VILLAGE HALL INSURANCE PREMIUM 1997

We have today received a demand from Cornhill Insurance for the premium payable by 20 March in the sum of £477.82, a copy of which is enclosed.

They advise us that the buildings sum insured has risen in line with the "current index" from £194,227.00 to £201,996.00, and the contents from £7,500.00 to £7,800.00. Also that the premium for the public liability section has been increased by £5.00 from £65.00 to £70.00 to cover the higher level of both claims against village hall committees and awards made to claimants.

At our recent annual general meeting, Mervyn Gulvin, PC representative, confirms that in line with its policy laid down last year, the PC would continue to reimburse us for the premium we pay out for its property.

We therefore look forward to receiving your remittance in the sun of £477.82 in time to pay out the premium.

VILLAGE HALL

I have been asked by the Parish Council to write to you about the lighting in the village hall. The request is that low-level wall lighting be installed as the florescent tubes are rather severe.

I have also been asked a question concerning wheel-chair access to the village hall. I understand that a parishioner has difficulty gaining access to the hall when she visits the Fish Scheme events. Could you let me know if the village hall has wheel-chair access and if so which is the designated entrance.

Finally, as a result of a recent test case, it is no longer possible for the Parish Council to purchase items on behalf of the Management Committee for use in the village hall and reclaim the VAT. I am still willing to purchase items through KCC but will hand over the invoices to Mervyn for direct payment. However, you may prefer to set up your own delivery point number with KCC.

Disable access footpath - rear Village Hall

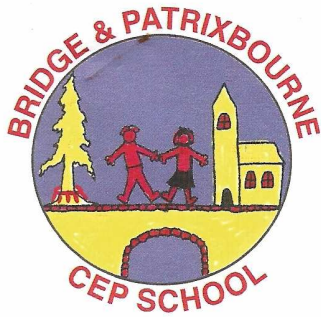
The work to the rear footpath has been completed by the contractor, Mr. C. Penfold, in accordance with the estimate with the layout slightly raised on heights due to the proximity of the SEEBoard main cable.

I enclose the invoice made out to the Parish Council for payment and would recommend settlement. The monies have been received by way of capital grant from Canterbury City Council and are held in our accounts - the VAT is reclaimable (the Parish Council being freeholder of the hall and land)

The low lighting remains to be completed at a cost of £610.00 which will come from the Village Hall budget.
