

July 11th is the date in the church calendar when we remember St Benedict of Nursia, Abbot of Monte Cassino and Father of Western Monasticism.

The idea of monasticism may seem completely alien to our modern daily living. Early Christian monasticism originated in the Middle East from the desert fathers and mothers who flourished particularly in the 3rd Century. They lived a pilgrimage of self-discovery about themselves in relationship with God and the world and people around about them. From their writing and wisdom a message comes of learning to live and be honest about yourself in relation to God. This is the life long journey that these people undertook. In looking on themselves and the world around about them they recognised quickly that it was unhelpful and damaging to all to fall into the temptation to look at others and find fault. Accepting and struggling with their humanity, how God wanted them to be in there ordinary and extraordinariness was central to their lives. In doing this, as monastic communities do today, brings about a closeness and appreciation of humanity. Last Autumn I had the joy of driving with a good friend Route 66 in America. A trip I had thought about undertaking for many years. As part of the journey I took a diversion off the route to visit the Abbey of Gethsemane in Kentucky. The abbey was home to Thomas Merton (1915-1968) a monk and spiritual writer. The religious community he was part of is still flourishing and coupled with a road trip was a spiritual pilgrimage in itself (not to mention the bourbon whiskey distilleries). Any pilgrimage is not so much the final destination as the journey and the meeting of people and process of self-discovery this nurtures.

What I found on my trip and plenty of others have found on their pilgrimages is how we are all so interconnected / reliant upon each other and the world around us. When I look at another and do not understand their culture or life style it should force me to relook at my own understanding of self and my relationship with God through Christ rather than immediately saying you are wrong because you are not like me or this is how we have always done it so change must be wrong.

Consequently it is with sadness that I look upon my own church as it struggles with women's ministry (Women Bishops) and same sex marriage. I'm neither a women nor gay, so how can I be suitably qualified to speak for another's experience which is not my own. Rather it is a call to engage non-judgementally, as someone who fails continually, to learn about myself and those who live around about me in community. Through love we should hope to grow from hearing other people's stories and in them come closer to God. We live

lives of pilgrimage if we seek to learn about ourselves and the people who live around us through the love of Christ. I will strive to model a church which allows a safe place for all people to enter upon such a journey, knowing my own brokenness and celebrating the supremacy of Christ' love. Yours in Christ. 

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> – Joe Connor, Chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan Committee, reported that 335 questionnaires had been returned out of 705 distributed. The data was being processed and it was intended that the Neighbourhood Plan would be completed by August in time to present to the City Council before the end of that month. It was agreed that a special meeting of the Parish Council would be held in August to consider the Neighbourhood Plan when it had been completed.

List of Assets of Community Value – The Parish Council drew up a list of assets of value to the community, which would form part of the Neighbourhood Plan. The list would be lodged with the Development Management Department of the City Council. Under the Localism Act, the Parish Council would have a right to bid for a designated community asset and would have six months to prepare a bid to buy it before an asset could be sold.

<u>Mill Centre</u> – Cllr Simon Cook reported that the proposal to build a new facility in the school was no longer viable. Funding conditions would have meant that the school would have had to donate the land to the Parish Council and the school governors had not considered this acceptable. A report on the future of the Centre would be presented to Canterbury City Council Executive on Thursday 21st June. It would outline three alternatives; a. to extend the lease for a further two years, b. to secure vacant possession of the site in September c. to transfer the Centre to the community. Cllr Hill would speak on behalf of the Parish Council at the Executive meeting.

It was pointed out that the main halls were in good condition but the kitchen and smaller rooms needed renovation. The estimated of cost of this was £200,000. None of this would be a cost to the City Council as, provided a 25 years + lease could be secured, grants would be available.

Diamond Jubilee – – Cllr John Hill thanked the Diamond Jubilee Committee for their hard work in producing a superb celebration for the village, both on the Sunday at the recreation ground and at the Monday bonfire and fireworks. Cllr Alan Atkinson also thanked all the helpers who had made the celebrations a success. He announced that there were still some Jubilee coins available for purchase. They would be on sale at the village fete.

<u>Methodist Chapel</u>- It was reported that the Methodist chapel had been sold. The parish council's bid to buy it had been unsuccessful_

<u>**Recreation Ground**</u> –. The guttering round the pavilion had again been damaged and there had been some damage to the plants near the pavilion. Anti climb paint had been put on the roof of the sand bag store to try to prevent more damage to the pavilion guttering. The fencing by Riverside Close had been damaged. Cllr Sue Hodges thanked the volunteers who had planted the Jubilee oak and had helped with the planting on 23^{rd} . April. Cllr Bill Oakey and Mervyn Gulvin had taken sacks of rubbish from the pavilion to the local tip after the Jubilee celebrations.

Request for double yellow lines at junction of Patrixbourne Rd and Riverside <u>**Close-**</u> It was considered that asking the City Council to agree to the use of double yellow lines would serve no purpose, as they would not be enforced. The Parish Council requested Cllr Cook to ask the City Council for more frequent visits by parking attendants to enforce existing parking restrictions in Bridge.

Summer football training for Bridge FC- It was agreed to refuse a request from Bridge Football Club to begin training on the recreation ground in mid-July rather than after 1st August, as stated in their contract. This was because of undertakings given to residents living next to the ground who had previously complained about disruption during the summer months.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 12th.July at 7.30 pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings._




