Sir,
 I am researching the history of seven aircrew members in preparation to write a book about their life and operational career, among them a Canterbury man, Flight Engineer 904074 Sgt Alfred M. Taylor, whose parents during World War II lived at Lynton House, Bridge.
 Sgt Taylor was one of three survivors from a

Halifax bomber which was shot down in Denmark by a German night fighter after a mission to Berlin on January 17-18 1943.
 He was taken prisoner of war by the Germans and after a few weeks in a military hospital in Denmark, spent the rest of the war in the prison camp Lamsdorf in Silesia.
 I would be most

grateful to hear from anybody who knows or has known Alfred Taylor or his family, and who can tell something about his life before and after the war.
