

Sometimes it's lovely not to have to do anything, just sit and 'be' especially if the sitting and the being is further enhanced by a glass of something. But life generally is not spent in relaxed reflection and even in the country idyll of the Vicarage looking at the number of e-mails requiring reply in my in-box and the ever ringing telephone, today like yesterday is not going to be a day of prayerful contemplation! Life can have a habit of requiring never ending sessions of hard slog, or more simply getting on with the ordinary. In the simple repetition of life one can easily be deluded into thinking that God exists not in the everyday ordinariness but rather in what seems on the surface as the extraordinary other life of holiness.

This 'other life' is the sort of life inhabited by holy people who live in a place of other worldliness. These people we imagine know nothing of the realities of frustrated relationships, caring for crying babies who wake at two in the morning in need of a feed with a partner who could sleep through the Blitz happily unaware of your need for sleep and work in the morning. The holy person never has to, deal with/remonstrate / negotiate with (delete as appropriate) the teenage creature that was once your beloved child but age seems to have transformed them into something parenthood never really prepared you for. As life deals with the ordinary, God happens to other people who have the time and temperament for such things.

Yet in the ordinariness of life God is there, sadly we tend to look for him in the yesterday of failed possibilities or the urgency of the tomorrow which holds the prospect of what might be. We live lives of looking into the yesterday or racing around coping with the next day to come and all of its needs. The few wise and holy people I know are fully aware of the world around them, much more aware than the busy people who rush by caught up in the hubris of life. They are grimly in touch with the hurt and pain of life whether caused by human action or the onset of age and disease. Yet they see life in the present of today, the life lived in the moment of now where God exists and yearns for us to share in as well. So please give what you think religion might be a miss and instead stop and celebrate the present moment with God.

Bekesbourne 100 Club

Mrs Daisy Watson Although Daisy Watson, who died recently shortly after her 100th birthday, never lived in Bekesbourne, she had a long association with the village. Born Daisy Friend in August 2012 (sister of David, Olive and Lily), she was brought up in Shepherdswell, where she met her future husband Ern. Daisy worked as a nurse at Pembury Hospital during the war, while Ern served in the Royal Marines. They married after the war and lived in Adisham, where they brought up their two sons and a daughter. Daisy would walk from Adisham with the children to attend Bekesbourne Church and was a member of the Bekesbourne Mothers' Union and the Women's Institute. Ern. who worked for Mounts, was then offered a house in Worcester Lane and Daisy lived there until shortly after his death in the late 1970s, when she moved to Bifrons Gardens in Patrixbourne. There she tended her garden, producing quantities of plants for every village sale, willingly helped with all Bekesbourne church activities and was a familiar sight smiling behind the cake stall at church markets. She was a lady of the 'old school' always preferring to be called Mrs Watson and addressing others as Mr or Mrs.....Sunday observance was very important to her. She would never work in her garden on a Sunday and preferred to cook on a Saturday, rather than Sunday. She continued to walk well into her 90s - to church, to the station, to Bridge to collect her pension, always correctly dressed and wearing her hat. Five years ago she moved to sheltered accommodation in Canterbury, where she lived until shortly before her death. After she celebrated her birthday with a family party which included her sons from Germany and Australia, her daughter and three grandsons, her long life reached a peaceful end.



Potential Housing Development sites

Bridge Parish Council held an extra-ordinary meeting on 15th August to discuss in detail the report from the Neighbourhood Plan Committee on the proposed development sites for Bridge. The report had been complied from an analysis of data obtained from the recent village questionnaire. It was noted that 50.5% of respondents had said that they did not think Bridge needed any more housing. There was a general consensus that Church Meadow should not be developed at all. On the proposals for the A2 site and Brickfields, the report showed that opinion was almost equally divided with a slight majority considering the A2 site more suitable. After considerable detailed debate, a majority of councillors voted for limited development shared between the Brickfields and A2 sites. A map showing the extent of the area on which development could be acceptable, together with the report, would be submitted to the city council for inclusion in the draft Local District Plan.

Play area surface

Having considered the four quotations for the renewal of the wet pour surface of the children's play area, it was agreed that the quotation from Wicksteed Leisure was the preferred option. Councillors agreed to contribute approximately 51% of the cost of the renewal from parish reserves. The Clerk would seek funding from Canterbury City Council under their Capital Grant Scheme.

Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 13th September 2012

Boundaries for possible housing development sites – It was agreed to draw the boundary of the area acceptable for housing development on SHLAA site /201 (land west of the A2) alongside the present boundary of Bridge Health Centre, to finish level with the Centre's perimeter fence and approximately 1/3rd of the proposed site wide. A maximum of 10 houses for families to be built on this site during the period of the District Plan.

It was agreed to draw the boundary for SHLAA site /186 (Brickfields) along the top of the field, to follow the line of the existing affordable housing and extend it as far as necessary to accommodate a maximum of 8 affordable housing units to be built during the period of the Local District Plan. A map showing the extent of the two areas for development would be submitted to the city council with the parish council's formal response to the SHLAA site proposals.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> — Mr Connor reported that an exhibition showing the results of the analysis of the questionnaire up to that date had been held in the village hall on 25th. August. A decision would be taken by the Committee as to whether to use the services of a volunteer professional planner. It was expected that the Neighbourhood Plan would take about 2 years to complete.

Bridge in Bloom – Cllr Edmonds announced that the presentation of awards for 'Bridge in Bloom' would be held on Thursday 27th. September at 3.00pm in Mansfield Court. .Flowers would be presented to Mansfield Court, which won the Community Garden award again, Penny Spencer would be presented with a garden token and the Red Lion would be awarded a shield, which was being engraved. Cllr Edmonds thanked Viv Brazier for her help in judging the competition. Cllr Hill thanked Cllr Edmonds for organising the competition again.

Recreation Ground-. Cllr Hodges thanked people who had donated plants and seeds to the wild flower project. She announced that a working party would take place on the recreation ground on Saturday 20th October. Volunteers should meet at the pavilion at 9.00am. The fence by the pavilion had been damaged. It was agreed to decide how it should be replaced at the next parish council meeting An application for funding for the renewal of the play area safety surface had been made to the city council's Capital Grant scheme. An application would be made to Viridor for funding as soon as all the required documentation had been obtained.

<u>Volunteers for the recreation ground</u> – Cllr Hodges would be setting up a task force of volunteers to work on the recreation ground. She would welcome offers of help from anyone who was able to give some time to this on a regular basis. Cllr Hill thanked Cllr Hodges for her work on the wild flower project

<u>Overhanging branches</u> It was agreed that in future a letter would be sent by the parish council to residents who failed to cut back overhanging branches which impeded pedestrians, asking them to remove the branches. It was pointed out that if Kent Highway Services had to cut back overhanging trees from private property they charged the householder for the work.

<u>Audit of Parish Accounts 2011/12</u> – Councillors noted that the Audit Commission had completed the audit of the parish accounts without qualification

<u>Resignation of Cllr Simon Cook –</u> Cllr Hill thanked Cllr Cook for his work as parish councillor.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 11th.October at 7.30 pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.


