From the Area Dean

I am always amused by the number of different 'New Years' which occur in the course of any twelve months. As a Christian, one's New Year begins on Advent Sunday - usually in December. As a teacher or lecturer, one's New Year begins in September or October. As a tax payer, New Year starts in April. And the Jewish New Year begins on another date, and the Moslem New Year on another . . . and I have no doubt that there are plenty more variations on the same theme. But most people will also accept January 1st as the start of the calendar New Year; and for some people, January 1st 2001 is the true beginning of the third millennium. (Has anyone any fireworks left?)

Time makes a study which is as fascinating as space, and both are too complicated for most of us to begin to understand. Yet we know that they all fall within the wisdom of God who created them; and the Letter to the Colossians puts it all in perspective for us:

'Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creation; for in him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or authorities - all things were created through him and for him'

Col. 1, 15-16

Set against such cosmic power, how puny we so often seem to be, and how trivial our daily worries and concerns. When we look at the problems of the Church of England today, and wonder how we are going to resolve questions of ministry, mission and money, we might sometimes begin to feel that we cannot cope, and that we are in the early stages of terminal ecclesiastical decline.

If we do so think, it is because we have overloolced the fact that God is the Lord of time and space - and the Lord of past, present and future. Perhaps we do have problems to resolve - but that is why we are here. We are on a journey, - and our purpose is to fulfil the will of God for each one of us; and so we should not fear. If God is with us on the journey, as he must be - having made us for his purposes - we can be assured that he will not desert us, even when the going seems to be particularly tough.

So as we stand at the threshold of a new calendar year, it is right that we should look ahead with confidence and hope; great changes lie ahead, and we have to be ready to let go of much that we have come to regard as established and settled for all time, but we move on in the strength of the faith of the church which has endured for two thousand years - and which will continue until mankind no longer inhabits the earth.

A very happy New Year in the name of Our Lord and Saviour



The Kent Downs - a Nationally Important Landscape

Did you know that part of all of your parish falls within this nationally important landscape? The importance of your parish landscape was recognised in 1968 when the Kent Downs was formally designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). This landscape, which covers nearly a quarter of Kent and runs from Dover to the Surrey border, was considered as important as that of National Parks and therefore worthy of protection. Designation as an AONB means; that the area could be subject to a stricter planning regime, would potentially receive some funding priority from the (now) Countryside Agency and has an AONB Unit working on its' behalf.

The Kent Downs AONB Unit was set up in 1997 and aims to maximise funding opportunities for the area, monitor and guide change and provide advice where possible.

The AONB Unit works with local people, landowners and many other partners to conserve and enhance the Kent Downs. If you would like to find out more about the AONB and how you could be involved contact the Unit at the address below:





CANTERBURY CHORAL SOCIETY





Canterbury Cathedral

Canterbury Choral Society has flourished over the last 50 years and has a reputation as one of the finest choral societies in the South East of England. During its life it has attracted many distinguished visiting conductors including Sir Charles Groves, Sir Colin Davis and Sir David Willcocks. Since 1962 the Society has had two major Conductors Dr Allan Wicks and Dr Richard Cooke who have both contributed to its success. The 200 strong choir comprises members from all walks of life who are united by a love of singing, many of them dedicating much time to the administration of the Society. As the second concert of this 50th anniversary season Canterbury Choral Society have chosen Berlioz's *L 'Enfance du Christ.*

Hector Berlioz, a French composer, was born in 1803 and died in Paris in 1869. As the age of 13 he started his musical education, taking lessons in guitar, flute and singing but he never studied the piano as a child. Hector's father enrolled him in a Paris medical school in 1821 but inspired by attending operas in Paris he abandoned medical school and wrote his *Messe Solonnelle* 1924. To make ends meet he took a job as a chorus singer at a Vaudeville Theatre. During this time he saw a performance of Romeo and Juliet and for him this was the greatest drama of his life. A true romantic the combination of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet and the leading lady Harriet Smithson, whom he eventually married, motivated him to compose his *Symphonie Fantastique*. Berlioz emerged as a master of original and brilliant orchestration.

Berlioz composed L'Enfance du Christ in 1854. It is one of his most enchanting works and it includes a special concert played by 2 flutes and a harp. The oratorio has been described as a masterpiece of simplicity, the music is a delight and includes the much loved carol "Shepherd's Farewell". Soloists for the evening include Louise Mott who thrilled audiences when she appeared recently in Handel's Messiah for the Choral Society.

