It is hoped to find a local person with an interest in Bifrons to complete this book and publish it on LLB's behalf.

LLB002	A single sheet of shelf marks from the Bodleian library, Oxford, for papers relating to the Talbot family tenants of Bifrons from 1920 to 1939 and on the back some handwritten notes by LLB
LLB003	Two title pages from an A4 document 'Bridge and Patrixbourne: Suggested partnership for the forthcoming years'. Dec 1990. NB - a full copy of this document is in the Bekesbourne-with-Patrixbourne archive
LLB004	An A4 loose-leafed copy of the catalogue of the Conyngham manuscripts held in the East Kent Archive Centre (now at Maidstone); circa 1850 items pages 1-85 of 86. Includes detailed maps; R-U438/P5 pertaining to Renville Farm/Edward Baker; R-U\$38/P15/1-4 East Kent railway extension to Dover; R-U438/P20/2 River Stour and Little Stour Wickhambreaux to N. Stonar
LLB005A	National Library of Ireland Collection List No 53 compiled by Sarah Ward-Perkins 2000 170 A4 pages Bekesbourne 140/141 missing 137-155
LLB005B	An A5 copy of Collection 53 as at LLB005A has incomplete index but has pages 137-155 missing from LB005A
LLB006	7generations.rtf A set of loose-leafed pages giving the Cumberbatch family history by Robert Cumberbatch and has an e-mail page dated 3 Nov 2001 at the front giving some extra details
LLB007	Elizabeth Conyngham' a comb-bound copy of A4 papers compiled by Graham Evans, schoolmaster at the Chaucer School for 16-year olds studying history; includes information on picturesque architecture as practised by EC and her son in Patrixbourne ie the faux medieval cottages
LLB008	A single sheet of typewritten notes perhaps by BM Thomas who may have made the annotations on LLB007B. It has page reference numbers although there are no page numbers in LB007A. Mostly about the Conyngham's and their position in the court of George IV including their role in his funeral. Some interesting pages on the Cult of Pictoresque/cottages ornees - all achieve their variety of form and outline by gables, bow and dormer windows, jettied storeys, richly-fretted bargeboards and towering 'Tudor' chimney stacks. Poss inspired by Thomas F Hunt design books 1820-1830 (died 1831) 'Old English Domestic Style'. Park gates and lodges a speciality. p20 Bifrons Lower Lodge deemed an outstanding example

LLB022	Typewritten reference papers relating to the Raper connection with the Conyngham family
LLB023	A typewritten paper 'Anthony Blunt: His Lives' by Miranda Carter 2001 - not sure where/how this fits with Bifrons or Patrixbourne
LLB024	A ring binder of typewritten reference papers relating to the Conyngham family - marriages, divorces, court circulars etc
LLB025	A folder of papers relating to the Virginia expeditions labelled Bargrave
LLB026	A ring binder of papers relating to the Virginia company
LLB027	A ring binder of papers relating to the Byron family - one time tenants of Bifrons
LLB028	A ring binder of papers relating to owners of Bifrons including the Slingsby family (Sir Guilford Slingsby Navy Comptroller following Sir Henry Palmer of Howletts. Also papers from the English Historical Review relating to the Navy under James 1 and Charles 1. Also the Baker and Wotton families
LLB029	A ring binder of papers in respect of Patrixbourne including sales particulars for Renville House and for Mulberry Cottage (this one gives the date of the open day for Mulberry Cottage. LLB attended and took photographs. JCT met him there. The cottage was purchased and extensively renovated by Monty and Diane August who had previously owned and renovated the Old Vicarage in Patrixbourne. Also some information on Sir John Maxwell and his role in the Easter Rising plus a miscellany of handwritten notes.
LLB030	A ring binder of papers relating to the Conyngham settled estates and other miscellany
LLB031	A ring binder of papers relating to the tenancy of Mr and Mrs Weinholt who appear to have been great party givers. Many details of dances, balls and other social events. Also of Sir John Miller, one-time tenant; and Frank Penn, amateur cricketer; details of Kent Cricket matches 1719-1880. Also extensive handwritten references to reports in the Kentish Gazette of local events in the early part of the 20th century - between the wars. Much on Eva Talbot's activities - she was very involved in every level of local life including the Bridge Womens Political meetings. Ava moved away in 1939 and died in Knightsbridge in 1951
LLB032	Miscellany of handwritten notes on various matters. Includes a reference to article in Bygone Kent Vol 26 and the funeral of Herbert Arthur Blunt Steward of the Con. Estate for 30 years - his grave was lined with ivy and daffodils by the churchwarden, Kitt. 23/3/1927
LLB033	A ring binder of papers; George IV and the Conynghmas; Elvaston in Derbyshire; Stanhope family; Queen Victoria; Famine in Ireland; Canterbury Bribery Commission; Selby Abbey; Londesborough parish
