VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners of Patricxbourne, Bridge and Bekesbourne,

Once again we begin a new year with a sense of facing the unknown, with a sure faith that we can safely leave all things in the loving hands of God. So we pray anew "Thy will be done" in all the varied events and circumstances of our pilgrim way. May I commend for your spiritual use the prayer at the end of this letter.

A new year makes us look both backways and forwards into the future. We see in the light of the past the countless blessings that we have received in spite of our many failings. As we look forward we must make up our minds clearly to fix the direction in which we desire to go, and build our foundation accordingly in the present. The foundation rests on the infinite worth of the individual (i. e. of you who read) to God and its salvation through the Incarnate Lord. The individual actions of each one of us matters to God. And we are involved deeply in the actions of other souls within the family of man, so it behoves us to love each other as Christ loved us, and loves us.

One Festival of the Church which emerges in January is the Feast of the Epiphany, or the Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. This Feast originated in the East, where it was celebrated in honour of our Lord's Baptism from the third century onwards. From the fourth century it ranked with Easter and Pentecost as one of the three principal feasts of the Church. One of its main features in the East is the solemn blessing of the baptismal waters. It was introduced into the Western Church in the fourth century, but here lost its character as a feast of the Baptism of Christ, which it has retained in the Eastern Church down to the present day. Instead, it became associated with the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, in the person of the Magi, who were the first Gentiles to believe in Christ. Origen, the great spiritual writer of the third century, is the first to give the number of three, probably on account of their three gifts, and this has become the general tradition.

On the Feast of the Epiphany there will be two Celebrations of Holy Communion, at 7 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. at St. Peter's Church, Bridge. I do hope that you will try to observe this great Festival of the Church by your presence at one or other of these services.

May I wish you all a Happy New Year.

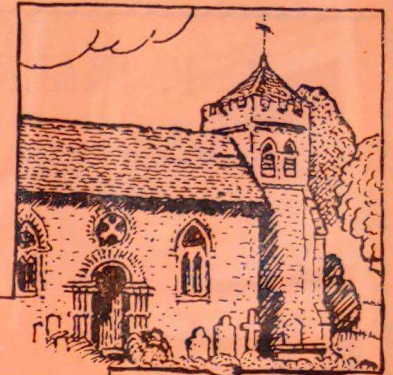
## FREE WILL OFFERING SCHEME

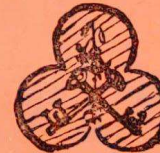

VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patixbourne and Bekesbourne,

The date of our Confirmation is February 26th at 7.30 p.m. at St. Peter's Church, Bekesbourne. It is some time since there was a Confirmation at Bekesbourne and I am looking forward keenly to this Sacrament, with great expectation and hope that the Communicant life of our Church will be revitalized by the influx of the young taking its part equally with those of us of older generations. It is a time when the gift of God the Holy Spirit will be poured out on the children of God. They will be making their first Communion on Sunday, March 1st, at 9.30 a.m. at St. Peter's Church, Bekesbourne. Let us all realise afresh our Baptismal Gift by which we were all made His Children by adoption and grace, and by our prayers together on these days sustain and help all, and strengthen them in their promises by your own personal witness, prayers and presence.

Ash Wednesday falls on the 12th February. Lent brings its challenge to us to take our religion seriously and faithfully. It brings its deep joy and peace, but it also brings its steady discipline on which the security of our faith so much depends. All through Lent we say the collect for Ash Wednesday, which so plainly teaches us the true end of our Lenten rules and observances, that we "may obtain of Thee, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness". That is the true end.

I ask of you your presence as part of your Lenten rule at Holy Communion or Divine Service on the Sundays throughout Lent. Lenten purses will be available in both Churches. The offerings placed in these purses will be devoted to the Church overseas for both pastoral and medical work. They do provide an opportunity for the outward and visible part of our spiritual keeping of Lent.