Bridge Village Traffic Calming

At the beginning of November a public exhibition was held in Bridge village hall so that residents and business owners in the village could see, and comment on, the ideas for traffic calming that the City Council and Parish Council are proposing.

168 people visited the exhibition and filled in a questionnaire. Many people also added comments which have been very useful in deciding some of the details of the final scheme.

The results of the questionnaire analysis are as follows:

Question	Yes (% of responses)	No (% of responses)
Do you think traffic calming is needed in High Street, Bridge?	151 (90%)	14 (8%)
Are you in favour of the proposals shown?	118 (70%)	41 (24%)
Do you think that pedestrian crossing places are needed in the village?	140 (83%)	19 (11%)
Are you in favour of the proposed zebra crossing near the Post Office?	130 (77%)	29 (17%)
Are you in favour of the proposed zebra crossing near the White Horse (PH)?	121 (72%)	32 (19%)
Are you in favour of the proposed ramped crossing in Riverside Close?	111 (66%)	29 (17%)

The results of the public consultation have now been reported to the City Council's Highways Sub-committee who agreed that the scheme should go ahead with the minor amendments suggested on the questionnaires. However the City Council budgets which would fund the work are still frozen, so it is not possible to programme the work at present.

NOTES FROM THE DECEMBER MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Appointment of new parish clerk: The council are pleased to announce that Mrs Geraldine McCombe has been appointed as the new parish clerk with effect from 1 January 2000. Mrs McCombe has previously worked in insurance, banking and the health service. Residents wishing to contact Mrs McCombe can do so at 14 St Mary's Close, Etchinghill, Kent CT18 8NX from 2 January 2001 or by telephoning 01303 862814 after 15 January 2001.

Christmas lights: Although all Christmas trees were installed before the end of November a problem occurred with the lights, some of which had faults which proved difficult to repair. Some new sets of lights have also been purchased and councillors expect all trees to be illuminated well before Christmas.

Budget for 2001/2002: Councillors agreed that the precept for 2001/2002 should be set at £7954 and that the concurrent functions grant applied for should be £6941. Applications are also to be made for a capital concurrent function grant to fund an additional street light in Conyngham Lane, heating for the sports pavilion on the recreation ground and some improvements to the Mill Centre. Unfortunately, because of the system now operating at the city council, any allocation made for these improvements will not be available until 2003/2004.

Millennium Festival: The Millennium Festival Committee reported to the parish council that funds raised at the summer event had now been distributed to Bridge and Patrixbourne CE Primary School, St Peters Church and the village playgroup. A further meeting is to be held on 16 January 2001 to consider making Bridge Festival a regular event. Any one interested in making a comment or being involved in organising the festival will be welcome at the meeting which is to be held in The Hunter Room of the village hall.

Recreation Ground: Several matters concerning the recreation ground were discussed. These included the replacement of the ball stop fencing behind the play goal, a report from the supplier of the new swings reporting that the recent problems were caused by "technical" problems rather than vandalism and that a monthly checklist for inspecting the play equipment is to be requested from ROSPA.

Streets and footways: Bifrons Path has regularly been cleared of wet leaves during the autumn. Two new street signs have been installed in Conyngham Lane, but the sign for Green Court is still awaited. The obstruction of a street sign by trees in Bourne Park Road and the overgrown bushes besides the bridge in the centre of the village have been reported to the city council highways department. Councillors noted that the recent flood work undertaken by the city council in the village had been effective in the wet weather, along with the work completed by the Environment Agency last autumn. The removal of the footbridge in Mill Lane is causing some concern to residents. The parish council will be requesting its reinstatement or replacement as soon as practical. Drains in Town Hill, Bridge Hill and Pett Hill were reported as being silted up and will be reported to the city council as soon as possible.

Neighbourhood Watch: The parish council is keen to see Neighbourhood Watch operating effectively and will be holding a re-launch of the scheme at the Annual Parish meeting to be held on 28 March 2001. Any volunteers to act as local co-ordinators should contact the parish clerk in January.

Can We Trust the Bible?

