

VICAR OF BRIDGE BEREAVED

Death Of Mrs. K. J. Knight

Taken ill soon after her return from a holiday three weeks ago, Mrs. Katharine Jane Knight, 72, wife of the Rev. Hubert Knight, Vicar of Patricxbourne and Bridge, died on Thursday night last week.

Mrs. Knight came to Patricxbourne Vicarage, when her husband was appointed Vicar of the combined parishes of Patricxbourne and Bridge in 1897. She became closely associated with the work of the parishes, and her kindly thought for the spiritual and social welfare of the parishioners was greatly appreciated. Especially will the loss be felt by the local branches of the Mothers' Union and Women's Institute, of which she was for many years President.

THE FUNERAL

On Tuesday a Holy Communion Service at St. Mary's was conducted by Canon W. F. Burnside, assisted by the Rev. C. T. Mourilyan. At the funeral which followed the Archdeacon of Canterbury (Canon E. H. Hardcastle), assisted by Canon R. U. Potts, conducted the service. The coffin was interred in a vault built near the Bifrons Entrance Gate, in the presence of a large and representative gathering of mourners.

Loss to Bridge & Patricxbourne

Bridge and Patricxbourne villagers, and especially those ladies who are connected with the work of the Mothers' Union and Women's Institute, sustained a great loss in the death, on Thursday, of Mrs. Katharine Jane Knight, wife of the Rev. Hubert Knight, Vicar of Bridge and Patricxbourne. Mrs. Knight, who was 72 years of age, came to Patricxbourne in 1897, in which year her husband became Vicar and throughout those years she closely identified herself with the work of the parish, where she was President of both the Women's Institute and the Mothers' Union, and took a great interest in the people of the Bridge Institution. She closely identified herself with every good cause in the parishes.

At the funeral, which took place at Patricxbourne Church on Tuesday afternoon, many came to pay their last respects and the beautiful little church was filled to overflowing. The Archdeacon of Canterbury (Canon E. H. Hardcastle), assisted by Canon R. U. Potts, of Kingston, conducted the service. Among the hymns sung were, "Jesu, Lover of My Soul" and "Abide with Me." Psalm xxiii was also sung and the Nunc Dimittis chanted.