HON. TREASURER'S REPORT

The satisfactory result for 1963 has been achieved by a reduction in expenditure rather than an increase in receipts. Church collections for General Expenses and for Special Purposes show an increase of £29 over the previous year, but Covenant income is down by £24, and the Free Will Offering Envelope Scheme shows a reduction of £34 compared with 1962. Admittedly, contributions towards the cost of the Parish Magazine amount to £24, but it was hoped that the decision to charge a nominal fee of 3d. per month for the magazine would not result in a reduction in receipts from the Free Will Offering scheme, which has no direct connection with the magazine.

On the Expenditure side expenses have risen slightly, but we have had to spend very little on the two churches in 1963. We have given away £66 less to Missions and Charities than we did in 1963.

The improvement in the financial position at the end of 1963 was due to favourable circumstances which are unlikely to recur. We are about to commence a programme of essential repairs to Bridge Church, and we may well have to do some work at Patrixbourne. It is important that all those who have the welfare of the parish at heart should do their utmost to support their Church by regular contributions, either through the Free Will Offering Scheme or, in certain circumstances, by a 'Seven Year Covenant', whereby Income Tax is recovered for the Church at the full rate.

THE VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patricxbourne and Bekesbourne,

This month we have the Bridge and Patricxbourne Summer Fete on the 23rd May and the Bekesbourne May Fayre on Saturday May 30th. I do hope we shall mutually support each other. This is a good opportunity for new members of the village community to join with us and meet each other on these social and family occasions. We extend to all our old friends and our new arrivals a warm welcome. Full details appear elsewhere in our magazine. We should be most glad to have gifts for the various stalls.

I would like to see an increase in our donations for overseas missions. I feel we could do better than the donations of £45 received during the last financial year. Perhaps we could each make an individual effort to better this. If you would like a collecting box in which you could allocate a small sum regularly, I would gladly see that you have one, if you would let me know.

During this month we have the great thoughts of Rogation Sunday, the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord, and the birthday of the Church, Whit Sunday, and the great doctrinal feast of the Holy Trinity.

"O Lord, from whom all good things do come" is the thought of the collect for Rogation Day. We worship God as creator. It is God, too, who inspires us to pray. "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you". The collect goes further: we are not merely to think and pray, but "to do those things that be good".

The Ascension is rich in meaning for the Christian who apprehends it by faith. The Ascension reminds the faithful Christians that their true home is in Heaven, and that it is from the Ascended Lord that they receive gifts and power to do His will on earth. "Again I leave the world and go to the Father". "From the Father, to the Father". Such is the description of His own life in the world, given by the Son of God Himself. As members of Christ, children of God, such too is the true picture of the dignity of our human lives, that "where He is, thither we might also ascend, and reign with Him in glory".

Whit Sunday is the day when we commemorate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. It is our credal belief that we believe in the Holy "Apostolic" Church. Each believer receives this self-same

gift of the Holy Spirit, and with the help of the Holy Spirit we continue in our generation and age the life of the Church.

The feast of the Holy Trinity safeguards our doctrinal beliefs; that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the Persons nor dividing the Substance: in the words of the Proper Preface for Trinity Sunday "O Lord, Almighty, Everlasting God, Who art one God, one Lord, not one only person, but three persons in one substance!" For that which we believe of the glory of the Father, the same we believe of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, without any difference or inequality. What tremendous truths!

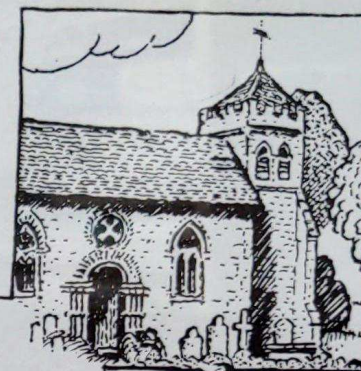

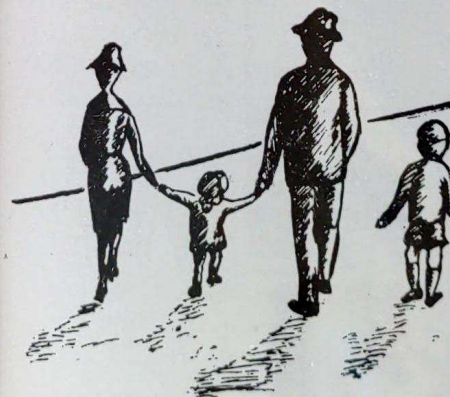
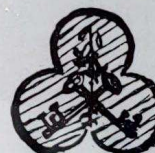