Continuing our series looking at Jesus, I thought we should deal with this issue, given the way I have relied on the Bible when answering the other questions. Obviously, I am going to say yes, but it does depend what you are using the Bible for. For example, we can trust that John's gospel description of the crucifixion was an eye witness account, but we cannot say the same about Moses' explanation of creation in Genesis. Archaeological evidence now points towards Joshua's army capturing Jericho, but there was no good samaritan helping a stranger on the way from Jerusalem, it was a parable.

You see, the Bible is a collection of writings; some letters, some poems, some testimonies, some historical accounts, some prophesies, or messages from God. to use the Bible safely, you need to understand how each part was written. The apostle Paul said that "all scripture is God breathed" but that does not mean that God wrote it, but that those who did write it were special people with a special relationship with God. They were inspired by their understanding of

God to put in words what they felt in their hearts about God.

Everything must be read in context, and I would not suggest that you use the Bible by sticking a pin randomly in a page and applying the text. You could end up with "then Judas hanged himself" (Matthew 27:5) & "go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). It is much safer to trust the authors to tell us what they were up to. For example, Luke starts his gospel by saying that he wanted to give an orderly account of the life of Jesus so that his friend should believe what he had heard from others. The Old Testament prophets dated their messages by recording who was king at the time and which year of his reign (you can't get more exact than that!).

Of course, there are many versions of the Bible around, some hundreds of years old, others with the print hardly dry! But they are all doing the same thing. They translate the original texts into words that convey the original message to a new generation, or a different culture. This means that we have to trust the translators, or learn to read Greek and Hebrew for ourselves. But the best way to test if the Bible is trustworthy is to read it for yourself. Try it. If you

haven't got one, come and see me. I've got plenty!





WHAT IS THE CHURCH?

If you are a member of a club - you would say you belong to the club, and meet at the clubhouse. In other words the club and clubhouse are different things, one being a group of people,

the other a building.

Well, the same thing applies to the church. Unfortunately, it gets confusing because the church meets in the church! When we refer to 'The Church' we are normally referring to the group of people, not the building. You could say that the church is the congregation, but this label suggests that we need a church building for the church to exist. Perhaps a better way of describing the church is as a community, or even an extended family.

The early Christians referred to each other as 'brothers and sisters', emphasising the close relationship between fellow believers. But, just like normal families, this spiritual family has its internal tensions, with arguments and sulks, even family members leaving home vowing never to return. In the church, this has led to a large number of denominations, the best known being Roman Catholic, Anglican (C of E), Baptist and Methodist. Each denomination is like a brother or sister that has fallen out with their siblings, but still identifies themselves as part of the Family.

All major denominations have different views on the interpretation and application of the Christian Faith, but recognise that, behind the differences, we all believe in the same God, in the need for his intervention in our lives and the benefits of his Son's death on the cross for our sake. - But more about that next month. Until then, may God bless you and those you love.

CANTERBURY CHORAL SOCIETY VERDI: Stabat Mater and Te Deum ROSSINI: Stabat Mater Saturday 31st March 2001 7.30 pm Canterbury Cathedral



When planning the Choral Society's 50th Season Richard Cooke chose an Italian evening with choral music from two of Italy's most famous composers.

This year is the centenary of Verdi's death and Stabat Mater and Te Deum were his last compositions prior to his death in 1901. They are part of Quattro Pezzi Sacri. The Stabat Mater is a one movement piece with soaring melodic lines reflecting the words of the poem, probably written by a Franciscan Monk in the 13th century, The Te Deum is scored for double choir and is rich in texture.

Verdi is to Opera what Shakespeare is to Drama. As with many famous composers, his early works were rejected and it was not until 1839 in Milan that his Oberto was accepted at La Scala and further operas commissioned. He wrote Nabucco in 1842 and this carried his reputation across Italy, Europe and the New World. Three of his most well known operas Rigoletto, Il trovatore and La traviata are sung in all the major opera houses of the world. With the dark drama of the first, the heroics of the second and the grace and pathos of the third, Verdi shows his extraordinarily wide expressive range.

Rossini occupied an unrivalled position in the Italian Musical world, winning considerable success relatively early in his career. As with Verdi his operas which include The Italian Girl in Algiers, The Thieving Magpie and William Tell are also popular in the major opera houses. More significantly the overtures to these, especially William Tell are a recurrent element in the repertoire of the concert hall. Rossini wrote William Tell at the age of 37 but then very little of importance until Stabat Mater. This is in great contrast to Verdi's setting and consists of ten movements. At the time Rossini's theatrical language led it to being regarded as too worldly, too sensuous and too playful for a religious subject. This may have been true at the time but in this oratorio can be found some of Rossini's most effective writing.



