This Will was proved at London the
fourth day of March in the Year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and two before the
Right Honourable Sir William Wynne Knight
also Doctor of Laws, Master of the Bench
of the Burroughs Court of Southwark lawfully
sworn and by the Oath of Joseph Currier the
brother of the Deceased and John Brown Chamberlain
the Executor named in the said Will to whom
administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels
and Credits of the said Deceased was granted having
been first sworn by Commission duly to administer.

In the Name of God Amen
The sixteenth day of February one thousand eight
hundred and one I John Currier of Saint Giles
Middlesex being weak of Body out of hope
and sickness and desiring thanks be given to God
therefor calling to mind the mortality of my
Body knowing that it is appointed unto all
men once to die do make this my last will and
Testament that is to say Principally and first of
all I give and bequeath my soul into the
hands of Almighty God who gave it and my
Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in
some Christian Buriall in Woodstock
Church Yard in the County of Surrey where my
dear Husband our said John Dalbot is interred
nothing doubting but at the general
resurrection we shall receive the same Body
again by the Almighty Power of God and as
touching my worldly Estate wherewith I little
expect God to bless me I give devise and dispose
of in the following manner first of all I will
that all my just Debts if any together with all
my funeral Expenses be paid for I give
and bequeath unto my two Daughters Sarah Edmund
and Ann Whitney our sisters the former
namely Sarah Edmund wife of Thomas Edmund
Cutler of Kingston Surrey and the latter Ann
Whitney Spinster now at our abode in
London both have surety of all my Goods Chattels

like Grant to Sarah Annand, wife of Thomas
Annand, the other Executor named in the said
will when she shall apply for the same

John Thompson This is the last Will

and Testament of John Thompson and Elanor
Thompson of the Parish of Bridge in the
County of South Devon and principally we recommend
our souls to God and our bodies to the earth to
be decently buried at the discretion of our Executors
hereinafter named and as for all such worldly
Estates as it has pleased Almighty God to bestow
upon us we dispose of it as followeth first of all we
leave at the death of the first five pounds to the
wardens and at both our deaths five pounds more
as aforesaid Subsumis we give and bequeath all
and singular our Goods and Chattels personal
State whatsoever after payment of all our debts
both funeral Expenses incident Charges paid
first our Executors to sell our Goods and to
give the five pounds a piece to our two Daughters Sarah
Thompson and Annand Bridge the remainder of our
State to be divided equal between the six hereafter
named Sarah Thompson Mary Bridge the above
eldest half sister and Mother to Elanor Thompson
eldest daughter widow of the late John March
attorney of Elanor Thompson surviving a part
also to see the same performed we have named
as Executors Sarah Thompson and Elizabeth
Harris and if any our Executors to call in any
attorney to assist and we do disallow all other
former wills, in which we have set our
hand and seal this 4th day of Dec: 1661 - In presence
of - Elanor Thompson - John Cooper - James Knott Sarah
Annand - John Cooper - James Knott Sarah Annand

On the fourth day of March in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
two Administration with the will annexed of all
and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of
John Thompson late of the Parish of Bridge
in the County of South Devon was granted to
Elanor Thompson widow the eldest of the said
deceased she having been first sworn by Commission
only to administer the Executor during the
life of the said Elanor Thompson being named
therein

Proved at London the
17th day of June 1662

of Richard Harris) the
Surviving of whom
I am was first sworn
