FREEHOLD NEAR CANTERBURY.

We were most fortunate to be given the opportunity of excavation at Bridge Place this summer. Our object was to ascertain the layout of the original foundations of a house built c.1640, three-quarters of which was pulled down at the end of the seventeenth century: the work was of great interest to architectural experts, as few similar houses of the period survive unaltered to the present day. On our Sunday afternoon expeditions we managed to excavate the well at the rear of the house, to clarify the layout of the former front of the house, and to examine foundations at both front and rear. Our warmest thanks are due to Mr. and Mrs. Pinhorn for all their help and interest.

Historic Interest

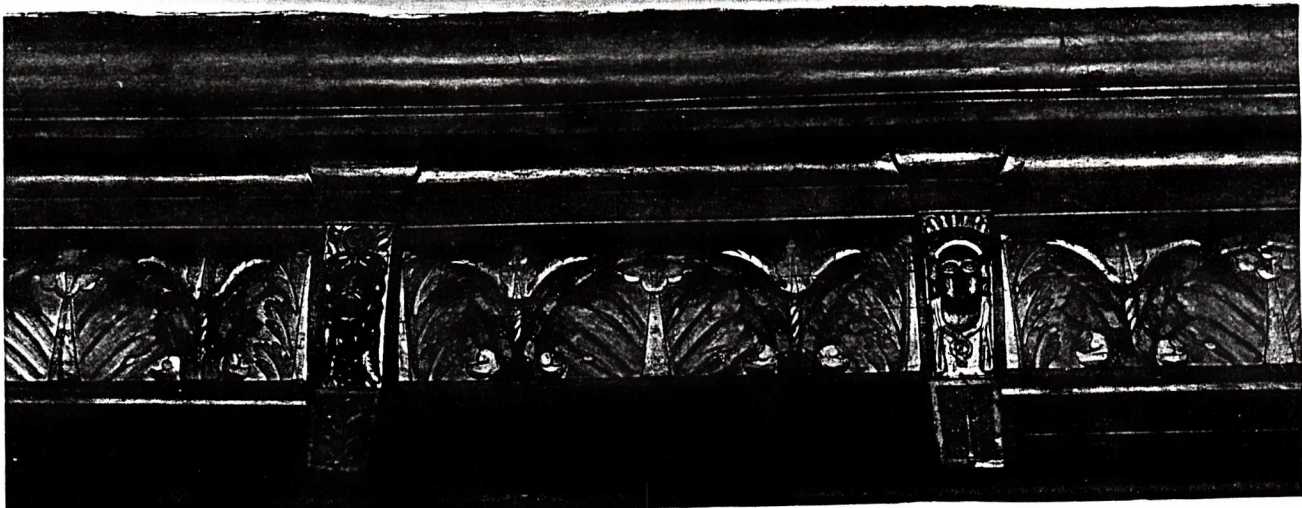
HAVING disposed of Morton House, Hatfield, Herts, to Lord Salisbury, Mr. Malcolm Pinhorn, who is associated with Phillimore & Co., the Farnham genealogical publishers, has contracted to buy Bridge Place, near Canterbury, from the Hon. Mrs. Neame. Bridge Place, built late in the 17th century, is scheduled as a building of historic and architectural interest.

It is being sold with an entrance lodge and six acres of ground through which runs the Nail Bourne. The house is the surviving portion of the substantial property built by Sir Arnold Braems, a Dover merchant. Later it formed part of the Bifrons estate of the Conyng-hams. In negotiations Mrs. Neame's agent was F. R. W. Berry, of Canterbury.
