beakesbourne) is a small parish on the Little Stour, with a station on the Southern railway, 3 miles east-south-east from Canterbury and 59 from London by road and 64½ by railway, in the Canterbury division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine hundred of Bridge, rural district of Bridge-Blean, petty sessional division and county court district of Canterbury, rural deanery of East Bridge and arch-

deaconry and diocese of Canterbury; it is also partly in the city and county of the city of Canterbury. This parish is a member of the Cinque port of Hastings and was formerly a borough. The church of St. Peter is in the Norman, Early English and later styles, and has a tower containing 6 bells, the gift of Miss Gippis: in the church are memorials to the families of Palmer, Hales, Fagge, Eden and Gardner and various memorial

windows: the church was restored in 1882-8, and has 150 sittings. In the centre of the new churchyard is a memorial to the 12 parishioners who fell in the Great War, 1914-18; the cost was defrayed by public subscription. The register dates from the year 1558. The living is a vicarage, net income £317, with residence, in the gift of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and held since 1928 by the Rev. Alfred Amoz Fletcher Lamplugh M.A. of St. John's College, Cambridge. In this parish is the Sanatorium of the Bridge Rural District Council. The Old Palace, an ancient house, was formerly a country residence of the Archbishops of

Canterbury. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the Marquis Conyngham are the principal landowners. The soil is gravel and chalk; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and hops. The area is 1,091 acres; the population in 1931 was 319 in the civil and 326 in the ecclesiastical parish.

BELVEDERE (or Lessness Heath) is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1861 from the civil parish of Erith; it has a station on the North Kent section of the Southern railway, and is 1 mile west from Erith, 4 north-west from Dartford and 12 from London, in the Dartford division of the county, hundred of Lessness, lathe of Sutton-at-Hone, petty sessional division, county court district and rural deanery of Dartford and archdeaconry and diocese of Rochester, and within the jurisdiction of the Metropolitan Police. The parish extends to the banks of the Thames, and is lighted by electricity by the Erith Urban Council, and supplied with water by the Metropolitan Water Board, Kent District. All Saints' church, Erith road, is of cut flints with stone dressings, in the Early English style, and has a western tower with spire containing a clock and one bell: there are four stained windows: the church will seat 600 persons, 280 sittings being free. The register dates from the year 1861. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £542, with residence, in the gift of trustees, and held since 1909 by the Rev. William Richard Hartwright L.Th. of Hatfield Hall, Durham, who is a surrogate. St. Augustine's was created a separate parish in 1917: the church, in St. Augustine's road, has 500 sittings. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £295, in the gift of the Bishop of Rochester, and held since 1933 by the Rev. John Herbert Lawson L.Th. of Durham University. There is a

Congregational church, in Picardy road, erected in 1897 to seat 300. There are also two Baptist chapels, one in Bexley road, built in 1863, seating 350, and another in Upper Abbey road, erected in 1899, with 220 sittings, and a Strict Baptist chapel: there is also a Methodist church. The Salvation Army also have a hall here. The County Technical College and Secondary School, in Erith road, erected at a cost of £11,000 on land given for the purpose by the West Kent Land Development Co. was opened in March, 1907. The Royal Alfred Aged Merchant Seamen's Institution, in Belvedere park, Upper Park road, founded in 1856, and opened January, 1857, is pleasantly situated in 24 acres of ground, commanding a view of the river; it serves as a home for indigent merchant seamen, of not less than 60 years of age, and is available for 100 inmates: a home for the infirm, adjacent to the home, was acquired in 1926 and will hold 27 inmates: there are now about 100 pensioners, who are fed and clothed, and also about 540 out-pensioners, each of whom receives £18 yearly, whilst there are over 200 widows and disabled seamen in receipt of allowance amounting to £4,500 per annum; Capt. R. H. Griffin O.B.E., R.D., R.N.R. (ret.), house governor. In Belvedere Park is a masonic lodge.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1931 was:—All Saints, 6,973, and St. Augustine's, 5,772.

