MILL LANE AND BREWERY LANE BRIDGE

Temporary Prohibition of Driving

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 – Section 14 (2) As amended by The Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991

1. The Kent County Council gives notice that from 25 March 2010 for a period of not exceeding 21 days, no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in those specific lengths of Mill Lane and Brewery Lane, adjacent to Nail Bourne stream as and when the relevant signs and barriers are displayed on site.

These restrictions were introduced by Kent Highway Services because of local flooding on the road and the likelihood of danger to the public. The Notice will cease to have effect when the danger of flooding has passed and KHS consider it safe to reopen the road.

2. Nothing in paragraph 1 of this Notice shall apply to (a) any person or vehicle engaged in the execution of the said works, (b) anything done with the permission of or on the direction of a police constable in uniform, (c) residents and businesses requiring access to their properties.
3. The alternative route for through traffic is via Western Avenue and High Street.
