Business as usual...

Well, since the interregnum (period in-between vicars) has started, now seems like a good time to answer some of the frequently asked questions that have been floating about of late. But before I do – let me reassure you that as far as life in the Benefice goes – with services, baptisms, weddings and funerals etc. it's business as usual. Come and see!

Who's in charge now? In the interregnum, the church wardens are in charge of their individual churches with the Area Dean and the Archdeacon. The curate plays a pastoral role in supporting the churchwardens and is a point of pastoral contact across the Benefice. As far as services go — we are blessed to have the generous support of our usual team of lay and ordained ministers (including our saintly band of retired clergy) plus a little extra help.

How long will it take before we get a new vicar? At least 8 months from the end of Jan 2013. It takes a few months with liaison between all the churches to write up the parish profile (this highlights the sort of person we think God is calling to minister here and where God might be leading us as a benefice in the future), after which the post can be advertised. The period from the point of advertising to the new vicar arriving is roughly 5 months, if all goes without a hitch so that makes a total of 8 months <u>as a minimum</u> (any new vicar usually needs to give their existing parish 3 months' notice).

Will our new vicar live in the existing vicarage in Bridge and be full-time? Yes.

Why will the 'living' be suspended in Bridge temporarily? This is for legal reasons and administrative purposes only – it will not affect the day to day life, ministry and services here in the Benefice.

What can I do to help? Please pray for the churchwardens, lay ministers, curate, retired clergy helpers, Area Dean and Archdeacon as we journey on in the interregnum and form the parish profile – for wisdom and discernment. Please also pray for our new vicar for grace that he or she may hear God's invitation to serve in this Benefice!

So...what now?

A bit like the disciples after Jesus' ascension into heaven...staring a-gog into the sky ... we might feel a bit lost without our vicar....we might feel like lack lustre Christians singing: "sit up, sit up for Jesus" or "Take my life and let me be..." but sooner or later the Holy Spirit will revive us once again with Jesus' call to 'go out into the world and make disciples of all the nations' she will strengthen us as we journey on and outwards in mission. As Fr John McKenna reminds us, in his reflection on the 'Ascension', "The Christian is a missionary, one who will not sit at home, but will leave comfort and comfort zones with the love of God burning in their hearts. Disciples are made — by welcoming people into our hearts. Disciples are made — welcoming people into an embracing community."

May it be so with us all. God bless you, Julia

Bekesbourne Choir Vestry

We were also appreciating the successful completion of the choir vestry project at the back of the church. The composting toilet is a source of interest to the children and brings relief to all! The new cupboards and pine panelling round the cubicle have been beautifully crafted. Below the floors, rotting timbers have been replaced and damp proof course inserted, together with ventilation pipes to prevent further rot in this area.

The final cost of just over £35,000 has been met by generous grants from Viridor Landfill Tax, Marshall's Charity, the Allchurches Trust, the Garfield Weston Foundation, Kent County Council (via Michael Northey), Bekesbourne Parish Council, the Tory Family Foundation, the Beatrice Laing Trust, the Archbishop's Charitable Trust and a few well-wishers both local and further afield. The panelling to the screen was restored in memory of John Ash of Parsonage Farm. The project was pump-primed by a donation from the Friends of Bekesbourne Church and wouldn't have been possible without their help.

<u>Councillor Robert Moon</u> was welcomed as a newly elected member of the parish council and congratulated on his strong election performance.

<u>Snow & Ice Clearance</u> -Cllr Bill Oakey reported that he had had a good response to his call for volunteers to help with clearing snow and ice from the pavements. He would be meeting volunteers shortly. The parish council agreed to buy salt and any equipment that might be required.

<u>Recreation Ground</u> – The old George Pratt memorial bench was reported to be in a poor state. It was agreed to replace it with the new George Pratt memorial bench, which was presently situated by the lay by at the recreation ground. The spare parts for the larger swing bank had been received.

