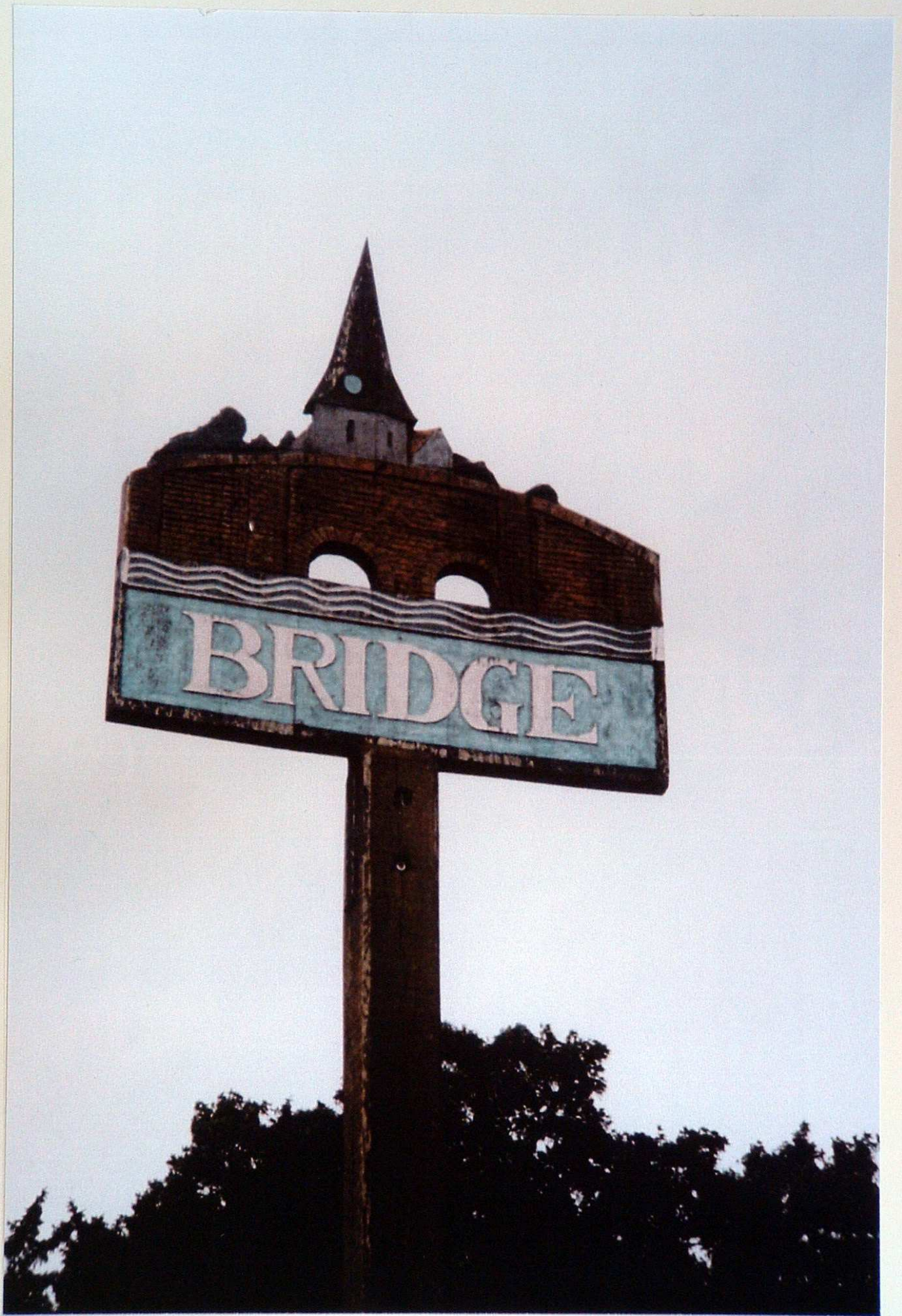












Naming names

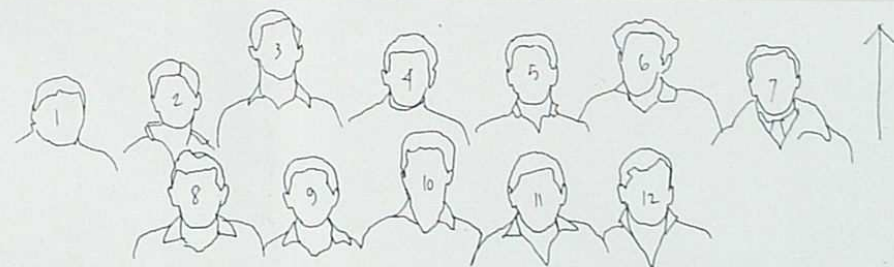
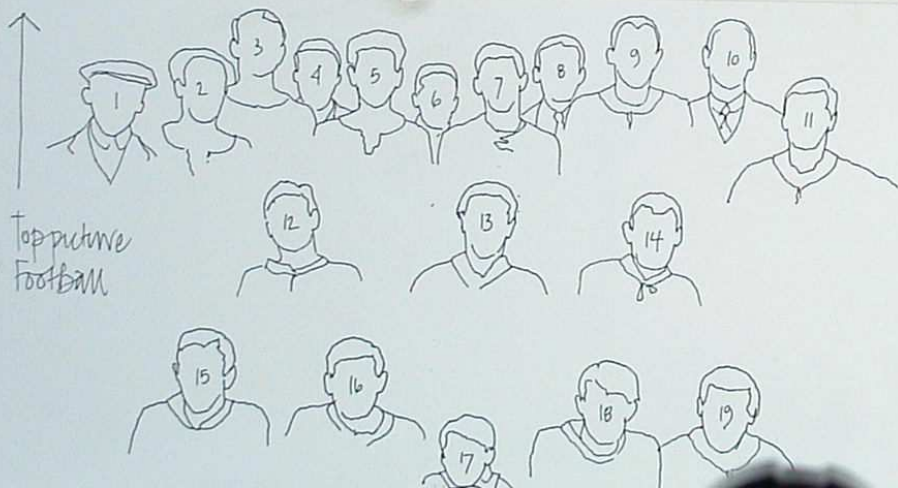
A READER who tells me that he attended Bridge School "in the days of Skipper Andrews and Anna Hopkins" can name almost all the members of the 1922 village football team included in last week's photograph.

