Evolution of Kentish Settlement

Jute 'Bourne People'. 21000 acres, Estate

4 Bournes - Little Beches Patroc & Beihors

+ Wickhambourne Ickham Bridge

Kingste Barham Stodmish & pts of Deuta & Wootton

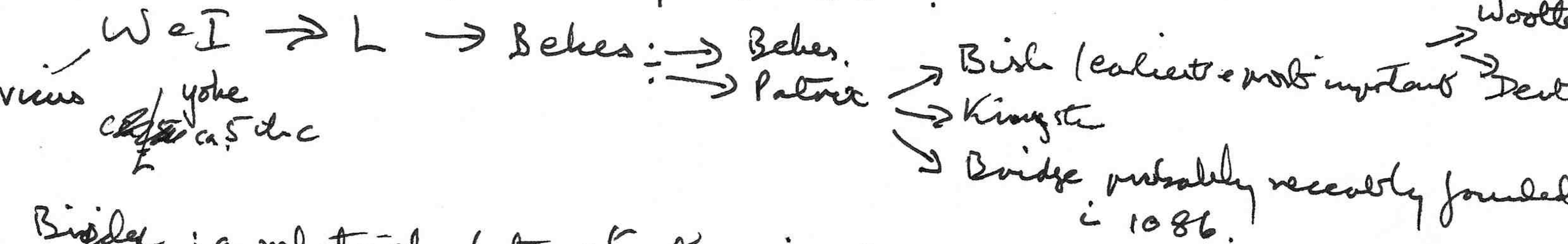
Settlement began at the mouth of the river

Earliest doc. is 696 - Littlebourne: but this implies Great Bourne

i.e. Wickhambourne & Ickham: on or close to Roman Rd

early type of place name, important Roman or Romano-British sites & together cover 5000 acres - 3x Littlebourne.

Hence settlement patterns up the river:



Bridge: a relatively late street migration

a possible small one-conquest trading centre for the Bourne People.

Eccentrically sited on edge of parish - sure sign of dependence.