Cllr John Hill commented on the excellent job that had been done in installing the new brackets at the pavilion to try to protect the guttering from frequent vandalism. **Sycamore tree on recreation ground –** It was agreed to authorise the tree work proposed for the sycamore tree on the recreation ground, which had been recommended by the city council's Arboricultural Officer, i.e. reduce the height by 20% and inspect the cavities.

<u>Purchase of Plaque for Diamond Jubilee Tree-</u> Councillors decided not to opt for the more expensive brass plaque to commemorate the diamond jubilee oak tree because of the cost and the danger of metal theft. It was agreed to opt for a less expensive alternative made from an artificial material.

<u>Bridge Village Sign –</u> Cllr Hill reported that the village sign was in need of refurbishment. It was agreed to ask a local tradesman to do the restoration work <u>Twinning Sign</u> – Cllr Brigitte Ward showed councillors the design of the new Bridge signs which would indicate that Bridge was twinned with St Andre, which the approved. The signs would be paid by St Andre from EU funding.

<u>Christmas trees</u> – Cllr Hill thanked councillors and residents who had helped to erect a record number of Christmas trees in the High Street on 1st December. The trees would be taken down on 5th January and it was hoped that many residents would come and help to do this.

<u>Recreation ground fence</u> – Cllr Robert Moon reported that the new fence would be erected on the recreation ground by the pavilion in the first week of the New Year.

It was agreed to ask the Village Hall Management Committee to submit three quotations for wooden replacement frames

<u>Recreation Ground</u> – Cllr John Corfield reported that a hole was developing in the earth floor of the youth shelter. The Recreation Ground Committee would see what could be done to repair it._

Cllr Robert Moon was thanked for his work to repair and increase the height of the fence between the recreation ground and Riverside Close

A <u>Spring Working Party</u> would take place on the recreation ground on Saturday 6th April. Volunteers should assemble at the pavilion at 9.30am

<u>Little Stour & Nailbourne River Management Group</u> - Cllr Alan Atkinson drew councillors' attention to the report from the Environment Agency circulated by LSNRMG reporting that the Nailbourne level was rising and suggesting that there could again be problems with sewage contaminating the river. Residents should ensure that the river bed was not blocked by obstructions that could impede the river flow.

<u>Date of the Annual Parish Meeting</u> – The date of the Annual Parish Meeting will be Thursday 2nd May. It was agreed to invite Larissa Laing, the Head of the City Council's Environmental Services, to the meeting to talk about the new system of waste collection and recycling.

<u>Village Diary-</u> Cllr Ann Edmunds explained that there had been clashes of dates for some events in the village and a system was needed for societies to publicise their programmes for the year in a way that would be easily available to other groups. It was agreed that an electronic calendar on the village website would be the best solution. Cllr Corfield agreed to discuss this with Mark Esdale, who is jointly responsible for the village website.

<u>Dog waste bin for Brewery Lane</u> In view of the amount of dog mess in the area, it was agreed that the city council would be asked to provide a dog waste bin for Brewery Lane and locate it near the entrance to the water meadows.

<u>Street lamp in Mill Lane-</u> Cllr Moon reported that branches from trees outside the oil depot were obscuring the street lamp in Mill Lane. Kent Highway Services would be asked to cut them back.

<u>Fire hydrants-</u> The council decided not to take over responsibility for maintaining fire hydrants in the village from Kent Fire & Rescue Service

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 14th.February at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings._

Making a comeback ...

Have you ever been plagued by phone calls or letters from companies trying to get you to come back to them for a new tariff or deal once you have signed off? Energy and phone companies are pretty notorious at this aren't they? Well, Chris and I bought a case of wine online last year as a one-off for his ordination party and ever since we have been bombarded by letters, magazines and phone calls asking us to subscribe to a monthly case of wine. It's so bad that it has become a family joke when we hear post hit the doormat.

After reading the small print, we know that the first box was a bargain but that future boxes will incur hidden charges; what looks like a good deal on the surface is actually not cost effective and at any rate, we're going to be finishing off the large number of leftovers from the first case at his second ordination party this summer – we wouldn't be able to cope with an annual box, let alone a monthly one!

