3 STUDENTS ON ASSAULT CHARGE

Three students and another man who appeared on receipt at Marlborough Street yesterday following incidents at London University Senate House, Malet Street, Bloomsbury, on Oct. 21, were charged with riotous assembly and assault on Dr Leslie Pownall, Clerk to the Senate.

The four, Gordon Gilroy, 28, American student, of Broomfield Place, South Kensington; Kenneth Hoch, 27, American student, of West End Lane, Haverstock Hill; Peter Brayshaw, 22, unemployed, of Tollington Road, Finsbury Park; and James Thomas Dalglish, 19, student, of Middle Lane, Hornsey, were committed for trial at the Old Bailey.

They were also committed on a charge of damaging the glass doors at the Senate House. The four were granted bail on condition that they do not attend any demonstrations pending trial.