He has checked with Mr. Harry Winton, who sent me the photograph and who played football and cricket at Bridge 50 years ago, and he agrees the names but is also unable to fill the gaps.

Another former Bridge resident recognised "Jimmy" Fenn, who died recently, and also remembers his brother, Jack, who was killed by the maroon which gave fire warnings.

This happened, he says, "in the year the king died." As he must mean King Edward VII, that was in 1910.

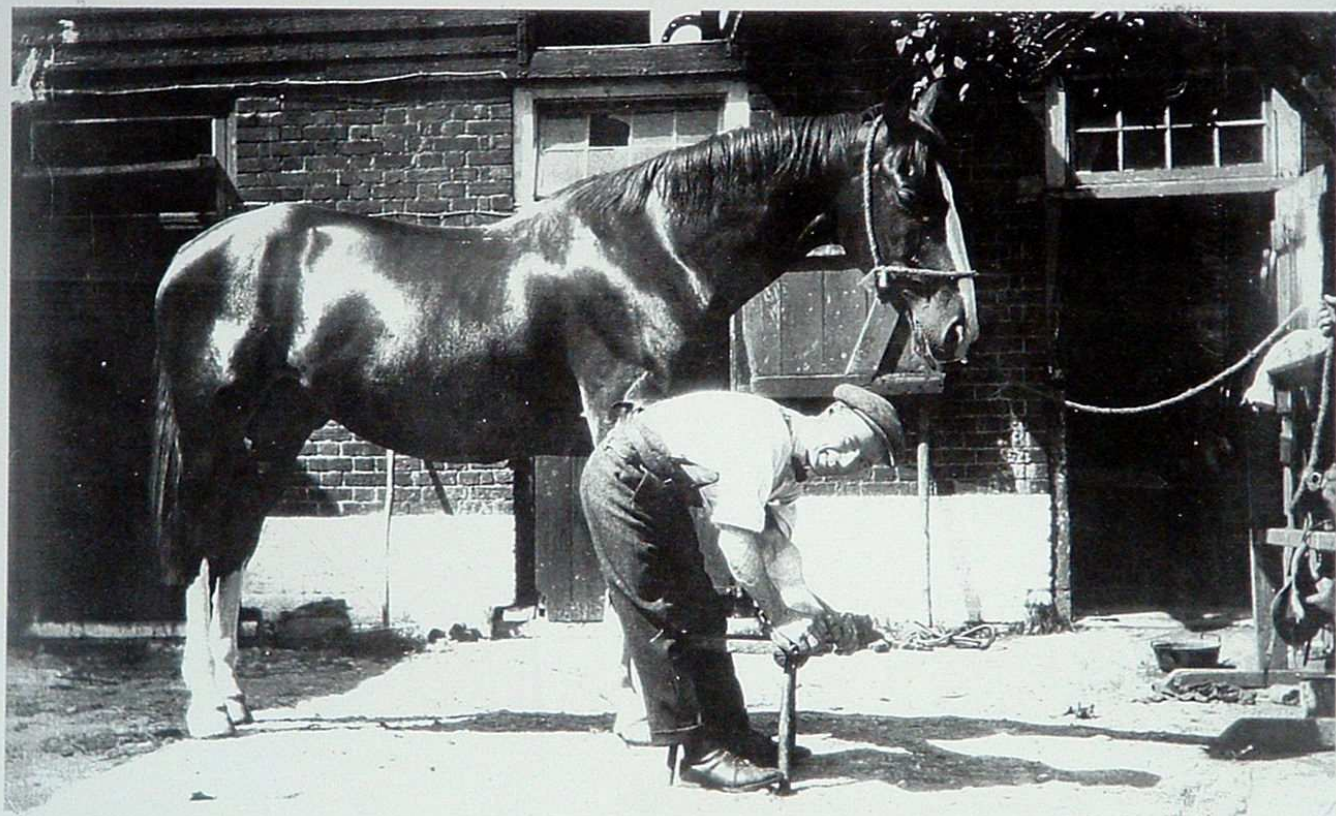