THE VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patricbourne and Bekesbourne,

First I would like to welcome a number of new parishioners to Bridge. I do so hope that you and your families will be happy with us and assure you of a sincere and heartfelt welcome at the Divine Services in our Churches.

This month I would like to mention for your thoughts and prayers the Report on Conversations between the Church of England and the Methodist Church. It has been commended by the Convocations to the Church for study. I propose to have an evening for discussion and



study of this report on Monday the 8th June at 7.30 p.m. at the Village Hall. Members of the Parochial Church Councils and of the congregation are invited to attend. I have purchased four copies of the Report and would be glad to lend them to anyone who is desirous of reading it. The Report is the work of a Committee of Church of England representatives appointed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York at the request of the Convocation, and Methodist Representatives appointed by the President of the Methodist Conference. It is necessary that we may form our judgement at a parochial level, with a reasonable understanding of the issues involved. The Report envisages an ultimate union of the Church of England and the Methodist Church, to be achieved in two stages. First, having established the conditions necessary for mutual recognition, the Church of England and the Methodist Church will enter into communion with each other, "the ministries and sacraments of each being acceptable and available to the other", i.e. full intercommunion, to be achieved through a service of mutual recognition of the ministries and the creation of a Methodist episcopate. The second stage will be that of complete union, when both seek to be united in One Church, i.e. complete organic unity regarded as the goal. It is the chief concern of the Report to set out proposals for reaching the nearer goal of full communion. It does not attempt to set out a complete plan or to answer all the questions which are implied or may be raised. The Report, of course, expresses the views of those who drafted and signed it. These may or may not represent official teaching and practice; at this stage they can be no more than a pointer. For communion we shall need formal statements from the Churches as well. What is involved is a great act of faith. We walk by faith and not by sight. We are joined together in this venture to discharge this mission of ours. We are divided by wide divergencies of ecclesiastical custom and ways of worship, that make the traditional habits of one body seem totally strange and foreign to the other. These and other difficulties will impose great demands on the frailty of our human nature and call for much mutual forbearance and courtesy. But these are Christian qualities, which are parts of the fruits of the Spirit and under His guidance and with His help it is to be hoped that a solution may be found to problems which appear to be quite insoluble by

unaided human ingenuity. Let us pray that we may be led to increasing understanding of one another, and a real desire to be reconciled in Christ as brothers, in this one Faith, though unhappily now separated on matters of order.

THE VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patrixbourne and Bekesbourne,

### THE NEED FOR MORE CLERGY

One of the encouraging results of the Church of England recent poster campaign "Pray more for the Clergy, Pray for more Clergy" which has drawn attention to some of the more important issues facing the ministry today has been the revival of Ember Prayers.

Nobody can say Christian leadership can ever be effective without persistent prayer, and we need not look far to realize that in England alone we have about half the number we need. We must pray for more. Some people are surprised when it is pointed out that there are twelve special days set aside every year for prayer for the Ministry.

Yet, there they are - the Ember Days - the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday in each quarter of the year. They come just before the four traditional ordinations of Advent, Lent, Trinity and Michaelmas and the Prayer Book lists them among the special days of prayer and fasting.

The searching report by Mr. Leslie Paul (which I would be most pleased to lend to any who would like to read it) leaves no doubt that a tremendous re-shaping of the Church of England is called for.

We believe our Church is glorious because the power of God is at work in it. Scripture reminds us, however, that this power is contained in "earthen vessels" - that is in human lives - which are all too frail and fragile. Clergy are aware of this and we all have a solemn duty constantly to call down the power of the Holy Spirit on them so that they may perform the great duty they have been sent to do.