NOTES FROM THE FEBRUARY MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Tele-cottage: The survey to establish interest in the village is to be carried out during February with a questionnaire to be delivered to all households in Bridge The Chairman thanked Cllr Connor for all the work he had done on this matter.



Did Jesus have To Die?

This month, the church (approx 2 billion people worldwide) will celebrate the anniversary of a brutal execution and life giving miracle, all in the space of three days. Jesus, who entered Jerusalem at the head of a procession proclaiming him to be the long awaited Messiah, was betrayed by the same people less than a week later. His own countrymen handed him over to the occupying Romans to be crucified as a troublemaker.

But did Jesus know what would happen when, instead of leading a revolt that would drive the Romans from Jerusalem, he drove the crowds from the temple and set himself up against the Jewish Priests and Pharisees? Did his promising 3 years of teaching have to

end on a cross outside the walls of Jerusalem?

The straight answer is YES! If only the people had read what ancient prophecies had said, not what they wanted to read, they would have seen that the Messiah would function as a sacrifice. if only the disciples had listened to Jesus when he taught them, they would have realised that he always worked towards the goal of death in Jerusalem.

And if only we would read the gospels and letters of the early church, we would understand that the death of Jesus paid the price to clear our massive overdraft, built up by mankind ever since our original

decision to become spiritually independent from God.

On the cross, Jesus said 'it is finished'. he meant that his task, the rescue of mankind from the debts of sin, was complete - mission accomplished! That's why we call it Good Friday. But freedom from the guilt of sins is not the end of the story. On the third day (Easter Sunday), Jesus fulfilled another prophecy by rising from the dead. Next month we will explore the resurrection and its implications for our future, here on earth and eternally.

Until then, may God bless you and those you love.

NOTES FROM THE MARCH MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Tele-cottage: Cllr Connor reported that the response to the survey to establish interest in the village carried out during February was disappointing. The number of responses received totalled 45 of which 10 were not interested and 35 (representing 55 people) expressed some interest. Cllr Corfield had received 10 email responses, some offering help. As the response represented less than 4% of electors it was agreed not to proceed with a communication, learning and information centre. Other possible means of providing learning support for those parishioners interested could be provided via a course using laptops or with volunteers using available equipment within the village and it was reported that a computer room is planned for the school and this could possibly provide a venue. It was agreed to review these options at a later date. Cllr Connor thanked Cllr Vye and Julian Brazier for investigating the opportunities for raising money for the project and the chairman thanked Cllr Connor for all the hard work he had done.

Replacement of Post Office Bench: The parish council has agreed on the design of the replacement bench and an order has been placed.

Red Lion Public House: It was reported by the chairman that the Red Lion has suffered sewage problems and loss of business and is currently unable to trade. It was also reported that Southern Water are currently pumping raw sewage into the Nailbourne. The parish council will be writing to Southern Water and Offwat expressing concern over the loss of the amenity to the community and the pumping of sewage into the Nailbourne.

Recreation Ground: Treatment of mole infestation has been carried out and the Springer Units in the playground are to be repaired free of charge by the supplier.

Streets and footways: Several matters have been reported to the City Council including an SEGB sunken metal cover in Union Road, broken grill near the bridge, repeated litter gathering around the paper and bottle banks in Town Hill, blocked drains in Patrixbourne Road and Union Road and a burnt out car in Brewery Lane.

Memorial Bench: The memorial bench in memory of Mr & Mrs P E Worsley formerly of 11 Ford Close has now been installed on the land adjacent to Ford Close.

Vandalism: The seat east of the bridge has been removed and put in the stream and the Environment Agency removed it on the same day it was reported. The seat is to be repaired and resited.



Walking with Jesus

I wonder if you caught sight of a documentary programme last year called "Walking with Dinosaurs"? It was a cross between Jurassic Park, Time Team and a David Attenborough series. With the use of computer graphics we were taken back millions of years to witness how dinosaurs lived and died in a very convincing way. But presentation isn't everything. After the series, critics and 'experts' were quick to decry the speculation and unfounded confidence that took current theory and proclaimed it as established fact.

