Tin chapel now heavenly home

A tin chapel built for £140 more than a century ago is on the market for almost £400,000.

But the Methodist building in Patrixbourne Road, Bridge, is a far cry from the austere space it once was after an extensive two-year project to convert it into a luxury home.

It retains its period oak floorboards, but the nave has been transformed into a huge open-plan kitchen and main reception room with a large mezzanine.



How chapel once looked

The property is being sold through Strutt and Parker. Agent Edward Church said:

"These chapels were very simply built with the focus on space to congregate. They were not ostentatious buildings."

The Bridge Chapel was not given funding centrally as there were calls for it to be a brick building, so locals raised the £140 to build it from tin.

Mr Church said: "These chapels were one of the original kit buildings, and the corrugated ones were erected in large numbers, but few survive."
