Easter Celebration - New Life in Christ

This Easter Eve at Bekesbourne we are re-introducing a traditional Easter Service in the Benefice with a service of Light and Holy Communion, Julia has written a short introduction to this service in this edition of the magazine. It is good to remind ourselves what we celebrate at Easter, light overcoming darkness, through Jesus' resurrection.

Central to all four gospels (good news stories) in the bible is the life and teaching of Jesus. Following his death, it is the first meetings between Jesus' followers with the risen Christ that transforms the preceding gospel stories. They take on a new sense and meaning that can only be realised after Easter, for Jesus' identity and good news is fully revealed in his resurrection.

For some people Jesus is a historical figure, a good person, with moral ideas. The next step on from this 'thoroughly decent chap' comes through faith in recognising his divinity, supremely identified through the first Easter. The risen Jesus gives us hope that death has been overcome and after our own deaths we can share in new life in all its fullness with God. This new life is the ultimate born again experience and is freely available to those who would believe. Even Thomas a disciple with first hand personal experience of Jesus struggled to believe in the risen Christ. We as post modern twenty first century science aware people struggle. It's natural. It's the reality of our humanity. However, something reaches beyond our struggling rationality to express the reality of God's love for us as we struggle with the concept of resurrection. To believe without question, without struggling is to believe without thinking, without engaging with the gospel message.

If to celebrate, to partake or even consider Easter is for you a struggle, fine you are fully human, but a human being who God loves so much that he sent his Son to reconnect with humanity. In faith on occasion with more questions than answers, in faith we gather to proclaim at Easter with the world wide Christian community, rejoicing "Alleluia Christ is Risen – He is risen indeed Alleluia" Yours

#### Easter Eve Service of Light and Holy Communion

New this Easter to St Peter's Bekesbourne is the Service of Light with Holy Communion on Easter Saturday night starting after sunset at 8pm. But what's it all about? Well in brief – here goes!...there'll be a bonfire outside...then lighting of candles...music...readings...renewing our baptism vows ... experiencing new life in Christ....passing from darkness to light .....and sharing the Easter communion.

And here's the longer answer....from earliest times Christians have gathered through the night of Easter to recall the story of God's saving work, from creation through to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and to experience new life and hope with the celebration of Jesus' rising from the dead.

Early Christian worship on Easter Saturday happened after dark so candles were lit and over time this ceremony was eventually understood as symbolizing the return of the light of Christ and the beginning of the Easter celebration. So our worship will begin with the lighting of a new fire (a bonfire) from which the Easter candle is lit and then processed into church proclaiming the return of the light of Christ into the world. As the service progresses the light is spread to illuminate the whole church as we each hold a lighted candle and we have the opportunity to renew our baptism vows. The history of our salvation in the scriptures is heard as we reflect on our own journeys of faith leading up to the climax of the Easter proclamation, which is proclaimed with all the joy and splendour we can muster! The service then enters its final stage with our Easter holy communion.

It's a wonderful and atmospheric way to end the emptiness of Easter Saturday, to feel the full force of Christ's light and resurrection glory entering the world afresh – all are welcome - come and join us!

#### Bekesbourne Church—We're getting there!

It is some time since I gave a progress report on how we are getting on with our project to re-order the choir vestry at the rear of Bekesbourne Church. The plan is to build a cubicle on one side of the vestry, where we will install a toilet, and tidy up the other side by installing purpose-built cupboards in British Columbian pine and a worktop. At the same time, the worm-eaten infill to the screen at the rear of the nave will be renewed, but painted the same colour. The whole project is estimated to cost nearly £36,000.

The aim of the PCC is to raise most of the money from grants and this has progressed steadily, although it has not proved as easy as it has been for projects in the past. Thanks to a pump-priming donation from the Friends of Bekesbourne Church and a small contribution from church funds, our total of funding available or pledged has reached over £26,000. The PCC is most grateful to the following: Viridor Credits, Marshalls Charity, Bekesbourne Parish Council, Garfield Weston Foundation, Allchurches Trust, Kent County Council, the Archbishop's Charitable Trust and a small number of well-wishers who have made voluntary donations. We are waiting for the results of several more grant applications and if these are unsuccessful, we may decide to scale down the project slightly. A contractor has already been lined up for the work and we would like to be able to engage him to start in the autumn.

#### Bourne Vets News

Did you know that the Pet Passport rules all changed in January?

It is now much easier and cheaper to travel abroad with your pets. The UK has been able to harmonise its pet movement rules with the rest of the European Union because of the vastly improved rabies vaccines and treatments. Forcing pets to spend six months in quarantine, a practice dating from the 1800's, is fortunately no longer necessary due to huge scientific advances.