I was reminded of this series over Easter whilst watching the BBC documentary "The Son of God". Once again, we were visually transported, this time to 1st Century Palestine, to witness life in the Temple of Jerusalem, fishing villages by Lake Galilee and the tiny village of Bethlehem (now a suburb of Jerusalem).

But there the similarity ends.

For centuries, critics accused the gospel writers of creating fiction, because they talked of unknown places. Now, archaeologists have unearthed remains that confirm what was written by people alive at the time. Individual names, places and incidents have been recorded as fact. Our understanding of Jesus; who he was, what he did, how he died, does not come from speculation based on fossilised footprints or theories of ancient asteroids. Instead, we have a reliable, historical document, that allows programmes like 'The Son of God' to be broadcast as documentary rather than science fiction.

I hope that, like me, you found the presentation of 'The Son of God' a helpful visual aid, putting flesh on the bones of the written accounts of Jesus' life. If you missed the programme, I should, by now, have a copy which we can use for a series of study evenings over the summer. Until then, more of the same

The New Close is currently home to 40 Residents, but there is a waiting list and the Trust is proposing to extend the Home so that up to 53 can be cared for. The Plans also include the improvement of the Home and the provision of en-suite bedrooms.

An informal Presentation of the Plans took place on Saturday, 31st March in the Primary School Hall and neighbours and Residents' relatives met with representatives from The New Close to discuss the proposals.

If the Planning Permission is successful, the Trust hopes that building work will start in the Autumn.

This Community Supported Agriculture Scheme, run from the Brockman's, Perry Court Farm, Garline Green, Chartham, has been running for ten years now and is just setting out for another year of vegetable growing.

With the overwhelming problems that our farmers are facing these days our group are happy that we can help, at least one local farm, in this small way, and also bring good fresh vegetables to the local community.

The summer season starts in mid June. There will be two sizes of weekly boxes of vegetables. The standard one costs £78 for 12 weeks (£6.50 per box), the large box costs £117 for 12 weeks (£9.75 per box). There is a small reduction of £8 and £12 respectively if people join before 15th June. At present we have three pick-up points, 1-the farm, 2-Canterbury Wholefoods, 3-Organic Health, Canterbury.



Appeal for information: Researcher seeks British Resistance Fighters

Are you, or do you know someone who was, a former member of the Home Guard Auxiliary Units, Special Duties Section or XII Corps Observation Unit?

I am researching a book on Kent's Secret Army, the resistance movement set up in July 1940 to counter the expected German invasion following the Fall of France and the Dunkirk Evacuation.

Winston Churchill ordered a Secret Army (known officially in Kent as XII Corps Observation Unit) to be formed comprising men who knew the Kent hills, forests and marshes, such as farmers, farm workers, market gardeners, landowners, foresters, gamekeepers, poachers, policemen and shepherds. Secret underground bunkers, observation posts and wireless stations were built along the North Downs, on Romney Marsh and in the Weald ready for the men to disappear into.

Their suicidal role was to ambush German patrols, sabotage railway lines, roads and bridges, assassinate German officers and destroy supply depots and airfields anything to slow up the German advance.

NOTES FROM THE MAY MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Election of chairman for 2001-2002: Cllr Anderson was proposed for the post of chairman by Cllr Walder and seconded by Cllr Hill and elected unanimously.

Election of vice chairman for 2001-2002: Cllr Beer was proposed for the post of vice chairman by Cllr Walder and seconded by Cllr Connor and elected unanimously.

Neighbourhood watch: Cllr Corfield reported that approximately 12 to 15 volunteers had come forward following PC Bradshaw's distribution of the notice of closure and that the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme could now be re-launched. 3 Neighbourhood Watch Areas are planned - Bridge Down, west side of the High Street and the Patrixbourne side of the High Street. Cllr Corfield advised that there would be minimal set up costs and it was unanimously AGREED that £100.00 would be set aside for this purpose. Cllr Corfield also advised that there could be a requirement for more Neighbourhood Watch signs and he would investigate whether or not this was the case and councillors AGREED to offer support should they be required.

Village sign and parish council notice board: A quote has been received for repainting the village sign and reproofing the parish council notice board and it was AGREED to accept the quotation.

