I John Waylett of now Grob Deputee in the County of West Dorset
County Dorset being sick and weak in body but of sound mind memory &
understanding do make & publish this my last will & testament in
manners following viz after payment of my just debts & funeral expences
and the charges of proving & carrying into effect said my will and
subject thereto do bequeath unto my brother William Waylett &
unto each of my sisters Mary & Hannah Ann Waylett the sum of five
pounds apiece for mourning to be paid them within three months or
next after my decease & to all the rest & residue & remainder of my estate
& effects whatsoever & wheresoever & of what nature kind or quality soever
the same shall or may consist at the time of my decease either
in possession remainder or reversionary & whosoever shall be
seised thereof & parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto my dear wife
Mary Sophia Waylett to and the same unto my dear wife Mary
Sophia Waylett her heirs executors administrators & assigns do & for her & their
own use & benefit absolutely for ever & so do hereby nominate constitute
& appoint my said wife Mary Sophia Waylett sole executrix of this
my will and desire to be buried according to her direction in a decent
& suitable but not expensive manner and do hereby revoke all former
wills & testaments by me at any time heretofore made so far as they
relate to be & contain my whole last will & testament in witness
whereof I have declared set my hand and seal the first day of
September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
thirteen John Waylett & signed sealed published & declared by the said
testator as aforesaid last will & testament in the presence of five who
in due presence at his request & in the presence of each other have
subscribed our names as witnesses & thereto - for Matthew Scott - for
George Wood - John Robt. White - each to 8/9/13

Proved at Dordrecht 24th April 1813 before the worshipful Samuel Ploffer
person Doctor of Law & Juris by the oath of Mary Sophia Waylett
widow the sole executrix to whom admission was granted being

On which day appeared personally Mary Subbard of Middle Street
and in the County of Kent Thomas Richards of Bouletts and Ann Richards
his wife also of Bouletts in the said County of Kent by virtue of
their Corporal oaths deposed as follows and first they saw Mary Subbard
for several years that she had been well acquainted with Elizabeth
Wickley formerly servant to Lady Hoares of Dover in the County of
Kent and of Bouletts in the same County but late of Dover in
the same County widow who deposed that she on the fourth day
of January last past that she deposed shortly after her death in a
searching amongst the deceased papers and amongst & amongst found
in a box in the house and took the paper writings accounts amongst
purposing to be the last will and Testament of the said deceased
in two Testametary Articles were marked A & B and the deponent
having carefully read and perused the same said that the said paper
writings are now in all respects in the same plight condition as when so
found by her as aforesaid and except the insertion thereof as aforesaid
the words & figures are 12 January 1813 and written on the said
Testametary Articles marked A and B are deponent the said Thomas
Richards and Ann Richards for Richards made oath that they also
saw and were well acquainted with the said deceased called with the
manners and character of handwriting subscription bearing frequently
seen to write also initials the names & figures were carefully
inspected the said Testametary Articles marked A & B purposing
to be & contain the last will & Testament of the said deceased as
aforesaid the said Testametary Article marked A beginning thus
1812 Eliz Wickley at her death leaves & during this & Mrs Mary
know what there is in the House & the subscription with the said
words Eliz Wickley own hand writing & the signature of Thomas
Richards John Dawkins Esq Bouletts & the said Testametary Article marked
B beginning thus 1812 Eliz Wickley at her death leaves to Mary Subbard
and my two Tea Spoons and said subscription with the said subscription
Eliz Wickley deposes her own handwriting with the said subscription for
Mrs Mary Subbard & the deponent Richards & Ann Richards &
Ann Richards do say that they saw & in their own eyes believe
the whole body of the said paper writings which are the
Testametary articles beginning with the subscription as
aforesaid to be all of the proper handwriting & subscription of the said
said Elizabeth Wickley when tested - Mary Subbard - Tho
Richards - Ann Richards - John Dawkins the said Mary Subbard
Thomas Richards & Ann Richards were duly sworn to the truth of
the aff by virtue of the Oath Circumstances aforesaid before me
