

YOUNG AIRMAN'S FUNERAL.—The funeral of Air-craftsman Frederick J. Jarrett, aged 19, whose death from pneumonia occurred at the R.A.F. Hospital at Halton only 15 days after he joined the Service, took place at Bridge church on Wednesday. The service was conducted by the Vicar of Bekesbourne, the Rev. A. A. E. Lamplough. A party of the R.A.F. from Hawkinge Aerodrome under Flying Officer P. Heath provided a firing party and a trumpeter. The coffin was carried on a motor tender and trailer. The chief mourners were Mr. and Mrs. F. J. Jarrett, father and mother; Mr. and Mrs. R. Jarrett, brother and sister-in-law; Dorothy Jarrett, sister; Mrs. Cowell, grandmother; Miss D. Jarrett, whose death occurred at Princess Mary's Royal R.A.F. Hospital, Hulton, Wendover, on January 29, took place at Bridge Church on Wednesday afternoon, amid many manifestations of sorrow. The deceased, whose age was 19 years, joined the R.A.F. only 15 days previously, the cause of death being double pneumonia. The service was conducted by the Rev. A. A. F. Lamplugh, Vicar of Bekesbourne. A party of Royal Air Force men, under Flying Officer P. Heath, from Hawkinge Aerodrome, attended with motor tender and trailer, firing party and trumpeter.
