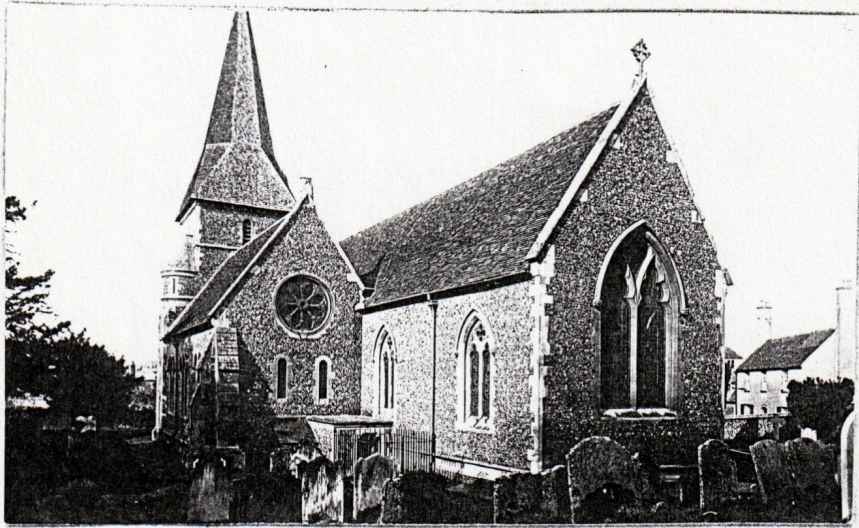

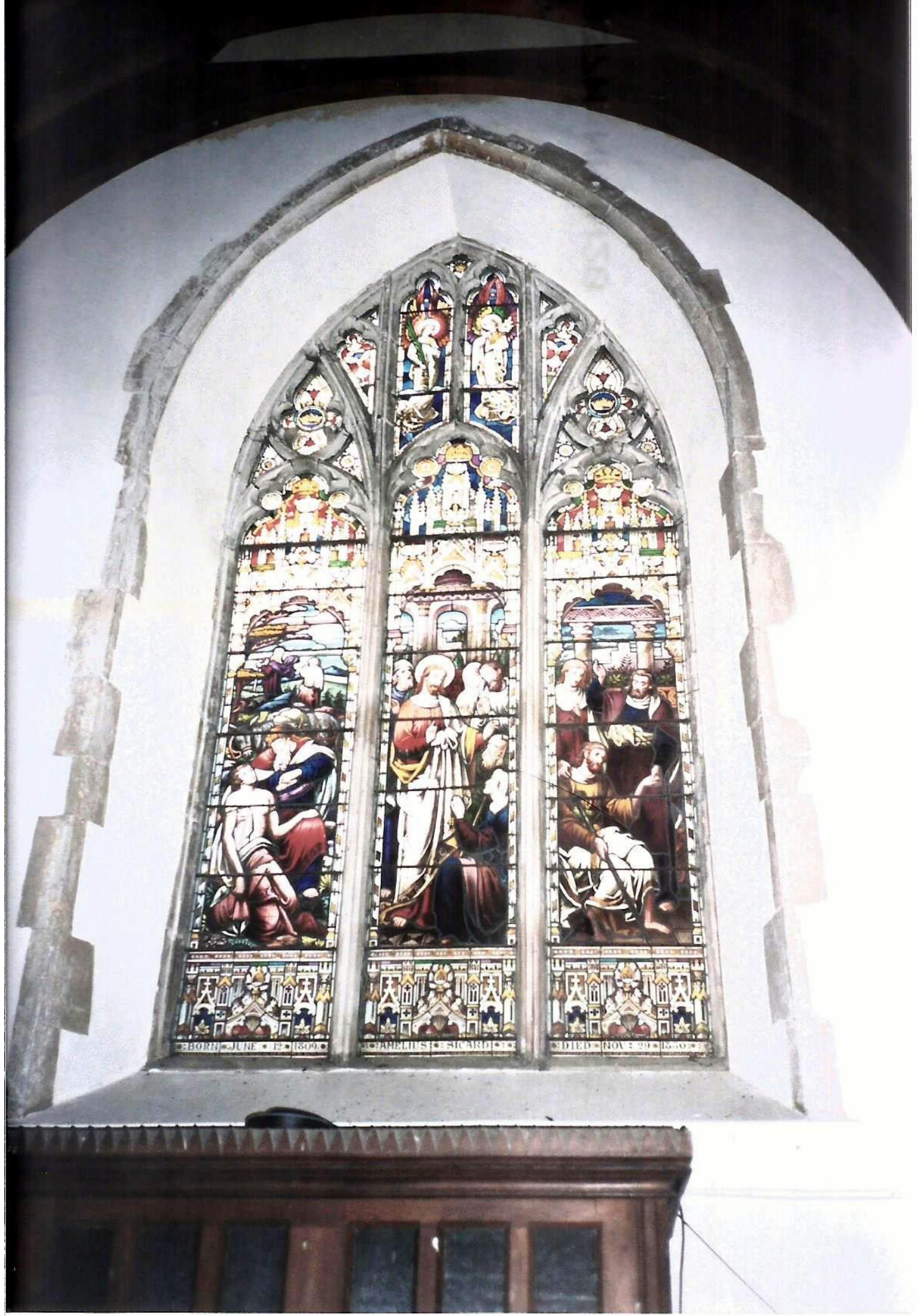

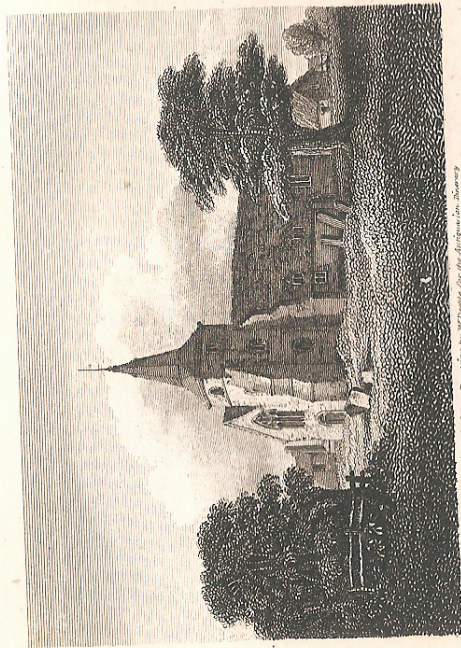

AGED 74 YEARS.

