

County News: Bridge "Garden Party", KGCT, 9840, 6 (13 July 1889), repeated 9841, 6 (16 July 1889)

In charming weather a garden party on Tuesday evening [9 July 1889] held at the picturesque residence of Mr. and Mrs. Weinholt, Bifons, near Canterbury. A fine marquee, supplied by Mr. Gaywood of Canterbury, had been erected upon the lawn, and in this the visitors first partook of light refreshment in the way of strawberries and whipped cream, grapes, cherries, melons, raspberries, &c., most of the fruit being provided by Mr. Hossack, the estate gardener. Whilst partaking of these delicacies & strolling round the grounds, the visitors were ^{ent} charmed with the enchanting strains of the Hungarian Band from London. Their peculiar instrumentation was a distinctly novel and enchanting feature of the proceedings. The composition of Strauss, Brahms, and others being well performed. Hungarian impromptu dances were also given by a native lady who had not hitherto performed in the province. Mrs. Weinholt was attired in a mouseline de laine costume of First Empire style, cream coloured with blue flowers, and among the visitors' dresses white and other light shades of summer material were most conspicuous. Tea was served in the magnificent dining room, the table being ~~the~~ elegantly adorned with numerous vases of rose blossoms constituting quite a ~~one~~ fit and taken with the choicest of confections under the skill (of) Mr. Craig's careful preparation. Patriotism: Juvenile Fancy Dress Ball KG + CP 9994 6 (3 Jan 1891)

Mr and Mrs Edward Wienholt gave a juvenile fancy dress ball at Balfour on New Year's Eve, the invitations being from 5 to 10, followed by a Bal Bourré from 10 o'clock. Notwithstanding the severity of the weather, the guests numbered over 200. The entrance was decorated in Oriental style. The portico was beautifully arranged with large foliage plants and palms, and lighted with fairy lamps. Throughout the house the decorations were of the choicest description. Dancing took place in the dining room. The Conservatory was brilliantly illuminated and heated, forming a pleasant retreat for the dances. Supper was served in the Billiard Room, which had been specially prepared and decorated for the occasion. It was a very pretty scene when all were assembled, and each in the evening a conjuring entertainment in the Saloon, by Dr. Nix, made a variety in the evening's ~~the~~ amusements. Sheppard's full band, all in uniform, supplied the music. Mrs Wienholt wore a Watteau dress, pale pink and green, of old French brocade; Miss Wienholt, as daughter of the Rajah, buttercup satin skirt covered with white silk Indian muslin, edged with gold, bolice of the same, with crimson satin zouave, edged with pearls, shawl waist band of gold braid studded with jewels, and edged with pearls, armlets of the same, Oriental sash with gold fringe, veil of white ^{silk} Indian muslin fastened with jewels; Miss Brenda and Miss Magda Wienholt, as White Dresden China, skirts of white quilted satin, with pointed bodice and panniers of the same, trimmed with white lace and roses; Master Wienholt, Australian Stockman; Master E. Wienholt, as Spanish Toreador, jacket, vest and breeches of crimson velvet lined with blue satin, with elaborate gold embroideries of golden brocade, large gold epaulettes, with handsome bullion fringe, blue silk sash; Master H. Wienholt,

 spirit until an early hour in the morning to the strains of Mr. Sheppard's
 band from Canterbury.
