Emmanuel, God with us, is the centre of the Christmas message. As a church community we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, born as God yet in human form to a virgin. What seems a simple story of birth becomes an extraordinary life changing revelation in the message that God so loves each one of us and our world that he sends his Son to reconcile humanity to himself. In celebration of this love so generously and freely given to humanity, it seems strange that we celebrate in a way that can be so subverted by human excess and guilt. Each year I try really hard not to be drawn in by the commercialism and the frantic pace that is generated by the festive period. Christmas Day holiday is after all the 'Holy Day' when we stop and celebrate Christ's birthday. If you are like me it has become a point of near exhaustion from rush to make the 25th December the 'perfect day'.

There is a story of a king being woken in the night from a loud noise above his bed. The king shouts out 'Who is there'? The king's jester replies 'It's me looking for a camel.' The king shouts back 'Camels on the roof, camels on the roof? You fool why are you looking for a camel on the roof of the palace?' The jester replies 'You fool! Why are you looking for God in a golden bed dressed in gold?' If we want to find God this Christmas my guess is that he will not be found in the pre-Christmas commercial induced exhaustion. On Christmas Eve or Christmas Day as Christian communities gather together in church we celebrate Emmanuel, God with us. It's even free!

As we celebrate Christmas and the coming New Year may I take this opportunity to wish you every blessing and Christ's peace.

Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 8th November 2012

Budget & Precept requirement: The precept and the budget requirements for 2013/14 were agreed. The required precept level would be 0.07% higher than the previous year.

Revision of Financial Regulations; The Finance Committee had reviewed the Internal Audit arrangements and had not recommended any changes. Changes to Financial Regulations recommended by the Internal Auditor were agreed. These included raising the level above which three quotations for work should be obtained from £1,000 to £3,000.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> — Mr Joe Connor reported on a constructive meeting between three members of Bridge Neighbourhood Plan Committee and Adrian Verrall of CCC, in charge of drawing up the Local District Plan. It had been suggested that Bridge should put forward a small number of proposals for inclusion in the Plan, based on data from the questionnaires. It was important that the Neighbourhood Plan Committee should consider other issues apart from housing. Another meeting of the Committee would be held before Christmas with the aim of putting further proposals to the parish council in January.

<u>Recreation Ground</u>. Cllr Terry Wilmshurst had again repaired the tiles on the pavilion roof. All spare tiles had now been used up. One of the picnic tables had been smashed. It was agreed to move the remaining picnic table into the pavilion for the winter. Cllr John Hill thanked Cllrs Corfield and Wilmshurst for installing the new swings. It had been found that one of the shackle pins needed to be replaced. Cllr John Corfield would supply the details to Wicksteed so that a replacement could be ordered.

Quotes to replace the hinges on the sand bag store and to replace the wire /fencing between Riverside Close and the pavilion and raise its height were accepted.

Cllr Sue Hodges thanked the volunteers who had joined the working party on the recreation ground on 20th. October. She also thanked those who had donated plants and seeds and the volunteers who had signed up to work throughout the year on the recreation ground. Cllr Hodges reported that Bridge School Eco Club had planted narcissi on the riverbank and she thanked the school for their help.

It was reported that the football pitch had been severely damaged by a team playing in very wet conditions the previous Sunday. As a result the grounds contractor had taken emergency action to repair some of the damage but the pitch would be unfit for matches until December.

<u>Snow and ice removal from pavements –</u> Cllr Bill Oakey would compile a list of volunteers who would be willing to help to clear ice and snow from the street when required. Volunteers were asked to contact Cllr Oakey.

<u>Bus shelter seat</u> – It was agreed to accept the quotation for a new seat for the bus shelter near the pharmacy.

<u>Recreation Ground Maintenance Contract 2013/14</u> It was agreed to award the contract for grounds maintenance to AJ Garden Services again. The price of the contract would be raised by 5% but this would be held for two years. Councillors praised Mr Longley for his good work and his helpful approach

<u>Christmas trees</u> –. The Christmas trees will go up on Saturday December 1st and be taken down on Saturday 5th. January. All volunteers will be very welcome to help. Please meet at the village hall._

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 13th.December at the earlier time of **6.15 pm** in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at **6.00pm**. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.