BISHOPSBOURNE is a parish on a feeder of the Stour, on the entrance of the Barham Downs, and about half a mile from the Dover road, with a station on the Elham Valley line of the Southern railway, and 2½ miles south from Bekebourne station on the Chatham and Dover section of that railway, and 4 miles south-east from Canterbury, in the Canterbury division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine, Kinghamford hundred, petty sessional division of Wingham, rural district of Bridge-Blean, county court district of Wingham, rural deanery of East Bridge, and archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. The Nailbourne, a feeder of the Stour, which runs through the parish, rising in the hills above Folkestone, is an intermittent stream, flowing for a few months periodically about every five to seven years, but from 1910 it has been flowing regularly. The church of St. Mary is of flint, in the Early English and later styles, and has a tower containing 4 bells: there is some stained glass, and in the chancel a mural monument with bust, erected in 1632 by Sir W. Cooper kt. to Richard Hooker M.A. (commonly known as "the learned and judicious Hooker"), author of the celebrated "Ecclesiastical Polity," and some time fellow of Corpus Christi College, Oxford; he was rector of Bishopsbourne from 1595 till his death, Nov. 2nd, 1600: in 1890 a memorial window to Hooker was erected, and a lych gate was erected to his memory in 1911: the church was repaired and re-seated in 1872, at a cost of £1,600: there are 215 sittings. The register of baptisms and marriages dates from 1558;

burials from 1571. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £475, with residence, in the gift of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and held since 1932 by the Rev. Walter Fletcher Burnside M.A. of Pembroke College, Cambridge, hon. canon of Canterbury Cathedral. It was formerly united to Barham, but was separated from it in 1846 by Order in Council. In the rectory garden there is a remarkable yew hedge, said by some to have been planted by Hooker. There is a village hall, erected in 1924, seating 180 persons; it has a porch, erected in 1926, with memorial panel added in 1928, in memory of the writer Joseph Conrad, who resided and died here. Bourne Park is the seat and property of Major Sir John Theodore Prestige, who is lord of the manor. Charlton Place, the residence of Mrs. Tattersall, is half a mile south-east, and contains a very fine saloon which was built for George IV. Major Sir John Theodore Prestige, the Marquess Conyngham and the exors. of Major J. C. de V. Tattersall are the principal landowners. In Gorsley Wood are three tumuli, opened in February, 1882, and found to contain stone chests, holding human remains. The soil is loamy; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley and hops. The area is 2,018 acres of land and 5 of water; the population in 1931 was 321. Post & Tel. Call Office (telegrams dispatched but not delivered). BLACKHEATH is a suburb of London, which was included under the Local Government Act, 1888, in the county of London, and in the Lewisham Municipal

borough under the London Government Act, 1899; it is not, therefore, comprised within the Kent Directory, but will be found in Kelly's Post Office London Directory.

BLACKMANSTONE is 3 miles north from New Romney terminal station of a branch of the Southern railway, and 7 south-west from Hythe and consists of one farmhouse and one cottage, in the Ashford division of the county, Worth hundred, lathe of Shepway, liberty and petty sessional division of Romney Marsh, county court district of Ashford, rural deanery of South Lympne, archdeaconry of Maidstone and diocese

of Canterbury. The church has long been in ruins and scarcely any traces of it are now left. The living is a rectory, annexed with the sinecure rectories of Eastbridge Chapel and Orgarswick to that of Dymchurch. Gerard Frank Finn esq. is lord of the manor and principal landowner. The land is principally in pasture. The area is 297 acres of land and 3 of water; the population in 1931 was 3.

BRIDGE is a parish giving its name to a rural deanery; it derives its name from its situation in a valley on the Roman and modern road to Dover, at a bridge over a feeder of the Stour, with a station on the Canterbury and Folkestone line of the Southern railway, and is 1½ miles south from Bekesbourne station on the same system, and 3 south-east from Canterbury, in the Canterbury division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine, hundred of Bridge and Petham, rural district of Bridge-Blean, petty sessional division of St. Augustine's, Canterbury, county court district of Canterbury, rural deanery of East Bridge and archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. The village is lighted with gas. The church of St. Peter is of flint, in the Norman style, with some additions of the Early English period, and has a tower with spire, containing a clock and 4 bells: the windows are stained: within a recess is a recumbent effigy of a man in robes, in low relief: the church was repaired and partly rebuilt about 1860, and affords 350 sittings, 80 being free. The register dates from the year 1565. The living is a vicarage, annexed to the vicarage of Patricxbourne, joint net yearly value £330, with 38 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of the Marquess Conyngham, and held since 1897 by the Rev. Hubert Knight M.A. of Christ's College, Cambridge, who resides at Patricxbourne. A war memorial was erected in 1920 by public subscription in the north-east of the churchyard, to the memory of 13 men of the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. The Methodist chapel, built in 1894, is of corrugated iron and wood, and seats 150 persons. The principal landowners are the Marquess Conyngham, who is lord of the manor, Earl Sondes and Major Sir John Theodore Prestige. The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley, oats and hops. The area is 1,171 acres; the population in 1931 was 713.

