THEN SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS,
AND HE SUCCESSIVELY REPRESENTED HIS SOVEREIGN, AS MINISTER
AT THE COURTS OF HESSE CASSEL, STUTTGARD, MUNICH, AND BERLIN,
UNTIL 1830, WHEN HE WAS OBLIGED TO RESIGN HIS POST,
ON ACCOUNT OF ILL HEALTH.
THIS TABLET WAS ERECTED




