

MONEY FOR NOTHING - FOR YOUR CHURCH

A NEW YEAR RESOLUTION on the part of you benevolent business men, to contribute to the cost of running your parish church, by means of a 7-year Covenant - would lift a great burden of work and anxiety from the shoulders of your Vicar, Church-wardens, and P.C.C.

ST. PETER'S BEKESBOURNE

I appeal to all who love this fine and ancient little church to help forward our plans for its preservation and improvement.

The decision to replace obsolete and inefficent gas lighting and heating by the latest, most efficient and economical electrical system is being executed as soon as possible - this spring - and not A MOMENT TOO SOON. Our organ, recently reconditioned at the cost of over £400 has already suffered severe deterioration through the gas fumes - and the beautiful alabaster memorial in the Bell Tower is rapidly disintegrating, due also to the chemical reaction of the fumes.

From the convenience and labour saving point of view, the electrical system will be a great boon (e.g. Mr. C. had to walk to church at 6 a.m. on Christmas Day to light the heaters so that the church would be warm for the 8 a.m. service!).

A further improvement is being contemplated, namely the removal of the Oak Screen from across the Chancel (where it separates Choir and Vicar from the Congregation) to a new position across the West end of the Church to form Vestries for the Choir and Bell-ringers.

It will save a great deal of time and money to carry out all these improvements at the same time and I hope to have the full support of the parish. We already have the necessary funds for most of the work - but more is needed. May I now have your donations, please - as generous as your means permit?

AFTERTHOUGHTS on the PARISH RETREAT

Until I spent a weekend at St. Gabriels I had imagined that a 'Retreat' would be a very solemn time and more suited to high-minded intellectuals. I was agreeably surprised to discover that this is not so.

On the Friday evening we were welcomed by the Conductor, Father Lamb, the Warden and staff. After being shown to our rooms there was time before supper to have a look round the house and choose suitable books from the well-stocked library. Having had supper we assembled in the beautiful Chapel where Father Lamb spoke to us about the programme for the weekend. There were to be addresses on Prayer, the Offices of Holy Communion, Matins and Compline, times of Intercession, private prayer and ample time for walking. After saying Compline we were plunged into silence until lunch time on Sunday.

One imagines that being in silence would create loneliness, but in fact it had the opposite effect. I found that I was able to think far more easily about my spiritual life in these conditions and any doubts in my mind seemed to be answered in the addresses. If one felt the need for advice or confession, the Conductor was available at all times.

The one thought that sticks in my mind, taken from the

addresses, is that in prayer it is not what God does for you that counts, it is what He does with you.

As well as being spiritually stimulating the Retreat was also a period of re-creation and perhaps the fact that I am looking forward to the next one will make you want to come along.

Little Stour Records - V.J.Torr CHURCH DEDICATIONS (Contd.)

Perhaps the foremost authority which decides doubtful dedication is found in the last wills of parishioners of a particular place, for in medieval times they would often insert in their testaments the name of the patron saint of their parish church. This brings us to your own three parishes.

PATRIXBOURN E

This ancient church, called St. Mary's, is an example of the dedication by tradition only, for apparently no early document positively states the fact.

BRIDGE

When we come to this church, (formerly a chapel of Patrix-bourne), we are on firmer ground. Today it is known as St. Peter's, and this is confirmed as valid by a parishioner's will calling it so, in the year 1474.

BEKESBOURNE

Still known likewise as St. Peter's, we find it confirmed by a similar will of 1507 - the same date as that on one of the brasses in the neighbouring church of Goodnestone (pronounced "Gunston").

It is always of great interest to find very rare dedications. Examples in Kent are St. Vincent (Littlebourne), St. Helen (Cliffe-at-Hoo) and St. Oswald (Paddlesworth, near Hythe). These are all unique in Kent, whereas two only of its old churches are named after SS. Cosmus and Damian, two early Christian physicians - at Blean and Challock.



My dear People,

With so many houses being built and new families coming into our Parishes, it is most important to look out for the newcomers and make them welcome. Please call upon them yourselves, give them a church magazine, and let me know that they have moved in. I want to keep up-to-date with arrivals, and I need your help.





My dear People,

I must apologise if I seem to be neglecting you all, but I have had a bad back since 1st February and have been laid flat with a "slipped disc" since 17th February. Not knowing how long it will be before I am fit for duty, it is a little hard to make definite plans for Lent. However, this I can say:

All Sunday Services will take place as usual and I hope you will make a special point of attending, so that if I am not there a visiting preacher or Celebrant will have the encouragement of a good congregation.

