French film crew back in Patrixbourne

Patrixbourne became a remote Yorkshire village called Pocklington, when a French film crew returned to continue work they began in September.

The cameramen, sound recordists and production assistants had been forced to take the three-month break when leading actress Sabine Azema fell and broke her ankle while being filmed on Dover Cliffs.

Now fully recovered, Sabine has returned to the role of the passionate Marie-Laure, who with one of several boyfriends, comes to England to

claim a Yorkshire country cottage left to her in a relative's will.

Waterfall Cottage, the home of Mr and Mrs Malcolm Fleming, was spotted by director Michel Lang while he was visiting Patrixbourne last year and chosen for the film *On Est pas des Anges . . . Elles non plus* (Men are not angels . . . women neither).

"I have known and loved Kent for the last 25 years and immediately I saw the cottage I knew it would be the perfect setting for the film," said M Lang.