Parish council newsletter/village directory: Cllr Dobson proposed that the parish council produce a newsletter to raise its awareness to the parish. She proposed that the newsletter be issued twice a year - Spring/Summer and Autumn/Winter and should include input from all councillors. Cllr Dobson also proposed that a village directory be produced providing information of all the facilities and activities available within the parish. Although both proposals were greeted enthusiastically it was unanimously AGREED to produce the newsletter in the first instance and Cllr Dobson agreed to act as editor.







Where There's Blame

A few years ago, a colleague of mine had an old school friend over from the States for a holiday. On the last day of her visit, the friend tripped on the stairs and sprained her ankle. A bag of frozen peas did the trick and she was soon on her way back to the U.S. of A. Imagine my colleague's surprise when, instead of a letter of thanks for her hospitality, she received an official notice suing her for negligence!

Only in America, you might say; It couldn't happen here, you might think. Wrong! The current catch phrase in TV adverts is "where there's blame, there's a claim". Nothing personal of course, the American friend couldn't see what all the fuss was about. After all, it was covered by the

house insurance.

The issue that concerns me here is the idea that money makes everything all right again, either for the claimant or the offender. One advert shows a boy who has to wear glasses for life following a playground accident, but hey - that's ok, he got £5000 for it!

That's not to say that compensation is wrong, in fact it is a biblical principle. 'An eye for an eye' regulated Old Testament reparation to make sure that payment for injury compensated for the damage or inconvenience caused. Note, compensation, not revenge. An eye for an eye, not two eyes

for an eye.

The thought of cashing in when someone else is negligent may seem attractive, but what if the boot is on the other foot, and we are the negligent ones? Do we readily admit the blame, and pay the claim? Do we say sorry because of the damage we have caused, or as an attempt to shield us

from punishment?

Biblical repentance involves contrition (true sadness at having done something wrong) and reparation (an attempt to make amends) leading to forgiveness (wiping the slate clean) and reconciliation (repairing broken relationships). Ironically, the Bible also implores us to make amends before it gets to court, because enforced reparation rarely leads to true forgiveness.

Next month we'll explore our relationship with God, and what

happens when he has a claim against us!



TRIE Campaign 2001 - The Responsibility is Everyone's

At a recent meeting of the Parochial Church Council I reported that after much preparation work, details of this year's campaign were circulated to about 280 families in the parish of Patrixbourne with Bridge but, sadly, the response was not very encouraging. To date only 22 replies, about 8%, have been received and these comprised some £575 in donations and £781 per annum in new or increased ongoing commitments. Losses from the planned giving scheme do occur every year by virtue of death or moving away and figures show that, in terms of income, the parish is more or less standing still. The amount now being received from regular planned giving is roughly the same as it was in 1997 and in no way meets the outgoings.

Central bodies' (the Church Commissioners and the Diocese) levy on the parish for 2001 amounts to £24,000 which goes to pay the vicar's stipend, housing, pension, etc., while our two churches need a further £16,000 to meet local costs of repairs, insurance, heating, lighting and the vicar's working expenses! etc.

Our present planned giving income amounts to just over £14,000 and we can reclaim tax of about £4,000 from the Inland Revenue on that giving. So there is a gap - a serious gap.

Fund raising events, which have to be organised and run by a small committee, and Sunday collections, together with individual donations, are being more and more relied on to make the books balance. But there is a limit to these resources and so we look to such campaigns as TRIE for support. The churches in our two villages are there for everyone to use and many of our villagers do use them at some time or other, either directly or indirectly.



NOTES FROM THE JULY MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Newsletter: The first newsletter has now been printed and delivered to all households and Cllr Dobson thanked everyone for their help in the distribution. In his absence the clerk passed on Cllr Anderson's thanks to Cllr Dobson for her hard work in producing the newsletter. Several positive comments have also been received from parishioners who wish to see the newsletter continue

Traffic Calming: Following the completion of the traffic calming it was AGREED that the clerk should write to Kent Highways to obtain their agreement to the planting of shrubs or trees to make these areas more attractive, especially as they are at the gateway to the village. It was also AGREED to request the provision of priority signs to make the right of way clearer to traffic.

Sandbag Storage: It was unanimously AGREED that a suitable site for the proposed sandbag storage container would be on an area of land at the recreation ground where there is already a laid base which could be extended if necessary and the clerk was requested to contact Canterbury City Council to arrange a site visit by their engineer. Cllr Monkagreed to meet with Peter Brooks from the council to sort out the details.

