COLONEL MILO TALBOT

PIONEER SURVEY WORK

Colonel the Hon. Milo George Talbot, C.B., who died yesterday at ~~Edrons~~, Canterbury, in his seventy-seventh year, had seen much war service, but was better known for his extensive surveys on the North-West Frontier of India and in the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan. He mapped many thousands of square miles of previously unexplored country.

Milo George Talbot was the fourth son of the fourth Lord Talbot de Malahide, and since the death in May, 1930, of his brother, the Hon. Reginald Talbot, had been heir presumptive to his nephew, the present peer. Educated at Wellington College, he joined the Royal Engineers in 1873. He served in the Jowaki Afridi Expedition in 1877-78, and in the Afghan War of 1879-80, being mentioned in dispatches and awarded four clasps to the medal and the bronze decoration. His next service was with the Mahsud Waziri Expedition of 1881. In the Nile Expedition in 1897-98 he was D.A.A.G. at headquarters, and received the British and Egyptian medals with three clasps. From 1900 to 1905, when he retired, he was director of Sudan Surveys. For the Great War he returned to duty and served as G.S.O.I., being mentioned in dispatches and made C.B. in 1916.

In 1909 the two Royal medals of the Royal Geographical Society were awarded to Dr. (now Sir) Aurel Stein and Colonel Talbot. As a member of the Afghan Boundary Commission in 1884-86 Colonel Talbot carried out extensive surveys. He carried triangulations single-handed from Mashad to the Hindu Kush, and became the authority on all that lies between Herat and Kabul. When on Sir Robert Sandeman's staff he also carried, with Colonel Wahab, the first series that was ever attempted through Baluchistan, and the first series in Southern Egypt up the Nile. Under his direction extensive surveys were made in the Sudan, and much of our accurate knowledge of that vast region was due to him.

Colonel Talbot married, in 1911, Eva, daughter of the late Colonel John Joicey, M.P., of Newton Hall, Northumberland, and leaves a son, Milo John Reginald, born in 1912, who now becomes heir presumptive, and a daughter.
