





Recently on BBC 4, whilst channel flicking, I stumbled upon a fascinating documentary presented by Julia Bradbury called Icelandic Walk. Julia was filmed hiking a 60km trail to reach the huge volcanic crater at the centre of the Evjafjallajökull glacier in Iceland (affectionately and more pronounceable named..."the Big E"), whose ash cloud brought aeroplanes across Europe to a halt so memorably in 2010. In the programme, viewers were treated to a stunning series of vistas: steaming tundras of volcanic ash, soaring rocky peaks, freezing rushing rivers, clouds of sulphuric gas, hazy green meadows, treacherous ravines and swirls of snow and glacial ice. At one memorable point, Julia's guide Hanna, told her to peek down a crack in the rock beneath her feet. To her amazement, Julia discovered a deep glowing red fire, where the molten rock was swirling only a metre below the surface underneath them. There was a palpable sense of awe reflected in the presenter's face and voice – a sense of wonder at creation's power – an overwhelming joy. Sitting on the sofa at home, I longed to be there feeling the heat of the ground and watching the molten rock seethe beneath my feet; it was the kind of experience and discovery where one needed to be there but human limitations, of course, prevented me from doing so. But it reminded me that God, being unlimited, is there alongside that presenter out there in the rugged Icelandic landscape as well as in the domesticated comfort of my cosy lounge. Miraculously...simultaneously.

God holds us and the whole of the world, his creation, in the palm of his hand. Through Christ he bridges the gap between humanity and God to be fully human with us as well as fully divine – his flesh is the threshold where two worlds meet perfectly united and intertwined – in time and outside of it. He is both out there and close here – near and far. Sometimes we can domesticate God too much and put him on the sofa next to us all the time, at other times we hold him too much at arm's length in the Icelandic landscape, away from our experiences – to be admired and revered but from a distance. Where is God for you? On the sofa? Or untouchable in the distant scene? Or somewhere in between? Wherever God seems to be, may you be surprised by the vistas he opens up before your eyes.



e condition that can affect rabbits in the summer months when r. It is caused when flies lay their eggs on susceptible animals ut into maggots which start to feed on the poor rabbit. Usually its or nasty open wounds around your rabbits tail and bottom. It frantically grooming all the time in an attempt to get rid of the effeling so poorly that he is not eating and very quiet. If you find

quickly and it is important that you take the rabbit to your vet practice immediately as without rapid treatment affected rabbits can die.

To avoid fly strike happening to your rabbit it is important to make sure your rabbits environment is clean. The hutch should be regularly cleaned out and we recommend that during the summer months you inspect your rabbits bottom for cleanliness and any signs of fly eggs at least once a day, ideally twice a day as the eggs hatch within hours in warm weather. If your rabbits bottom is dirty you should seek veterinary advice as this can be a sign of underlying disease. It may be caused by inappropriate diet, dental disease, diarrhoea, urinary or genital problems, obesity or spinal problems such as arthritis and old age which mean the rabbit does not groom itself as well. If the dirty bottom can be treated then fly strike is less likely to occur.

There are also products available from veterinary surgeries which can be used to prevent or slow the progression of flystrike.

Canterbury Draft Local District Plan- There was a detailed discussion of the Canterbury Draft Local Plan. Councillors expressed concern about the plans to build 4,000 houses in South Canterbury and the effect this would have on Bridge and the AONB as a whole. It was agreed that the Chairman and Clerk would draft a response to the Draft Plan, which would be circulated to Councillors for comment.

Neighbourhood Plan - Mervyn Gulyin reported that two successful consultation events had been held in June; one in the village hall and one at the village fete. The aim had been to consult on the issues that the Neighbourhood Plan would cover. The completed questionnaires produced from those consultations were being analysed and a set of objectives would be formulated. It was reported that 'Locality' had agreed a grant of £6,640 towards the production costs of the Plan. These funds would be channelled via Parish Council accounts.

A draft Village Design Statement had been produced and would be circulated to Councillors. There would be a public consultation on the Village Design Statement towards the end of the summer, before it was submitted to the City Council.

The issue of car parking in Bridge needed to be addressed and an assessment of the current situation would be made.

Mill Centre- A Finance Committee meeting had been held. An application to demolish and rebuild the toilets and entrance area had been submitted to the City Council. A decision was awaited before funding could be sought. 'Locality' might be able to offer advice on funding for Community Asset Transfer. There had been no response from the City Council to the request to produce a valuation of the building.

Electoral Review of Canterbury Following a vote it was decided not to support the reduction in the numbers of City Councillors from 50 to 38. It was thought that a reduction in the Executive from 10 to 8 would mean that too few individuals would make decisions affecting the District. The Constituencies were already very large in the District and a reduction in Councillors could affect the level of local representation.

Recreation Ground Lease- A letter had been received from Savills, the agents for Cantley, owners of the recreation ground, refusing to extend the current recreation ground lease at present. It was agreed to acknowledge their reply and to express the hope that Cantley would work closely with the Parish Council in the future.

Nailbourne Pollution – Cllr Alan Atkinson reported that it was intended that three groups would be formulated to tackle the problem from different viewpoints; the existing LSNRMG, a Multi Agency group, which would oversee the remedial work and an Enforcement Group which would react promptly and robustly to future damaging flooding episodes. An Emergency Action Plan was being formulated which would tackle issues such as pollution, disruption, highway's verges etc. Southern Water were proposing to distribute 'FOG' funnels via which fat, oil and grease could be re-cycled, to discourage residents from tipping such substances into drains. It was yet to be determined how these products were to be collected and into drains. It was yet to be determined how these products were to be collected and

The water levels were still high in the village. Tankering was due to end the following week but the process of repairing leaks would be on-going and protractěd.

Recreation Ground – Cllr Brigitte Ward reported that she had, with the help of Cllr Burns-Stark, removed some of the graffiti from the sandbag store, pavilion, youth shelter and play area. Some mole traps had worked up to the surface of the recreation ground. There was a possibility of children tripping over them. It was explained that the mole problem was increasing and the only effective method of control was by traps. It was agreed that the next Newsletter would include an item asking parents to tell their children to keep away from any traps that had come to the surface. The pest controller was visiting the area more frequently and re-buried traps surface. The pest controller was visiting the area more frequently and re-buried traps where necessary. It was important to prevent the moles from invading the football pitch.

Bridge in Bloom – Cllr Edmonds reported that she was short-listing for the competition. Judging would take place at the end of July and Viv Brazier would assist her. Cllr Edmonds reported that the High Street planters were being tended by Vicky White, who was a Committee member of the Horticultural Society. Weeds in the High Street - A spraying programme by KCC was currently under way, although slightly behind schedule. Residents were asked to pull up any weeds outside their property to improve the appearance of the village. The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 12th.September at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.