People often realise that coming back to former suppliers or companies doesn't always deliver the service or the hope that is advertised; disappointment almost always inevitably ensues. But coming back to God in Lent or at any time is different. God will never disappoint us. He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love (Joel 2:13). Ready to forgive us and help us start afresh, God waits patiently to throw his arms around us in love.

Traditionally, Lent is a time for repentance, for turning back to God – drawing closer and deeper in our relationship with him. In the Benefice, you are warmly invited to join us as we all try to come back to God in two obvious ways: firstly, through following our **Lent course "Guides not guards"** on Wednesday nights at Bridge School throughout Lent (7:30pm-9pm), which we hope will lead us deeper into the mystery of God. And finally, by worshipping with us on **Good Friday** as part of your Easter journey (2pm St Mary's, Patrixbourne) as we come back to God together at the foot of the cross – this service has made a comeback this year! The Good Friday service is stark, mysterious, sorrowful and beautiful at the same time and without the cross, our joy on Easter Sunday morning at the resurrection doesn't make sense. So this lent and Easter, why not joins us in coming back to God by sharing in the full journey of Easter, cross, resurrection and beyond?

Rosalie Stacey

Rosalie Stacey, who died suddenly at home in Patrixbourne last month, will be remembered by many as an organist in our local churches.

She first became organist at Womenswold, then Wickhambreaux and finally Aylesham, before replacing Grace Allen at Patrixbourne many years ago. She continued the tradition of the Patrixbourne Carol Service, and the sizeable choir she recruited seemed to enjoy coming as they always answered her summons each year.

When Bekesbourne also came to need an organist, she combined this with her duties at Patrixbourne. This continued until she began to find it difficult to get up the steep path at Bekesbourne. She then successfully persuaded John Harris to replace her as organist at both churches.

Many local children (and some of their parents) will also remember her fondly as a kindly and encouraging piano teacher.

Thea Florence Carr (nee Smith) 1922 - 2012

Thea was born on 8th January 1922 in Blenheim, New Zealand. She came to England in the 1950s to further her studies in music and drama, attending Trinity College of Music in London. She held posts in teaching singing, piano and voice training. She married her husband William Carr in 1965, and the couple settled in Hampton, Middlesex, William being employed as an Immigration Officer at London Heathrow Airport. William had also been trained in music and drama, and they took an active part in the cultural life of the area, becoming members and singing regularly with the London Bach Society.

In 1981 William's job moved him to Dover, and he and Thea settled into Wayside Cottage in Bridge High Street. They took an active part in the musical and dramatic life of the area. They took lead roles in the Mystery Plays performed in Canterbury Cathedral. When Kent Opera performed in Canterbury they kept open house for performers so as to relax, unwind and take refreshment.

After William died in 1996 Thea bravely carried on alone. She was an active member of the choir here at St Peter's and an inspirational, committed teacher, of voice, drama, singing and piano.

Thea will always be remembered with affection by her relatives, friends and students. She always showed warm, sympathetic understanding of others, and kept her sense of humour even when in considerable pain. She leaves no close relatives in England, but seventeen nephews and nieces in New Zealand, Australia, California, South Africa and Zimbabwe.

Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 14th February 2013

<u>Pollution in the Nailbourne</u> – Cllr Alan Atkinson would represent the parish council at the meeting of the Little Stour and Nailbourne River Management Group. He would report that the parish council was appalled by the way sewage was being pumped into the Nailbourne. This had happened in two out of the past three years. The sewer needed replacing. Cllr Atkinson reported that some work had been done to the sewer but that the pipe work was not watertight everywhere and, as a result, ground water was seeping into the sewer. The pumping station was not working.

Snow Clearing arrangements – Cllr Bill Oakey reported that the new team of volunteers had managed to keep the pavements of Bridge clear of snow and ice over the weekend of 19/20th January. There were now 14 volunteers and around £200 had been spent on equipment and rock salt. Bridge Down residents had organised their own snow clearance but it was hoped that they would join the team. Cllr Oakey would leaflet Bridge Down with details. Cllr Sue Hodges reported that the steps from Bridge Hill to Bridge Down had not been cleared. More volunteers would be welcome. Cllr John Hill thanked Cllrs Oakey and Moon for their hard work and for organising the new system.