Lent Services - Starting on Ash Wednesday (7th March), there will be a Wednesday evening service in Bridge Church at 7.30 p.m. each week, taken by Mr. Cartman or myself.

Lent Preaching - The Rev. C. G. Stapley has kindly consented to give us at Evensong at Bridge a series of addresses entitled "Meditations on the Psalms".

Holy Week - Details will be published next month, but the Three Hours Service on Good Friday will be taken by Father Renald Leeks of St. Peter's, Whitstable, and the Preacher on Easter Sunday evening will be the Rt. Rev. the Lord Bishop of Dover.

Diocesan Week of Christian Witness - All church people are invited to wear in their lapel a miniature silver cross as an act of Christian witness during Holy Week. These little crosses will cost 6d. each and will be obtainable in church during Lent.

You may remember that this idea was first introduced for the benefit of overseas Christians visiting this country during the Festival of Britain year, and many sincere Christians have been wearing their cross ever since.

I hope that there will be a lively demand for these crosses.

Eucharist - one of the loveliest names given to the Holy Communion - is the Greek word for "thanksgiving", and during Lant I hope to adopt as the general there of my preaching the importance of living one's whole life in the spirit of the Eucharist. Our weekly presence at the Altar should be our renewal of our intention to live the coming week in that spirit.

I hope that all Communicant members of the Church, especially those recently Confirmed, will during Lent try to form the habit of regular weekly attendance at the Altar.

Finally, may I say how greatly Communicants could assist the Celebrant if when receiving Communion they would (a) hold their hands high (on a level with the chin) to receive the Wafer, and (b) guide the Chalice to their lips and tilt it until they receive a sip of Wine.

Ladies are again reminded that lipstick tends to transfer itself to the Chalice, which is very distasteful to other recipients.

Lent Book - I strongly recommend for your Lent devotional reading a little book entitled "A LIVELY SACRIFICE" by Harold Sly - published by Mowbrays and available at the S.P.C.K. Bookshop, price 4/- This reading could deeply increase your devotion in preparation for your Easter Communion.





It is the report on the Diocese of Canterbury in 1511, compiled by personal visit of Archbishop Warham and his assistants. The whole, partly in Latin and partly in English, gives a clear picture of the diocese when King Henry VIII was still a youthful monarch, only six years before the Continental Reformation was set off by the actions, in Germany, of Martin Luther.

I cannot go into detail as to the general picture of Kent in 1511, but a few points demonstrate that Canterbury Diocese was then, by and large, in a sickly condition. We find that three outstanding evils were (a) the loose financial morality of both clergy and laity alike, (b) the low standard of church repair, all over the diocese, sometimes amounting to virtual or actual ruin; and (c) the unsatisfactory condition of most of the monasteries.

BEKESBOURNE: Its affairs, like those of Patrixbourne and Bridge were handled by Warham, for Bridge Deanery (then undivided) in Wye Church, mear Ashford, on 25th Sept. 1511. This is what we read about Bekesbourne parishioners: -William Lienes was not seen in his parish church more than twice in every three months. He was pulled up with a jerk when he got an order to attend church not only every Sunday but on Saints' Days also - failing which, he would be excommunicated. He is also reported to have been a "sower of discords" and a "common slanderer of his neighbours" a state of things which must also cease. 



VICAR'S LETTER

My dear People,

WHICH WAY? Must Communism conquer the freedom-loving democratic way of life? World statesmen seem to think it inevitable, unless it is held at bay by a strong alliance of anti-Communist nations, backed by military power, with Nuclear weapons as the great deterrent! But is this so?

His Grace, the Archbishop of Canterbury had this to say at the last Diocesan Conference: -

"First, I think we must agree that war can no longer be an instrument of justice in the world....It is impossible to defeat Communism merely by military means. We cannot defend liberty in the world merely by building a rampart around it. We defeat Communism by spreading a better way of life and helping to relieve economic distress in those countries which are vulnerable to Communism. Communism is a false belief, and it will be conquered only by the spread of a right belief, lived out in communities otherwise exposed to Communist pressure. Military defence alone cannot achieve these ends."

It would seem that the Christian answer to the invasion of Communism is the spread of Christianity, by an active demonstration of Christianity as a better way of life, and we in Britain can do our part by seeking the re-conversion of our own people - starting with OURSELVES and OUR FAMILIES. We must face the fact that on the whole our Christian religion is no longer the dynamic sincere faith of the early Church - but a very shallow, 'taken for granted' heritage from our forefathers.

