Arnold Winkett enlisted in 4th (Queensland Imperial Bushmen) Contingent 1885/90 embarked for S Africa; promoted to Major - Dec. 12 mos active service before being disbanded - Australia 10.8.1901. 1908 became manager of Winkett Estates Co of Australasia Ltd. Responsible for from Queensland properties, food controller, & entered politics 1909 member for Toowoomba - in Legislative Assembly until 1915. That year he failed to win the Federal seat of Wide Bay to which he had been elected to the House of Representatives (German South Africa). While hunting, mauled by a wounded bear, went missing, lost all use of his right hand. 1914 when over to Australia offered to be a British soldier - refused. Returned to Brisbane. March 1915 sailed to Africa with Ivan Lewis, - friend & one of his station managers. Served briefly in border patrol & special service troopers - the British African Police, enlisted in the E Africa Mounted Rifles. Early 1916 seconded to Intelligence branch. Promoted to Warrant Officer. Led a patrol into former E Africa (Tanganyika), collected valuable information, wounded & captured 1.7.1916. Escaped 6 mos later before his own lines after 15 days confinement in Kiboga. Awarded MC for gallantry DSO October 1918. Bar added to MC (with a further Sept FAIB); was by then Captain. 2 mos after arriving home married Enid Frances Sydney Jones on 29.4.1919 at St Philip's Anglican Church, Sydney. Made home & his property, Washpool Farm, nr Kalbar, QLD. Elected to the House of Representatives that year as National Party member for Moreton. Used fort & repeat Kitchener - from others his pronouncements during the war. Bold, determined, spoke up public undauntedness & state enterprise. Voted - accordance with his conscience on all matters except "Motion Licenuse or War of Confidence". Did not contest the 1922 election. 1930 returned to Assembly & voted for Labor, retained seat 1932, did not contest 1935.

Arrived Addis Ababa Dec 1935 as war correspondent for Brisbane Cairns Mail. 2 mos later joined Ethiopian Red Cross as a transport driver & left for the front. Failed to gain friends & public support for his support of Ethiopian cause - Australia vs England. WW2 outbreak - sailed to Aden. In anticipation for commission - the British Army ordered - 31.8.1940 & passed over to the Order to Ethiopia in charge of - small party of natives. His group was a company of Military Mission 101, a force tasked with ^{protecting} the Italian colony of Abyssinia. Ambushed & wounded, best seen 10.9.1940 scrabbling into the bush when a grenade exploded.

Military bearing, moustache, short beard, alert & astute. At Eton "he was conspicuous as a straight-running, fearless boy of great energy". Never smoked & drank alcohol. Trifling but likes to tell ^{a good} story. Man of "outdoor integrity & exacting standards" - abhorred sentimentalism and exaggeration. QLD estate sworn for probate at £174,975.

Edw. Winkett = fine specimen of colonial soldier. Never concealed his fundamental views. Social & political position eventually eroded, but his convictions - cartoons depicted & career of rigid, mannered, together with his territorial acquisition gave him above more pedestrian feelings. A lethargic district at Murgon & - parish near Dalby are named after him. Estate valued for probate at £9144 - NSW at £57000 = QLD

mentioned that he twice performed an operation in which he successfully tied the innominate artery, pointing out that few surgeons could claim to have done this even once (1). The Age noted that

he was acknowledged among his brethren of the lancet and scalpel as having attained to an eminent degree of skill in the surgical art (2).

The Herald spoke of "a warm-hearted and generous man" who was always willing to help the poor when needed (3). This testimony to his philanthropy was echoed in the Legislative Council when one member, Mr. W.A. Zeal, stated that

To his own knowledge, the late Dr. Beaney had done numberless good works, which were never known to the public, for the benefit of the poor and suffering (4).

This generosity, though not his modesty, was characteristic of Beaney and mentioned in all of the obituaries. Zeal admitted that Beaney's good works were "surrounded perhaps by some little tinsel of vanity" (5). Table Talk also praised his generosity but criticised the "aggressive way in which (it was) advertised" (6). Only the obituary in the Medical Press was unconditionally critical to the last, claiming that Beaney's

of the 1880s his ambition for fame had to a large extent been satisfied and the termination of his partnership with Bailliere had ensured that there was no repetition of the types of unprofessional conduct of which he had been guilty in the previous decade.

Beaney died on 30 June, 1891 at his house in Collins Street. He had been suffering from hepatic disease for two years and finally succumbed to serous cerebral effusion (1). His decline had apparently been prompted by a cold contracted whilst waiting to give evidence as a witness in a marital case in November, 1890 and this developed into lumbago and muscular rheumatism (2). This illness became serious but after taking a holiday he did recover temporarily. He carried on working but developed the old symptoms and subsequently died (3).

Obituaries were printed in the Age, Argus, Illustrated Australian News, Leader, Town and Country Journal, Table Talk, AMG and Herald, but not, significantly, in the AMJ. In the main they recounted a brief history of his life and recorded the bequests he made in his lifetime and in his will. The Illustrated Australian News, the Leader and the Age all commented favourably on his skill as a surgeon and specifically