Pray at all times for your Vicar - but come together as a congregation and pray with him. After all, every Christian, we are reminded has a vocation and ministry and just as we expect the clergy to pray for us, so also our prayers should most strongly support them. Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patribourne and Bekesbourne,

One is humbly aware of the fact that this, our Parish Magazine, is taken by a number of kind and good people who nevertheless do not come regularly to services at our Churches. It is my hope that you will read this letter to you especially. We are grateful for the fact that our Parish Magazine is coming into your homes. But is that enough? What about Church-going? Let us be quite clear about one thing. If we believe that God exists, if we believe that God is our Heavenly Father, then we believe in Someone who is so wonderful, so tremendous, so lovable, that He deserves some sort of acknowledgment. It is this fact that leads us to worship. As far as worship in Church is concerned, it isn't a question of "I don't need it" or "I don't feel like it". It is rather that "God is entitled to it". It is simply giving God his due: the family of the Church (of which we are members) having a regular family reunion and get-together to make public or corporate acknowledgment of His Sovereignty, His justice, His love and His worth-ship to us. We don't go to Church primarily for what we can get out of it, although of course we cannot but benefit by way of inspiration, instruction and spiritual strength. Our primary motive in going to Church is simply that this is what God deserves. May we not humbly and gently put aside the excuses which can come so easily and readily, and face the fact that there are very few of us who are too young or too old to get to Church once every Sunday. We have three Churches, with services at many different times. They are all advertised in this magazine. Early service provides an opportunity for giving God His due. This duty ought to have a high priority in our lives above all else.

Having said this in a spirit of love I would add that the parish Churches of our land still baptize nearly 70 per cent of the babies born in this country, conduct 50 per cent of the marriages and perform the last Christian rites of, I believe, over 80 per cent of the population, and it is clear that we are definitely spiritually responsible for far more people than habitually attend our services. No-one else is responsible for these people. If we do not look after them, no-one else will. They are ours, and most of them call themselves by the name of Christian. To care for them is our greatest duty and privilege.

Let us one and all value and not take for granted our Village Churches. Well has it been said that there are few English landscapes which do not embrace, scattered here and there, as essential to the naturalness and beauty of the scene as the very trees themselves, the towers and spires of churches. They are evidence of the long and continuing life of the village community. They are both our heritage and our trust. May we fulfill our trust by giving praise and honour and worship to God in the family of our prayers within God's Holy Churches.

I shall be returning from my holiday on 18th September.

Dear Parishioners of Bridge, Patribourne and Bekesbourne,

At this time of year we give thanks to God for the blessings of Harvest. The keynote is in our prayer of thanksgiving. So many people are involved in the maintenance of our own life and in the provision of food and clothing. In a simple meal we are in living touch with the lives of many people of different races and colour, who in their labour both in this country and in distant lands are providing us with the necessities for the continuance of life. Let us remember them in our prayers with thanksgiving.

This is one of the rare years when St. Luke's Day falls on a Sunday, October 18th. In many dioceses it will be kept as Hospital Sunday. It is good to keep the Church's observance of St. Luke's-tide as a season for special prayer for medical work in general, for doctors, nurses and researchers, for hospitals here in our midst - The Close and Highland Court - hospitals and infirmaries in this country and in missionary diocese overseas. I feel that more emphasis should be placed on this annual observance. I hope too that we shall have in mind the Church's Ministry of Healing, which is directed towards a very important field of human need and Christian Ministry. I propose to preach on this subject at Evensong at St. Peter's Church, Bridge on St. Luke's Day, Sunday 18th October. I do hope that many of you will be able to come to the service.

During this month there will be a General Election. Inevitably a General Election is a battle for political power. One needs to be on guard when power has to be competed for. We must not surrender our own judgement to enticement by person, word, television or wireless. We must make our own judgement of fidelity to the things all Christians hold dear in righteousness, justice, law, goodness, humility, care of our neighbours - selflessness (not selfishness) - self-abnegation - wisdom to do the thing that is right in God's eye. To vote sincerely is to seek a right judgement, and it must be a judgement based on love of God and so love of one's neighbour. Our measuring rod must be graduated rightly.