CHRISTIAN FAMILY YEAR is a Church campaign - a mission to the Nation - to re-think, re-learn and re-practise true Christianity in personal, family, parochial and national life. This needs <u>faith</u>, and faith (to quote again the Archbishop,) means -

"The conviction that the world is in the hands of a faithful Creator. We too are in His hands, and the supreme question is not whether we live or die, but whether we are with Him or are separated from Him."

Our Easter Communion, the recent Confirmation Service and the Commonwealth Youth Service taken by young people, must have demonstrated to many the up-lifting power of corporate worship. Church worship is not everything - but it can be a starting point. It provides the environment and climate in which a germ of faith can grow, and this I know from my own personal experience.

BEKESBOURNE CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS - Thanks to Mrs. Sandall and her many helpers, a successful MAY FAYRE raised £50. The weather kept most people inside the School Building, but the Garden Stall and Hot Dog fryers braved the cold and did a roaring trade outside.

BRIDGE CHURCH - Would anyone be willing to do the weekly cleaning? Mrs. Ennis has had to give it up for health reasons and a voluntary worker is coping temporarily - for which I am most grateful.

NEW CITIZEN - I recommend this Newspaper. All P.C.C. members have subscribed to it and should take their copies from the Church. Others are invited to take a copy and put 4d. in the Alms Box. Please PASS YOUR COPY ON to a neighbour.

JUNE 18th - 28th - My wife and I will be on holiday, but the rest of the family will still be at the Vicarage to receive messages. Needs for a parson will gladly be met by the Rev. Frank Cartman of 'Lime Trees', Nackington Rd., Canterbury. (Tel.Cant.2359), who will take Services in my absence.

LITTLE STOUR RECORDS - V.J. TORR (Cont. from April issue)

BEKESBOURNE

The other Bekesbourne culprit was female, but her case is of rather greater interest than the last. She was "Alice, the wife of John Caryngeboll" and was accused of suspiciously visiting "M. Malk, Vicar of Patrikysborne". To make pleasant variety, this gentleman would sometimes call on Alice at her own house, for the same alleged disreputable purposes. Now this "Malk" was none other than the Malcolm Ramsey, who was in the living of Patrixbourne for many years, and whom you can still see, lying in stone effigy just by the High Altar at Bridge. Alice (who next year was miscalled Joan) was ordered, under pain of excommunication, to keep clear of the Vicar "except in public places". Warham's official thereupon let her go because they had arranged that Ramsey must also clear himself from the charge. So we now turn to

PATRIXBOURNE

The only complaint here is again about the Vicar; and this implies that both Patrixbourne and Bekesbourne Churches were probably in fairly good condition, unlike many of their fellows at that period. Now the language used in the official record is more forthright than at Bekesbourne. Master Malcolm Ramsey, the Vicar, is openly accused of adultery with Alice Claryngbole "the which is openly known". I may remark in passing that in the same record we find that the Master of Wye College (also a priest) was accused of riding all the way to Boughton-under-Blean to visit a married woman for similar purposes.

Ramsey denied it all - "openly known" or not - and was therefore ordered to appear at Canterbury on 26th January, 1512,
accompanied by two clergymen and two laymen who should clear
him of the crime. He did so, but then unfortunately a blank
is left as to what happened. We may presume he scraped off,
since he stayed Vicar for many years more, but the method employed
to establish innocence seems a little naive, for had the
accusation been true, both Malcolm and Alice would certainly
have conducted their affairs out of the reach of local parsons
and countrymen!





My dear People,

Dennis Hawker, formerly at Folkestone, but now Missioner to the Diocese of Lincoln, will be bringing his wife and family to stay at the Vicarage from 3rd to 17th August, and after that I shall be back.

Fr. Hawker will assist the Rev. Frank Cartman and Mr. J.D. Smith in taking the Church Services during my absence. I am sure that you will make the visiting Ministers welcome and support them with your presence at all Services.

I wish you all very happy summer holidays, especially the School children.

Extracts from letter from the Rev. Norman Gilmore.

Kwa Magwaza Mission Station Zululand, South Africa. 21st May, 1962.

Dear Friends.

In my last letter written in 1960, soon after coming to this Mission from St. Augustine's, I spoke of the plans I had for building in various parts of the district, and of the need to press on in the face of the growing power and hostility of our Afrikaner Nationalist Government.

We have "pressed on" and I can now report that the church of St. Paul, Nkwenkwe, has been completely rebuilt and reroofed and the school-rooms there put into good order....

On 8th April, by the side of the Zulu King Mpande's "great place" - it was he who gave KwaMagwaza to our first missionary, Robert Robertson, in 1860 - I dedicated the church of St. Barnabas, Keteketeni.....

