the Justices of Oyer and Terminer and William Gifford Esq. Recorder of the said County
named in the first Countroll to wit that a petition was granted having been first
shown by common assent to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament

of my Elizabeth Williams of the parish of St. Dunstons in the County of Middlesex
made this twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and forty four in manner and form following that
is to say first I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator
and my body I commit to the earth to be decently interred in the
Churchyard of St. Dunstons in London in the said County as near the remains
of my late father and mother as conveniently may be and as to my worldly
estate whatsoever it shall please God to give and dispose thereof as
followeth that is to say unto my sister Anne Laporte the wife of Oliver
Laporte of Dover in the said County if living at the time of my decease the
sum of one hundred pounds of good and lawful money of Great Britain if not
living at my decease my will is that the said one hundred pounds be paid
unto the said Anne Laporte and estate alike unto my sister Ann Page wife of
the late Charles Page of London Esquire in the said County the sum of one
hundred and fifty pounds of like money unto my nephews James Pitt
John Leonard and William Leonard sons of my late sister Mary Corbett
the several sums of fifty pounds each of like money unto William Pitt
and Elizabeth Wood the children of my sister Sarah Wood of Longham in
the said County the several sums of one hundred pounds each of like money unto
John Pitt and Anne Pitt the children of my sister William Pitt the wife of
John Pitt of London in the said County the several sums of one hundred
pounds each of like money unto Anne and Catherine daughters of my brother
William Pitt of London in the said County the sum of ten pounds each of
like money all of which legacies I will and direct shall be paid to the respective
legatees within six months next after my decease and I will and direct that
all my executors and every one of them may be hired amongst such a
administration as shall be living at my decease and as to all and every one of the
residues and remainments of my goods and chattels for maner and to all effect
my personal estate and effects not hereuntofore given and disposed of
after and subject to the payment of all my just debts funeral expenses legacies