Allotments: Cllr Dobson reported that there are several parishioners who would like an allotment but had been advised that there would be none available until next year when the Parish Council had completed their work with regard to the water supply. It was AGREED that the clerk would establish whether the land had now been cleared so that the parish council could go ahead with the installation of the water supply.

Vandalism: It was reported that there been a greater police presence recently in the village following incidents involving vandalism and that parishioners are extremely concerned with the increase in acts of vandalism. It was unanimously AGREED that Cllr Beer would raise these concerns at the next Police Form meeting in July and would invite the police to attend a meeting of villagers to address them on this problem. Cllr Corfield AGREED to contact the neighbourhood watch co-ordinators to ask them to be vigilant and make everyone aware of the problem and request that all acts of vandalism are reported to the police.





What Is Worship?

'Sheep-dip' Christianity is a phrase that describes a weekly visit to church for a dip into the religious chemical bath for spiritual cleansing, followed by a return to the real world to get dirty again on Monday. This is clearly not what the Bible tells us that God expects of his worshipping

people.

When the people of Israel worshipped God on the one hand but rejected justice and righteousness on the other, he said; "I hate, I despise your religious feasts; I cannot stand your assemblies. Even though you bring me burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them. Though you bring choice fellowship offerings, I will have no regard for them. Away with the noise of your songs! I will not listen to the music of your harps. But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!"

And Jesus, observing the two-faced behaviour of the religious leaders who acted piously in public worship, but lived unholy lives in private, said "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites: as it is written: These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain; their teachings are but rules taught by men.' You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to the traditions of

men."

In contrast, to truly worship God we must sacrifice our own needs and desires and offer ourselves to do God's will. As Paul wrote; "I urge you, friends, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy

and pleasing to God - this is your spiritual act of worship."

At the end of the communion service we pray; "Send us out in the power of your Spirit, to live and work to your praise and glory." Let us remember that God commissions, equips and motivates us when we return to our every day lives; at all times and in all places; whether at work, rest, or play; to be living sacrifices in his service.

May God continue to bless you and all those you love.





Pause For Thought

I find it hard to concentrate on the print deadline for this letter, given the events of the past two days. I have found myself comparing the video footage from New York with the special effects dished up by Hollywood in films such as Die Hard, Godzilla or Independence Day. I have struggled to come to terms with the numbers involved - estimates of 10,000+ dead. And we saw it live on TV thousands of miles away.

By the time you read this, the dust would have literally settled, but what has happened in the mean time? I hope that President Bush's promise of justice has not, and will not, turn into a call for revenge. As we see from around the world, and experience within our own lives, revenge tends to be unmeasured, indiscriminate and unjust. It invariably escalates

the conflict, and leads to more suffering for more innocent people.

I have seen film of Palestinian children dancing in the streets, and heard talk of Afghanistan being attacked because one outlaw lives there. Do Palestinian children understand what is going on, any more than those kids in Northern Ireland being made to run the gauntlet every morning? I think not. Should we wage war on a country because of the (suspected) actions of one man? I pray to God that we don't.

Jesus said "turn the other cheek". This does not mean that criminals should be left unpunished, but it does take away any perceived right to retaliation. You might think that "an eye for an eye" is a more useful quote, but would you murder 10,000 innocent civilians in cold blood to

balance what happened in America? I hope not.

Perhaps the shock of this tragedy will serve to slow reactions down, to stop us from lashing out in blind fury. There will come a time for justice, there will come a time for forgiveness and peace. We can choose to hasten that time through our attitudes and our prayers for the victims of injustice. Please think about it.

May God continue to bless you and all those you love.

NOTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Newsletter: The second newsletter is currently being prepared and is due to be delivered to all households in Bridge by mid October.

Bus Shelter: The repair work to the fire damaged bus shelter in the High Street has been carried out and the insurance claim has been settled. Canterbury City Council have agreed to the Parish Council's request for the bus shelter to be swept at the same time as the High Street which is done every Friday





Back to Basics

I was recently asked if I consider myself a Religious Fundamentalist. Strong language when you think of others who attract this label by their extreme behaviour and beliefs.

But what is a fundamentalist? Look at your car (or your neighbour's if you don't have one). What makes it a car? Certain features such as an engine, a wheel in each corner (and one for steering) and the ability to carry passengers are 'Fundamental' to it being seen as a car. Other details, such as alloy wheels, leather trim, or CD player are all extras rather than essentials, and diesel or petrol engines or manual/automatic gears are important individual choices, but do not change the car to a bike, or a lorry, or a lawnmower.