On Saturday, May 5th, yet another dedication took place, this time at Kwa Magwaza itself. I dedicated the new assistant Curate's house and also the new classroom block, in the presence of the Zulu King, Cyprian Bekuzulu, his "prime minister" Chief Gatsha Buthelezi, the inspector of schools, Mr. Kolbe, our local chief Sikhukhuza, and a great crowd of Christians and Heathen.....

On the morning of May 5th, preceding this dedication, I received a letter from the Magistrate asking whether my church was prepared to "co-operate" with the Government in removing the people of Kwa Magwaza Mission. Because this Mission is surrounded by European-owned farms, we are regarded as a "black spot" in a white area and this is anathema to the present Government who believe that all men must live in their own areas, separated from people of other race groups. Remember that when Kwa Magwaza Mission began in 1860, and for many years after, there were no European-owned farms anywhere near us. The whites came later, and the story of how they got their land makes disquieting reading. But now we, the Zulus, must leave the homes that families have held for 100 years in order to conform to a blueprint of racial segregation. Justice takes second place to political expediency. I have replied to this letter that under no circumstances will the Church co-operate in perpetrating so dastardly a crime. The Bishop confirms my

actions 'We will not move until they come with their guns and

hound us out of our homes".

I cannot sufficiently stress the urgency of the situation we missionaries and our people find ourselves in today, and our desparate need for the fellowship and support of you in other lands. Our Bishop needs all our prayers that he may not fail, through any inducement (and many are offered), to see the moral issues clearly, nor for fear of consequence, to lead his people in opposition to whatever threatens God's order and God's laws.

For your help which has helped us here to achieve so much in so short a time, I am profoundly thankful. We continue to press on. I have not succeeded in getting a site (so far) at Mkandlweni but have applied with more hope of success for one

at Mjomelwane. So much remains to be done.

Our Mission account is heavily in debt. On 31st March 1962 we owed £331.10.0d. Perhaps I should not have gone ahead so quickly with building projects without having the money in hand. But, as I have tried to show, the times are urgent. So if you can help us to liquidate our debt - to pay our evangelists (£60 a year) - to build and repair - to establish new stations - I beg of you to do so.





My dear People,

I have just had the distressing experience of breaking the news to my Churchwardens and P.C.C. members, and announcing in Church, that I have to leave Bridge, as from early December next, to go to the densely populated town parish of St. Saviour, West Croydon.

I and my family have been very happy here and it is a sad blow to us to have to leave you all, not to mention our lovely churches and attractive new Vicarage! As I explained in Church on Sunday, 22nd July, this call to new responsibilities was quite unexpected, and the move will not be to our advantage from the residential or financial point of view, but I feel that it is my plain duty to do the work for which I was Ordained where the need is greatest, and I believe that the Archbishop and his advisers are the best able to judge where I should be used. St. Saviour's Parish will have been without clergy for a year, and is in a very low state, and my wife and I both feel that it would be wrong to decline to go.

I hope and trust that my successor will be appointed with the minimum of delay, and I will do my utmost to complete all outstanding improvement schemes and make the best possible arrangements for the interregnum period.

THE CHALLENGE

The next few months are going to present a great challenge to me and to you who make up the church-going community. What matters when I leave you is that there should be no diminution of your worship; no slacking off in your church-attendance, and no relaxing of standards where your duties are concerned.

You are fortunate in having good and experienced leaders in your Churchwardens and P.C.C. members, and good Clergy and Lay-readers available and willing to take Services.

Choir-members will still have Mr. Maple and our other Organists to take Choir Practices and to maintain the present excellent standard of singing. Everything will depend on the determination of all members to attend choir practices and

church services with even greater punctuality and regularity than at present.

Servers will have to be organised and trained to look after visiting Celebrants and to attend to the setting out and putting away of linen and vessels correctly.

The Magazine production and distribution must go on and sick visiting, flower arranging, church cleaning, church-yard grass cutting and all the other duties which are part of the church's working life.

My job will be to find and train those who are to carry on the various duties when you are without a Vicar. I shall also have to make many preparations for our family removal to Croydon, which involves finding new schools for the children and supervising the work of repairing and decorating the old Victorian Vicarage which is to be our new home.

THE IMMEDIATE PROBLEMS

Please help me to find a solution to the Bridge Church cleaning problem. If some one (man or woman) could be found to do the sweeping floors and brushing of mats, it should be possible to find one or two volunteers for dusting and polishing pews etc.

Has anyone an oak table? (about 4'6" x 2'6") I would like to put a table at the West End of Bridge Church for Magazines, Missionary Boxes etc.