BROADSTAIRS with ST. PETER'S.

BROADSTAIRS, anciently called "Bradstow," is a pleasant little town and watering place, with a station on the South Eastern section of the Southern railway, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north from Ramsgate, 77 from London and $3\frac{1}{2}$ south-east from Margate, situated on the eastern coast of the Isle of Thanet, in the rural deanery of Thanet and archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury; it was from 1879 under a Local Board, but is now governed under the Local Government Act, 1894 (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73), by a District Council of twelve members. In pursuance of an Order of the County Council, made in 1894, the name of the Urban District was altered to Broadstairs and St. Peter's, and now comprises four wards—Central, Pierremont, Kingsgate and St. Peter's. The modern extension of the town of Broadstairs has a fine promenade on the summit of low cliffs, but in the older part the streets are narrow and tortuous. Both Broadstairs and St. Peter's are lighted with gas and by electricity by a company. Water is supplied by the Urban District Council; the works were originally erected in 1859, and extended in 1876, 1903 and 1907; in 1925 the pumping and storage plant was reorganised and a system of water softening introduced; the water is obtained from adits in the chalk extending about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles inland. The ecclesiastical parish was formed out of St. Peter's on Sept. 27, 1850. The parish church of the Holy Trinity is an enlargement of a small church originally built in 1829; it is of flint stone in the Romanesque style, consisting of an unusually wide nave with aisles: there are 818 sittings. The register of baptisms dates from the year 1850. The living was declared a rectory Dec. 6, 1867, net yearly value £440, with residence, built in 1870, in the gift of the vicar of St. Peter's, and held since 1909 by the Rev. Lewis Lanning Edwards M.A. of Trinity College, Dublin.

The Roman Catholic church, St. Peter's Park road, is dedicated to Our Lady Star of the Sea. Christ Church, Free Church of England, is in Osborne road. The Baptist chapel, in High street, founded in 1790, was restored in 1909, and seats 250 persons. The Baptist chapel, in Queen's road, built in 1908 at a cost of £2,000, is an edifice of brick with stone dressings, in the Gothic style, from designs by Mr. E. E. Moody, architect: it includes a clock tower, and will seat about 450 persons: the old chapel alongside, built in 1897, is now used as a Sunday school. There is also a Congregational chapel, erected in 1876, with 350 sittings; a Methodist chapel and a preaching room belonging to the Brethren. Bleak House, standing in a prominent position on the cliff, is stated to be associated with the novel, "Bleak House," of Charles Dickens. There are public bathing establishments at Main Bay, Louisa Bay, Dumpton Bay, Kingsgate Bay, Botany Bay and Stone Bay. The Public Library, in the Broadway, comprises reading room and lending department, and contains about 7,000 volumes. York gate, an ancient arch of flintwork, once forming part of the defences of the place, was built by George Cullmer about 1540, and repaired in 1795 by Sir John Henniker bart.; the porticulis and gates have disappeared; near it are the remains of a chapel dedicated to Our Lady of Bradstow and once containing an image held in great veneration by mariners, who were wont to salute it in passing by lowering their sails. The area of the Urban District, which includes the parish of St. Peter Extra, is 2,770 acres; the population in 1931 was 12,745. The population of the Urban District wards in 1931 was—Central, 3,092; Kingsgate, 3,139; Pierremont, 3,309, and St. Peter's, 3,205. The population of Holy Trinity ecclesiastical parish in 1931 was 5,625.