One must not follow a blind loyalty to a party. There needs must be a cleansing of the mind from all bias, so that we make the best judgement we can in a good conscience. Voting is a moral act of citizenship.

but we can make it a Christian act of our heavenly citizenship.

All Saints' Day, which falls on November 1st and like St. Luke's Day, this year is on a Sunday, makes its own intimate and personal appeal to Christian worshippers. Originally, it was intended as a commemoration of those who in a dramatic and sacrificial way had reflected the glory of Christ in their lives and death. It serves now to a great extent as an occasion when all remember with thanksgiving their own loved ones and friends who are now "with Christ". "Saint" too is short for "sanctified", and sanctified means "set apart" or "made holy". The special quality of a saint then is that of being clearly and noticeably dedicated to the service of God in Christ, in such a way that both the resultant character, achievement and bearing alike bear witness to God's transforming grace. We all, as Christians and by our baptism, are called to become such.

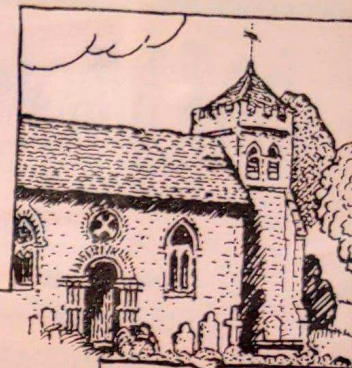

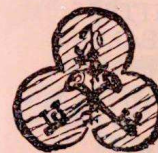

Payment for the Parish Magazine was introduced in June, 1963. It was hoped that the charge of only 3d. per copy would be paid in addition to the F.W.O. contributions, but judging from the above figures it would seem that this hope has not been fulfilled.

The 1964 total of £137 12s. 10d. represents an average F.W.O. contribution of only 3/2d. per month. While it is realised that the scheme includes a number of pensioners and others who are not in a position to make large contributions to the Church, there is no doubt that the **average** figure of 3/2d. per month is woefully inadequate.

The Vicar and Churchwardens ask all those members of the Parish, both older residents and newer ones, who are interested in the welfare of their Church, seriously to consider increasing their periodical contributions and placing them upon a more regular basis. For this purpose the following modifications to the existing scheme are proposed.

The accompanying slip (to be kindly returned to the respective Hon. Treasurers of the Parochial Church Councils) will enable parishioners to promise a regular weekly amount and can be returned to the magazine distributor or the Church collection plate or direct to the P.C.C. Treasurer. If anyone would like to have the amount recorded weekly and a receipt given at the end of the year, a number will be allocated by the Treasurer and **only he** will deal with this and know the amount contributed.

There may be those who desire to continue with the position as it is, with the monthly envelope returnable to the magazine distributor. Please continue to do so, if you prefer this method, and make arrangements with the magazine distributor to have the usual necessary envelope.

For those who are subject to Income Tax at the standard rate a Seven Year Covenant in favour of the P.C.C. is more advantageous, as the tax is recoverable in full by the Council. A Covenant can be paid quarterly, if desired. The Hon. Treasurer will be pleased to supply full particulars.

This month brings the joy of the Feast of the Incarnation of our Blessed Lord. Christmas is that happy time when we all become as little children, and we have an inner vision of what our Lord meant when He said "Except ye become as little children, you cannot enter into the Kingdom of Heaven". It is the spirit that counts and not the trappings of Christmastide. The spirit of Christmas is simply this: God from eternity deemed it right to descend to our level, to live and love and die here in our little life's world. Between this service and a sleep to many, there is no more worship on Christmas Day, and some of the real joy of Christmas morning and family worship with the children is lost.

Christmastide is the season of giving, and for Christians all giving bespeaks the greatest of all gifts - the gift of Jesus Christ to the world. There can be no true Christmas without this aware-