Christianity also has its fundamentals, features that are non-negotiable if the faith is to remain recognisable. We summarise them in statements of belief, the creeds (credo = I believe). The Apostles' Creed is a clear statement of essential christian truths. Through it we declare our belief in a creator God, a saviour for all mankind, born of a virgin, executed by order of a Roman Governor, and resurrected from death. God continues to work through his Holy Spirit, and we have the assurance of forgiveness of sins and resurrection to eternal life. These are the Fundamental underpinning beliefs of the christian faith, and other issues such as styles of worship, types of music, choice of bible translation are no more than a matter of personal preference.

So, in answer to the original question, as I stand by the beliefs set out in the creeds - the answer must be - Yes - I am a fundamentalist!

May God continue to bless you and all those you love.



NOTES FROM THE OCTOBER MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Newsletter: Cllr Dobson thanked councillors for their contributions to the newsletter which is now ready for distribution. It was unanimously AGREED that the newsletter will be distributed in the village during this week and Cllr Anderson AGREED to arrange this. Cllr Anderson also thanked Cllr Dobson for her hard work in producing the newsletter.

Traffic Calming: Cllr Anderson reported that although the areas of land created by the traffic calming had initially been planted by Cllr Oakey and his wife a decision as to sponsorship for future planting was required if these areas are to remain in good order. It was AGREED that Cllr Anderson would discuss the matter with Cllr Oakey and his wife for suggestions and ideas for planting. The clerk reported that no reply had been received regarding the request for a priority sign and it was AGREED that she should write to Andy Phillips regarding this and also about the textured surfacing which has not yet been laid.

Sandbag Storage: Cllr Monk advised that the storage container had now been installed and filled with sandbags and the keys had now been issued to the keyholders. Canterbury City Council will be advised of the names and addresses of the keyholders should a resident contact the City Council during any future flooding incident.







NOTES FROM THE NOVEMBER MEETING OF BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Allotments: FPD Savills have advised that the allotments have not yet been cleared and are not likely to be ready in the near future due to lack of funding. It was AGREED that the clerk should write to FPD Savills advising them of the interest expressed by a number of villagers who wish to have allotments and asking them to give the matter a high priority.

Traffic Calming: It was AGREED that the clerk should write to the City Council to request more parking attendant presence in the village as cars are still being parked on the hatched area of the pedestrian crossing.

Kent Highways have advised that the anti-skid surfacing should be completed in the next few weeks and that they are reluctant to erect priority signs as the normal convention of motoring is that the motorist with the obstruction on his side of the road gives way. Kent Highways have advised CI West that a large number of complaints about the scheme have been received but as the scheme is not yet finished they would prefer to wait to review the scheme in its entirety. The initial findings were that traffic speeds have reduced considerably on the southbound approach to Conyngham Lane but this will have to be measured again once the scheme is completed to see if the speed reduction has been sustained.

Trees: Cllr Monk reported that the request for the additional trees was in hand and they should arrive shortly. It was AGREED that one of the new Ash trees should be used to replace a Cherry tree in the recreation ground which needs to be removed as it is dead due to disease. The clerk was requested to write to the Women's Institute who provided the tree originally to advise them that it was to be removed to avoid it infecting other Cherry trees around it and that it would be replaced with the Ash. It was AGREED that work should be carried out on a Sycamore tree and the Cherry tree in the recreation ground and a Horsechestnut tree in Western Avenue.

Christmas Trees: Cllr Walder reported that there were a total of 25 requests for trees this year and that £185.00 in donations had been received. The trees had been ordered and it was proposed to erect then on the last Saturday in November. It was AGREED that a letter of thanks would be sent to everyone who had made donations.

Art Exhibition: It was reported that the Art Exhibition held in the village hall in aid of the Disabled Access Fund had been a success and was greatly enjoyed by all those who visited the exhibition. It was AGREED that a letter of thanks should be sent to Cllr Corfield and his team for all their efforts in organising the event.

Golden Jubilee: As part of the Golden Jubilee celebrations in 2002 it was confirmed that the combined Church and School fete is to be held on 22 June 2002. It was unanimously AGREED to cover any losses up to £750.00