PATRIXBOURNE (or Patricksbourne) is a parish and village, pleasantly situated in healthy country, the Lesser Stour running through the village, which is three-quarters of a mile from the road from Canterbury to Ashford, half a mile south from the Bekesbourne station on the Faversham and Dover section of the Southern railway, and 3 miles south-east from Canterbury; it is in the Canterbury division of the county, lathe of St. Augustine, hundred of Bridge and Petham, rural district of Bridge-Blean, petty sessional division of Horne, county court district of Canterbury, rural deanery of East Bridge, archdeaconry and diocese of Canterbury. The church of St. Mary, a fine structure of the Norman period, is of flint with stone dressings, and has a tower with spire containing a clock and 3 bells: there are some stained windows and monuments

to the Conyngnam family: the church has 120 sittings. At the east end of the churchyard is a memorial, erected by public subscription, to six men connected with this parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. The register of baptisms and burials dates from the year 1556; marriages from 1560. The living is a vicarage, with that of Bridge annexed, joint net yearly value £330, with 33 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of the Marquess Conyngnam, and held since 1897 by the Rev. Hubert Knight M.A. of Christ's College, Cambridge. Bifrons, the property of the Marquess Conyngnam, who is lord of the manor, lay impropriator and chief landowner, is now occupied by Hon. Mrs. Milo Talbot: it is a handsome mansion of stone, standing in a finely-timbered park of 230 acres. Highland Court, the seat of Walter Kennedy Whigham

esq. is a modern mansion of Portland stone, having porticos and columns with carved capitals. The soil is loam; subsoil, chalk and gravel. The chief crops are hops and wheat. The area is 1,559 acres; the popula-

tion of the civil parish in 1931 was 217, and of the ecclesiastical parish (with Bridge), 945. Letters through Canterbury. Bridge is the nearest M. O. & T. office

EAST PECKHAM is a large straggling village and parish, 2½ miles north from Paddock Wood station on the main line of the Southern railway, 2 north-west from Yalding station on the Strood and Paddock Wood section of the same railway, 6 north-east from Tonbridge, 8 west-south-west from Maidstone and 33 from London: it is in the Sevenoaks division of the county, lathe of Aylesford, Twyford and Littlefield hundreds, county court district of Maidstone, petty sessional division, rural district and rural deanery of Malling, archdeaconry of Tonbridge and diocese of Rochester. The navigable Medway passes through the parish and has a wharf at Branbridges. The church of St. Michael is of stone, chiefly in the Perpendicular style, and has a tower containing 6 bells: the chancel was restored in 1855, and the remainder of the church in 1863: there are three memorials to the Twysden family and three to the Cook family, and some remains of ancient stained glass: there are also tablets in memory of Capt. John Norwood V.C. 5th Dragoon Guards, and Lt. John Norton Norwood and Capt. Francis Hart Dyke, who fell near Ypres, 27th Sept. 1917: in 1917 a new altar and reredos was erected in memory of Lt.-Col. Cook, and the aisle was converted into a chapel: the exterior of the church was thoroughly repaired in 1913, and the churchyard was enlarged by the addition of a quarter of an acre: in 1921 a lych gate was erected in memory of the men connected with this parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: the church has 400 sittings. The register dates from the year 1558. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £597, with residence and 8 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury, who are the rectors, and held since 1929 by the Rev. Archibald Harry Partridge M.A. of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, hon. C.F. Holy Trinity is an ecclesiastical parish, formed July 28th, 1843: the church, erected in 1842, is of stone, in the Perpendicular style, and has a turret containing a clock and 2 bells: the church was restored in 1892 at a cost of about £800, and in 1900 a choir vestry was added. In 1919 a memorial was erected in

the churchyard to 43 men of this parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. The register dates from the year 1843. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £300, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of East Peckham, and held since 1924 by the Rev. Raymond Lionel Allanson. There are Methodist and Baptist chapels. Roydon Hall is the residence of R. M. Cook esq. J.P. Sir Coles John Child bart. is lord of the manor. Viscount Falmouth, H. H. Reader esq. H. R. Gardener esq. L. Wheeler esq. R. M. Cook esq. Messrs. Simmons Brothers and Messrs. Allen Brothers are the principal landowners. The soil is clay and loamy; subsoil, various. The chief crops are hops, wheat, beans and fruit. Great quantities of hops are grown here. The area is 3,373 acres of land and 38 of water; the population in 1931 was 1,924.

By the Kent Review Order, 1934, part of this parish was transferred to the parish of Yalding.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1931 was, St. Michael (parish church), 346; Holy Trinity, 1,578.

The Mill stream flows into the river Medway near Little Mill.
