Braemes family.

Originels of Flemish stock settled in Sandwich beginning of Stuart period.

Jacob Jacob of Anstet. Set up as a merchant at Dover.

~~House~~ ^{to} ~~was~~ ^{the} occupiers area brought by Jacob on both sides of harbor wall.

Anstet was baptised in St Marys Ch. 3/10/1602.

He hoped Dover would become a free port. Built large warehouses.

Member of Parliament 4/1660 but remained at the house of Commons only a short time.

He was knighted by Charles II. Most of Braemes buildings were destroyed by fire 1808.

He was well connected with local Kent families being Oxenden, Bergrove, Diggles.

1st m. JOAN 2nd d of Walter Hartleete of Bekesbourne.

She died 27/7/1633 and is buried in St Marys Ch. Dover.

2nd m. Elisabeth 2d of Sir Dudley Digges of Chilles Castle.

She died 27/5/1643 and was buried in St Peter's Ch. Bridge and

there is a memorial to them both.

Built house of Bridge (or Blacklands) in the Abbey of St Augustine.

Another brought in 1636. hand made Dutch bricks.

His avenue of trees built for house to church. He had the right to appoint a vicar of his choice.

Cornelius Jansen of Paris.

Anstet had a son called Walter who travelled abroad with Tompkins

son of the Records of Gentry (with whom he had fallen out over a possible matter)

28/7/1646 left in ^{the ship} the Starallow for 2 months and visited Brussels.

Anstet's laymen Tukeague were British Troops but captured.

Sailed for Ostend 8/10/1646 & landed at Ypres 20/10/1646.

Both supported (father and son) the Royalist cause.

Dover was Runderhead (parliamentarian)

died 13/11/1681 Buried in Linc. Anstet & his 'lady'