Improvements to Bridge Church interior - The removal of the front pews and re-siting of the pulpit to give a better view of the Sanctuary and Choir will shortly be commenced. I hope to put up a sketch to show you how it will look. Meanwhile I am looking for a nice Lectern - possibly a brass Eagle!

Shirley Parish Church have presented us with a very fine Bishop's Chair to go in our Sanctuary, so releasing the present Chair to be used for the second Minister's Stall which is to be made out of the present Lectern. This will give us a pair of identical Minister's Stalls, which will look very nice indeed when the Pulpit and front pews have been moved.

HOLIDAYS

As mentioned last month, I shall be away with the children at Thorpeness from 1st - 20th August, but Mr. J.D. Smith and visiting clergy will take services and attend to any parochial emergencies during my absence.

LITTLE STOUR RECORDS by V.J. Torr. (Continued)

BRIGGE, 1511.

In Warham's time and for very long afterwards, Bekesbourne was ecclesiastically independent of Patrixbourne and its chapel of Bridge. Nevertheless, it appears that all three churches were, in 1511, in fairly good structural condition, unlike so many of their sisters, for the visitation returns of each are almost silent about such defects. You have had two of them put before you, and now I come to the longer report on Bridge, where you will notice that the greater part of it is concerned, as so often, with financial matters.

The first case deals with a complaint that the Warden of St. Laurence's Nunnery in Canterbury has kept back (for the past 30 years!) 1s.4d. per annum which is due to Bridge Church. (I need hardly remind readers that this annual sum was then worth far more than its equivalent today). The circumstances were in any case rather unusual, for this establishment was not governed, as might be expected, by an Abbess or Prioress, but by a man. Still, curiously, this male Warden was a Benedictine monk of St. Augustine's Abbey, named Robert Dovor. Later on, this person appeared at Canterbury and denied that Bridge had any such claim on himself; so Warham's Commissary ordered the Bridge wardens to prove it on 28th January, 1512; when they produced the documents showing that their former predecessors had in some cases actually received that rent. Richard Dovor was accordingly directed to appear again on 18th March to hear a decision. On that day the Commissary ordered him either to pay these long arrears to the Churchwardens, or to appear before the Archbishop to justify failure to do so.

Next we come to the offence of William Isaac, gentleman, who is 15 years behind with a twopenny annual rent to Bridge Church. He was ordered to pay this rent yearly in future, and to wipe off the arrears by next Midsummer - or be excommunicated.

The next case links up with that of Isaac. A certain Thomas Yong has for over three years similarly kept back a fivepenny annual rent to the church - and that lifts the lid a little more about Bridge affairs, since he pleads that he will not pay up until Mr. Isaac and certain other defaulters give him an example.





MOTHERS' UNION

Bridge and Patrixbourne Branch start their Autumn Programme with a service in Bridge Church at 7.30 p.m. on Wednesday, 26th September.

Then comes Nicholas Parker, who has kept back a twopenny church-rent for the handwome period of 30 years. He denied this, and the wardens must prove their case on 25th January, 1512, when they produced receipts as in the case of Dovor. So Parker was told he must clear off all the arrears or otherwise satisfy the wardens by the following August, under pain of excommunication.

You will notice that these slippery financial transactions in one village justify my statement that the diocese was riddled with such cases; there are some hundreds more in the enormous Warham report. We end with a change of diet. The Bridge wardens complain that "They be not duly served with an honest priest, but sometime with a friar, sometime with none at all, and that the Vicar will not have there a priest resident". Now this raises several noteworthy points: - (1) as Vicar Ramsey was buried in Bridge Chapel, it implies that he probably lived and died there rather than in Patrixbourne, (2) if he lived on the spot, therefore, there was little excuse for the irregular nature of how the chapel was served, when served at all, (3) I would suggest that perhaps at that period of his long incumbency, Master Malcolm was too engrossed with Alice Claryngbole to have much concern for church services? (4) This business of the duties of a secular priest being sometimes carried out by monastic persons who were supposed to live and work inside their own precincts, was a sign of the times in the years preceding the general Dissolution. It is known for example that St. Radegund's Abbey, near Dover, had its residents gravely depleted in 1511 through this cause, or in a few instances through its inmates having decided to take long leave of their abbey, wandering all over the place and so presumably getting a living by odd jobs or begging from layfolk. Remember that this sort of decadence was firmly in being for a respectable time before Henry VIII employed visitors of pliable consciences to gather up evidence why 'monkery' should come to an end. (5) Ramsey's objection to having a curate resident at Bridge, where he himself probably lived when he was in the district at all, may have been dictated by a desire not to have another clergyman spying on Alice and himself, or it may have been merely to save money.