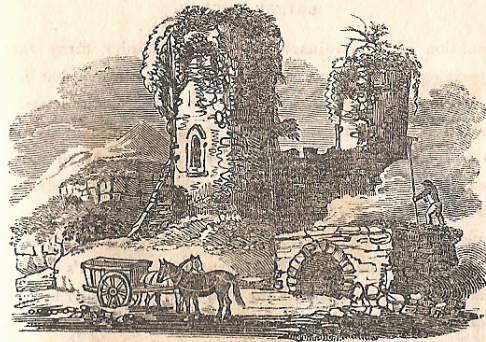

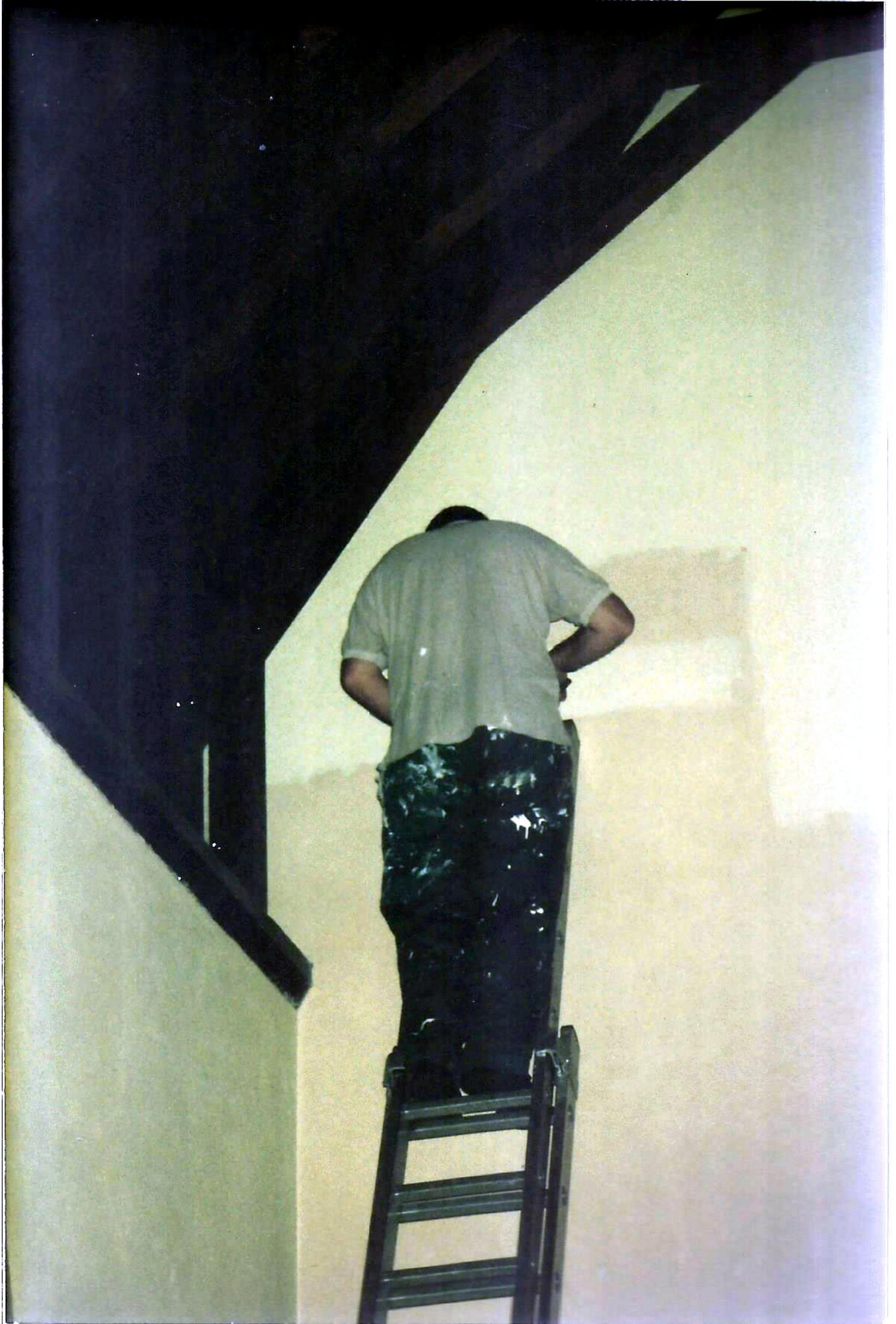

BRIDGE CHURCH, KENT.

THE small village of Bridge is situated on the road leading from London to Dover, and crossed by the lesser Stour river, over which a stone bridge was built here some years ago, by the contributions of the neighbouring gentry. In the time of Charles the First, the manor of Bridge was purchased by sir Arnold Breams, knight, whose ancestors were opulent merchants at Dover, but originally from Flanders, and one of whom erected the mansion formerly used as the custom-house of that port. The rage of building seems to have been inherited by sir Arnold, who pulled down the ancient court lodge at Bridge, and "upon the foundation of that ancient fabric," says Philipott, "erected that magnificent pile, which obliges the eyes of the passenger both to admiration and delight; and which, like a Phoenix, seems to have arose more glorious out of its ruins." The ancient edifice, which sir Arnold caused to be taken down, was a fine family