All pets wishing to travel will still need to be vaccinated against rabies but pets from the EU and listed non-EU countries such as the USA and Australia will no longer need a blood test and will only have to wait 21 days before they travel. Pets from unlisted non-EU countries such as India, Brazil and South Africa will be able to enter the UK if they meet certain strict criteria to ensure they are protected against rabies, including a blood test and a three-month wait before they enter the UK. These changes will still ensure that the risk of rabies coming to the UK remains extremely low whilst making it easier and cheaper for people to take their pets abroad.

Tick treatment is now no longer required for pets returning to the UK, although we would still recommend the use of treatments to control ticks as part of good animal health practice.

You do still need to treat your pet for tapeworms between 1 and 5 days before returning to the UK to continue to protect the public from the risk of serious exotic tapeworm infections.

So if you wish to take your pet abroad to an EU country they still need to be microchipped, vaccinated against Rabies, have a passport, wait 21 days post vaccine before they return to the UK and be treated for tapeworm 1-5 days before they return but they no longer have to wait 6 months for a blood test or have tick treatment which is a huge improvement.

Pets coming from unlisted non-EU countries will no longer need to be quarantined if they have been microchipped, vaccinated against rabies, had a blood test at least 30 days after the rabies vaccine and waited 3 months after the blood test before entering the country.

#### Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 8th. March 2012

<u>Affordable Housing</u> – The new properties would be handed over by Jenners to Southern Housing Group on 19th March. The successful new tenants had been informed. Cllrs John Hill and Sue Hodges would go to Bridge Primary School to accept items for the Time Capsule and the parish council would be happy to receive suggestions for other items to be placed in the capsule.

<u>Mill Centre-</u> Mark Esdale reported that the Mill Centre Management Committee was meeting fortnightly to try to resolve the problem of a future base for youth activities. A meeting with the primary school had been arranged for 23rd March to discuss a possible new building in the school grounds but there were many issues to be resolved. It was not clear who would own, use or fund the building. There were many organisations, not just Scouts and Guides who wanted to use the Centre. It was

thought that any building supplied by Cantley Estates as a *quid pro quo* for a large housing development in Bridge would not be suitable for the needs of the youth groups and the Mill Centre Management Committee rejected that idea. If no workable alternative could be found it was planned to mount a major campaign to save the Mill Centre at the end of the school term.\_

**Recreation ground-** Cllr Brigitte Ward reported that the guttering had been pulled down from the pavilion again and yellow paint had been sprayed over the newly painted sand bag store. It was thought that using anti climb paint on the guttering might make it difficult to repair. It was agreed that the Recreation Ground Committee should discuss the repairs to the pavilion with Mervyn Gulvin, Chairman of BVST\_It was also agreed that ClIr Sue Hodges should buy an oak tree to be planted on the recreation ground to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The parish council would provide a suitable plaque.

<u>Queen's Diamond Jubilee Celebrations</u>- Cllr Alan Atkinson reported on the progress of the plans for the celebrations, which were going well. In future the minutes of the regular Diamond Jubilee Committee meetings would be circulated to parish councillors. A flyer giving information about the celebrations and enabling residents who wished to do so to order commemorative coins for their children would be included with the Parish Council Spring Newsletter.

<u>Methodist Chapel</u> – It had been reported that the matter of the disposal of the Methodist Chapel had been passed to the Property Department of the Methodist Church for a decision. It was agreed to approach that body again to remind them of the parish council's interest in obtaining the building for community use.

**Bridge in Bloom competition** – The parish council agreed to support the competition again this year. Cllr Ann Edmonds announced that this year there would be extra marks for plants that attract insects. Further details would be placed in 'On the Nail' and the Parish Spring Newsletter.

**Litter at The Butts** – There had been complaints about an increase in litter at the Butts and the old railway line. It was agreed to write to the manager of Mansfield Farms to ask him to arrange for his workers to clear up the sites. Cllr Hill thanked Selwyn Lewis for continuing to pick up litter around the village.

**<u>High Street planters</u>** – Mr Possee, who had cared for the planters in the High Street for many years, would be retiring in the summer. It was agreed to write to thank Mr Possee and also to try and find volunteers to take over his duties. The parish council could arrange reimbursement for the costs plants and other materials used.

**Spring Newsletter** – It was agreed to produce a Spring Newsletter under the direction of Cllr John Corfield and several items were agreed for inclusion. The deadline for copy would be 1st April.

**Letter of thanks to Kent Highway Services** – Cllr Hodges reported that Kent Highways Agency had completed the re-surfacing and repainting of the white lines at the junction of Higham Lane and Bridge Hill. It was agreed to write to thank KHS for carrying out this work

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 12th.April at 7.30 pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.
