Cream Tea at Dodgers Restaurant

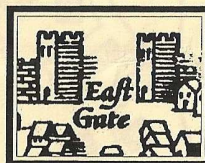
Meet at the restaurant in the High Street, for a cup of tea, scone, jam and cream.

Should you require any extras, please settle separately with the restaurant for them yourself.

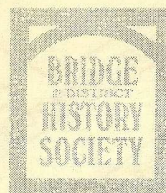