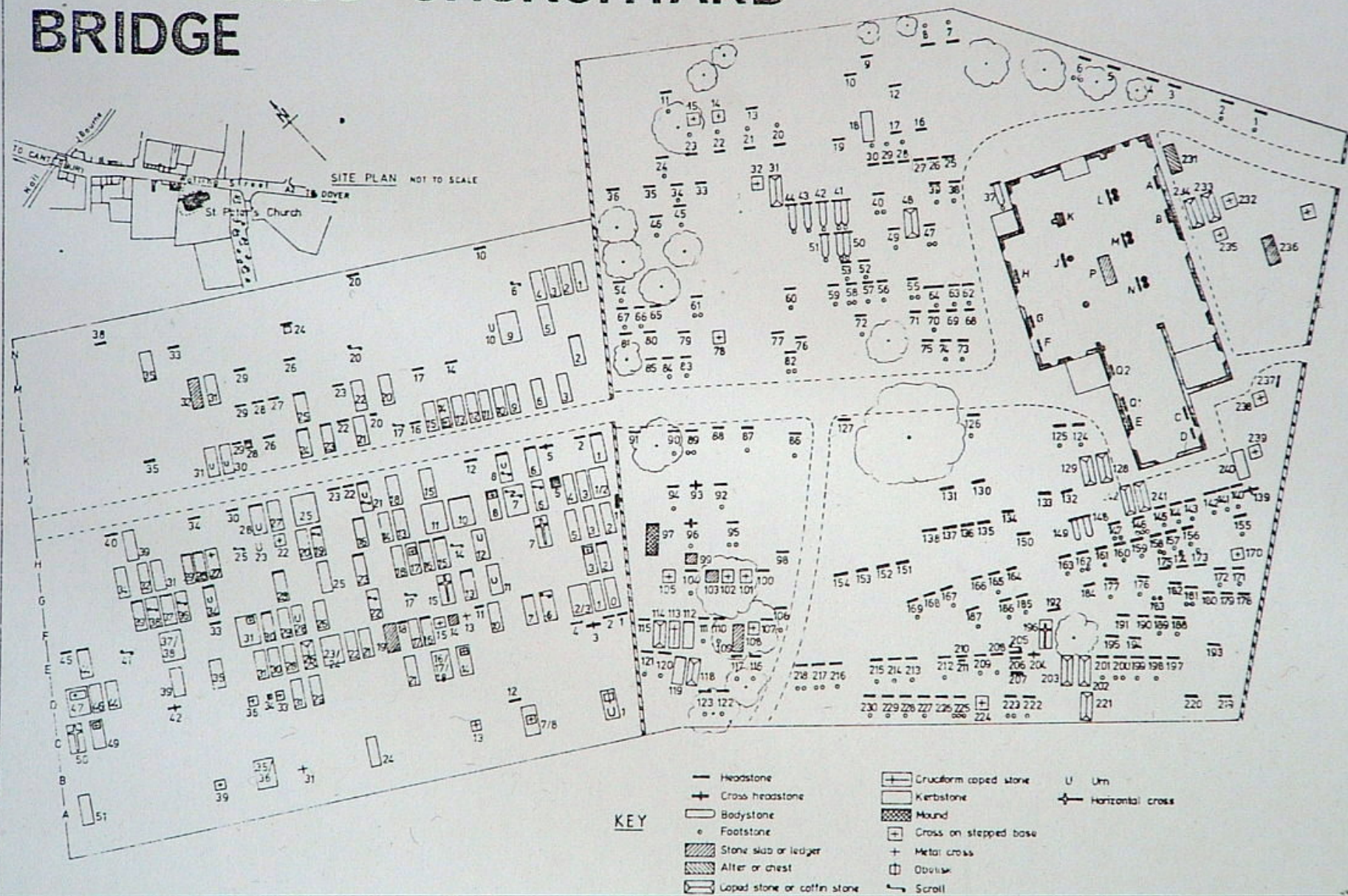
