Union jacks, street parties, the big lunch, tons of pageantry, handshaking, an array of hats, the derby, beacon lighting, the sense of this only happening once in our lifetime and a spirit of pride sweeping the nation; these might be the things which automatically spring to mind this month when we celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, having rummaged in the deepest corners of our wardrobes to find something to wear which is red, white or blue. And rightly so...I can confess that I have already purchased some union jack cupcake cases and dusted off my union jack bandana in preparation for the celebrations!

But scratching the surface we might also discover: wisdom, steadfastness, long service and faithful Christian witness as undergirding contributions that HRH Elizabeth II has made in her 60 year reign so far, as well as being a monarch who has not been ashamed to value the gifts, which all faith communities bring to this country and the fabric of its communities and society, not just the Church of England of which she is Head; she is a fearlessly loyal Anglican in the public eye – for our forthright Fidei Defensor we give God hearty thanks.

From a Christian point of view, we can look to her to see a glimpse of how Christ might show us how to run the race with steadfast faith, endurance and perseverance through decades of change, challenges and celebration. We can admire her loyal service to this country and see in it snatches of what Christ meant that we love one another as He loves us. We could also in her 60 year reign and 86 years see a sliver of God's wisdom reflected in the depths of the experiences she has accrued and give thanks for this wisdom available to countless prime ministers in their decision making.

For all that has been good in HRH Elizabeth II's reign we thank God at this time of Jubilee and we also take time in looking at her reign to remember Christ's reign on earth and in heaven, which is eternal. Christ's kingdom and kingship go beyond the boundaries of our imagination, go beyond the constraints and inadequacies of human monarchs - his service is an outpouring of his very self, his faith is perfect, his wisdom is far beyond all telling and knowledge of him is perfect peace. Amen.



#### **Bourn Vets News**

Hairballs can be rather a revolting problem for cat owners! Once you've had to clean up a hairball you'll understand what I mean or even worse if you've trodden on one barefoot!

Cats are very efficient groomers as they have tiny hooks on their rough tongues that remove loose and dead hair. This removed hair is then often swallowed. Most of the swallowed hair from grooming will pass through your cat and out the other end without you being any the wiser but occasionally some hair may remain in the stomach or small intestines and develop into a hairball. This is more common in long haired breeds of cat such as Persians or Maine Coons.

Cats will gag and retch in an attempt to remove a hairball and this can sound really horrible and alarming if you are unsure what is happening.

Normally, affected cats will cough, gag and retch after eating and then produce a cylindrical, cigar-shaped hairball for you! Once they have brought up the hairball they will feel much better. Occasionally though, they can cause more serious problems and block the intestines and in these cases surgery is sometimes required to remove the hairball.

Signs to look out for if you think your cat might be suffering from hairballs are coughing after eating, loss of appetite, depression, lethargy and constipation. If you are concerned it may be worth getting your vet to examine your cat for you.

The best way of preventing hairballs is with regular grooming. Most cats love being groomed and it's a fun way to bond with your cat. You can also give a special 'hairball formula' cat food to help hairballs pass safely through. At Bourne Veterinary Practice we use the Royal Canin Hairball Diet which is specifically formulated for long haired cats and cats that overgroom and are prone to getting hairballs. CANTERBURY CHORAL SOCIETY, CANTERBURY CATHEDRAL SATURDAY 23RD JUNE 2012 9.30pm RACHMANINOV Vespers Canterbury Choral Society will be bringing a magical event to the Cathedral when they perform Rachmaninov Vespers (All-Night Vigil) in Russian. A thousand years ago music consisted of single melodic lines which took the form of Georgian Chant and in Eastern Europe variant of Byzantine chants. This style of music depended upon its survival on the creation of musical notation and this fell to the Monks who were the scholarly class of the age. A simple notation was used with arrows pointing up and down whilst in Western Europe a variety of symbols appeared. One particular influence on the growth of Russian music was that the Orthodox Church forbade the use of instruments in the liturgy with the exception of bells. This discouraged the development of more complex forms and as a result the monks used a simpler style in which voices sang the same words in the same rhythms to differing notes. #### **Election of Chairman & Vice Chairman**

Cllr John Hill was nominated as Chairman by Cllr Terry Wilmshurst, seconded by Cllr Ann Edmonds and re-elected unanimously

Cllr Sue Hodges was nominated as Vice Chairman by Cllr Brigitte Ward, seconded by Cllr John Corfield and elected unanimously

#### Areas of responsibility to Committees and Outside Bodies

Councillors' new responsibilities were agreed. The Affordable Housing Committee was dissolved

**Neighbourhood Plan** – Mr Joe Connor, Chairman of the Committee, reported that the village questionnaire had been drawn up and would be distributed and collected from every household in the parish in the next few weeks. Several volunteers had offered to help with this and parish councillors were also asked for their help. After the deadline for collection, boxes would be available at various points in the village for those whose questionnaires had not been collected at the door. It was suggested that collectors be given slips to leave at houses where they had failed to collect the questionnaire, advising occupants to return their questionnaires via the boxes. The results of the questionnaire would be collated during June.

<u>Diamond Jubilee</u> — Cllr Alan Atkinson reported that the Jubilee beacon would be lit at 10.15pm on Monday 4th June on Star Hill. Plans for the Street Party on Sunday 3rd June on the recreation ground from 12 noon to 4.00pm were going well. Any further offers of help would be welcome. Cllr Hill thanked the Diamond Jubilee Committee for their hard work and hoped that residents would support the event

**Bus shelter seat**. It was agreed to ask a local carpenter to look at the possibility of lowering the existing bar to make a 'perch' for people waiting for the bus, since the search for suitable pop-up seats had so far been unsuccessful and would probably be an expensive option.

**Methodist Chapel**- Cllr Hill reported that the Estate Agents, Angela Hirst, were currently handling the sale of the chapel. The parish council had indicated its interest. The Agents were aware of Local Listing and that National Listing was pending.\_


