Festival: The Millennium festival committee in conjunction with the fete organisers, have issued a special programme of events for the first major celebration of the year on June 24.

These consist of a duck race, classic car display, guided history tours, jazz band, Morris dancers, Sealed Knot Battles, performance by Bridge's own Canzonet Ensemble, children's disco (4-6.30pm), Snowdown Male Voice Choir (7.15), pig roast and fireworks at about 10.30pm.

The second big event will take place on September 8 to 10 with a flower festival in St Peter's Church, Bridge, a concert by The Canterbury Clerkes on the Friday evening, followed by a Communion service conducted by the Archdeacon of Canterbury, the Ven John Pritchard, on the Sunday morning.

A three-day exhibition will also be presented by the Bridge and District History Society in the village hall, with further guided tours of the village. There will also be music and barbecues around the pubs in the village.
