

to Daisy the Maid after the tragic turn of events in a recent episode, where one of Earl Grantham's daughters dies in childbirth. True to character, Mr Carson coolly and swiftly exits as stiffly and abruptly as his words of advice! Meanwhile, poor bereaved Daisy is left to whimper, clad only in her nightdress in the half-light of the servant's quarters. Thank heavens for Mrs Hughes, viewers might well say, as the housekeeper scoops a shivering, bereaved Daisy into her arms holding her tight as they shed a tear together. Her hug says, Daisy you are not alone in this grief, together we'll walk the difficult road ahead. I am with you.

"Carry on Daisy. As we all must..." in themselves good words of advice for Daisy because life does go on, but Mr Carson forgets that words alone do not always suffice – words on their own can be quite cold – action, in the form of Mrs Hughes' comforting hug, is needed to enable Daisy to "Carry on...".

Perhaps this gives us an opportunity to reflect on our own actions or the actions of those around us? Sometimes we say we love people but our actions fail to show this to the full – sometimes we or someone we know might be a bit like Mr Carson – carrying a warm heart in a cool, constrained exterior, which occasionally breaks like the dawn to reveal a soft heart underneath. So how can we be more loving not just in what we say, but in what we do? How can we look beneath another person's cool exterior to the warmth beneath? How can we be more like Mrs Hughes and bring a soft heart to warm our words, which are cold on their own? Who do we know who needs the warmth of a hug or its equivalent from us? Or do we discover that we are Daisy, can we spot a Carson and Hughes on the horizon?

God tells us Jesus is the Word *made flesh* – not just the Word. In John's gospel, God promises us not just speech but action – God speaks to us *and* God lives with us because God knows that sometimes words are not enough...

Grant, O Lord, that what we say with our lips, we may believe in our hearts, and what we believe in our hearts, we may show forth in our lives. Amen. God bless you, Julia

It's been a difficult month for some of our members with illness and mishaps galore! But, hopefully they will all be on the mend soon. We are sorry that we have lost Alf Gardner from Aylesham who passed away recently. Our thoughts are with his family. Our recent Coffee Morning has raised just over £250 in aid of the Poppy Appeal. Thanks to all who donated cakes and raffle prizes and those who helped on the day. Our Remembrance Service - which takes place on Sunday, 11th November - will be at Wickhambreaux Church this year. We assemble by the war memorial at 10.45am. Our branch AGM will be on Tues, 13th November at 8pm at the Recreation Club, Littlebourne and we look forward to seeing as many members as possible at that meeting. Annual branch subscriptions (£15) are now due.

Bekesbourne Choir Vestry Project

Building work is now progressing on the installation of a composting toilet and storage cupboards in the former choir vestry at the back of Bekesbourne Church. We expect it to be completed sometime in November, provided we don't encounter any more set-backs!

As is always the case when undertaking work on old buildings, we have come up against what the architect describes as 'challenges'. Extensive damp and some rot was found under the floor boards, which has involved new floor timbers and dampproof courses, which we had not anticipated. However, it does mean that the project will have identified and cured some long-standing problems at this end of the church. As a preventative measure for the future, ventilation pipes have been inserted below the newly-laid floors and will be capped with grilles externally in shallow trenches, which have been dug outside the tower. It is planned to extend these trenches ourselves in due course, digging the soil away from the tower walls to below floor level, to further combat the damp.

While the contractor is on site, he will also carry out maintenance to the church roof, identified in the architect's last five-yearly inspection of St Peter's.

A service of thanksgiving for the project will take place in the spring. Jane Millyard



If your pets phobia is unmanageable they may benefit from some stress relieving treatment. Choirbook for the Queen

During the wonderful celebrations of Her Majesty The Queen's Diamond Jubilee a project to celebrate her sixty years as Queen has been quietly unfolding in Cathedrals, Churches and Chapels across the Country.

www.choirbookforthequeen.org.uk contains 44 anthems written in the last decade. 11 anthems were specially commissioned from leading British composers and are being premiered across the country. Many have been heard on BBC Radio 3's Choral Evensong. The final anthem to be premiered (BBC Radio 3 Choral Evensong on 5th December 2012 from Westminster Abbey) is called 'Advent Calendar'. It is composed by Sir Peter Maxwell Davies and based on a poem by Rowan Williams, who steps down as Archbishop of Canterbury in the New Year. Universally acknowledged as one of the foremost composers of our time. Sir Peter Maxwell Davies has made a significant contribution to musical history through his wideranging and prolific output. He lives in the Orkney Islands where he writes most of his music. Maxwell Davies' huge output of work includes operas, two ballets, musictheatre works, eight symphonies and numerous concerti, light orchestral works and large-scale works for chorus. Maxwell Davies has guest-conducted international orchestras at the highest level and retains close links with the St. Magnus Festival, which he founded in 1977. He was knighted in 1987 and appointed Master of The Queen's Music in 2004.

Recreation Ground-. The annual safety inspection report on the children's play area had been received from Digley Associates and no significant safety issues had been raised. Little further progress could be made with the Neighbourhood Plan until the City Council had produced its Core Strategy document. Efforts continued to arrange a meeting with Adrian Verrall at the Canterbury City Council.</u>


