s letter with a note of thanks to all those involved in the Benefice who worked so hard in preparing our churches for the Easter Celebration. It is easy to take for granted the time and effort taken in cleaning, flower arranging, photocopying, the preparation and rehearsal of music and this Easter for the first time bonfire building! In whatever way you may have been involved in preparing for the Easter festival thank you.

Easter is now past and two feast days, the first of Christ's Ascension and secondly Pentecost is fast approaching. When you look back at the gospel stories of Christ's ministry, after Jesus performs a particular miracle or healing he is seen going to a quiet place to pray with the disciples.

This year in the nine days between Ascension Day and Pentecost (Friday 18th May – Saturday 26th May), Bishop Trevor is offering each one of us an invitation to wait.....and pray for renewal in the gift of hospitality. The disciples who watched Jesus ascend, waited and prayed together. By waiting and praying together they were ready for what God wanted them to do next. So what are we invited to do? Our invitation to the Nine Days of Prayer is to wait. Our invitation to the Nine Days of Prayer is to share in prayer together, in confidence that we serve a risen and ascended Saviour. He invites us to wait together for the Holy Spirit, a gift beyond imagination.

The particular gift of the Holy Spirit we are praying for across the Diocese is to be renewed is the gift of hospitality. This gift characterizes our relationship with God. Hospitality is how we receive from and give to God, and to one another. Using nine stories of 'hospitality' from the Bible, resources including personal Pocket Prayers, and service sheets called 'Daily Waiting' are available to help individuals, groups and church communities see different facets of the way God gives himself to us, and invite us to be agents of transformation.

Please use these days to pray - however and whenever - alone and with others. Along with the Pocket Prayers and Daily Waiting, there is a twitter link, and worship service ideas and resources for children and young people's groups, available at: www.canterburydiocese.org/247liveit/novena2012

Bekesbourne Explorers

If you enjoy walking in the East Kent countryside, you might like join our exploring group which gets together once a month to follow paths and byways in places we haven't been before. For instance, in April we explored the lovely hidden valleys around Sheldwich, near Faversham.

<u>Queen's Diamond Jubilee Celebrations-</u> The commemorative coins were being ordered. Bridge Post Office staff had kindly offered to help with their distribution. The bonfire would form part of the national chain of beacons and would be lit on Monday evening 4th. June at a time to be advised by the national organising committee. Access to the Star Hill bonfire site would be via the entrance opposite Higham Park and the gate and stile in Bourne Park Road.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> The first meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Committee, which represents various village groups, had been addressed by Adrian Verrall of the City Council's Planning Dept. Local residents would be asked for their views on the proposals being put forward in city council's Local Plan, which was in preparation and, once adopted, would cover the next 20 years. It was important that Bridge had an input into where additional housing should be and where green spaces should be kept. There would be a report on this at the Annual Parish Meeting on 3rd May and it was hoped that Bridge residents would make their views known at that meeting and by writing or emailing the Neighbourhood Plan Committee initially via the Parish Clerk.

<u>Report on Flood Risk in Bridge</u> – Mervyn Gulvin presented maps and supporting documents concerning the flood risk to properties within Bridge. These had been compiled because some residents had had difficulty in obtaining household insurance because of the perceived flood risk in Bridge. It was agreed to put the maps on the village website and also to make them available at the Annual Parish Meeting so that any inaccuracies could be corrected.

<u>Mill Centre-</u> A potential site for a replacement for the Mill Centre had been agreed at Bridge Primary School. An indicative plan had been drawn up with costing. This would be discussed by the school governors in the first instance, later in the month. <u>Recreation Ground –</u> Arrangements were being made to remove the broken roller and sell it for scrap. The repairs to the guttering were in hand. It was not known who had been responsible for painting the wall of the sandbag store and the pavilion doors. There was discussion about the wet pour on the children's play area, which was in need of attention. It was agreed this should be an agenda item at the next parish council meeting. A decision needed to be taken about replacing the entire play surface, which would have considerable cost implications.

<u>Affordable Housing</u> – The event to bury the time capsule would take place on Tuesday 1st May at the site. There would be a reception for invited guests in the Mill Centre, organised by Southern Housing Group, following the event. A group of children from Bridge Primary School would be invited to attend.

<u>Tennis Club Proposals to extend their fencing and make an outside seating area.</u> – Councillors did not object to this proposal. Cllr Alan Atkinson suggested that paving should be used instead of gravel because of the likelihood of small stones being washed away in any flood and also the problem of disabled access over gravel. Cantley Estates had written to the Clerk to say they did not object to the proposals. <u>Village Diary</u> – It was decided to reinstate the Village Diary, which would be kept in a suitable public venue so that bookings for village events could be recorded in it. The purpose would be to prevent conflicting dates of local events and it would be the responsibility of those organisations making the bookings to record the dates in the diary. The possibility of using the village website for the same purpose was being investigated.

<u>Parish Reserves</u> – The council approved the current parish reserves. It was agreed to allocate £5,000 from the general reserve to the Neighbourhood Plan costs.

<u>Recreation Ground Working Party –</u> Cllr Sue Hodges reminded councillors that there would be a working party on the recreation ground on Saturday 21st April. All volunteers were very welcome and should assemble from 9.00am onwards with gardening equipment.

<u>Village litter pick</u> – Cllr John Hill thanked Cllr Brigitte Ward and her volunteers who had carried out a village litter pick in Bridge on Saturday 17th March.

The **Annual Parish Meeting** will be held in the village hall on Thursday 3rd May at 7.30pm.The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 12th.May at 7.30 pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.