<u>Annual village litter pick</u> – Cllr Brigitte Ward would organise a village litter pick on Saturday 16th. March. Volunteers should meet at Bridge Post office at 9.30am. New high visibility vests were needed and the Council accepted a quotation from Workwear Express for 24 new vests overprinted with 'Bridge Volunteer'. Cllr Hill thanked Cllr Ward and her team of volunteers for their efforts to keep the village free from litter.

New Parking Proposals – The Council did not support the proposal to put double yellow lines at the corner of Brewery Lane and Bridgeford Way. However the proposal to put double yellow lines between the chicanes on Town Hill was strongly supported because of the danger posed by parents who parked in this area when collecting children from Bridge School. These comments would be passed to the Joint Transportation Committee for consideration at its meeting on 19th February. Cllr Oakey would put the case in support of Bridge.

<u>Health Centre Proposals</u> — Councillors who had attended the public meeting on 11th. February reported that staff of Bridge Health Centre had assured patients that there would be no diminution of services following the proposed merger with the London Road Surgery. Councillors expressed some concern over the possible increase in traffic along Patrixbourne Road.

<u>Rural Area Member Panel Grants</u> — Cllr Atkinson drew the council's attention to the RAMP fund and thought that some organisations in the village might benefit from such funds if they were made aware of them. The Clerk reported that the Farmer's Market Committee intended to submit a request for funding for market equipment from RAMP._

Replacement windows for the village hall- Councillors had seen the three quotations obtained for replacing the windows of the village hall with double glazed wood framed windows. Councillors supported the choice of contractor made by Mr Gulvin._

<u>Youth Shelter floor</u> – The hole which had developed in the youth shelter floor would need to be repaired by installing a concrete floor. The Clerk would obtain two quotations for this work.

Recreation Ground –Cllrs Hill and Moon were thanked for installing the Jubilee plaque. Cllr Sue Hodges reported that vandals had damaged the door to the sandbag store. The store was still secure. Cllr Robert Moon would assess the damage and the Clerk would get new quotations for its repair since the original contractor had been unable to undertake the work. After a vote it was agreed that Cllr Hodges should purchase pyracantha shrubs to plant against the newly repaired fence between Riverside Close and the recreation ground.

<u>Correction</u>; The Annual Parish Meeting will be held at on Wednesday 1st May at 7.30 in Bridge Village Hall. (<u>Not</u> 2nd May as previously stated in 'On the Nail'.) The main speaker will be Larissa Reid, Head of Canterbury City Council's Environmental Services who will explain the new waste collection and recycling system and answer questions. All are very welcome.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 14th.March at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings._

Tiappy Laster: Allerdia Le is Risen!

I was tickled to discover recently that there is a picture book called "Where's Jesus?"; it takes its inspiration from the ever popular 1980s' illustrated puzzle book "Where's Wally", which invited readers to hunt for a cartoon man in distinctive red and white striped jumper and hat, called Wally, amidst a sea of hundreds of cartoon characters similarly dressed in different exotic locations doing a variety of amusing things. Instead in "Where' Jesus?", the task is to spot Jesus from among a myriad of bible characters doing biblical things like fishing in the Sea of Galilee or shepherding their flocks...genius!

Well, it struck me that Easter is all about this same theme: "Where's Jesus?" But instead of hunting in a puzzle book perhaps God is encouraging us to look closer at the puzzling faces of those around us to see the reflection of Christ in our neighbours near and far. At Easter, Christ's bursting from the tomb and his variety of resurrection appearances in the gospels remind us that Jesus is alive, is rather surprising and more importantly: continues to be so.

At this time of year, we are invited again to seek the mysterious risen Jesus not among the dead but among the *living* as Mary too was amazed to discover at the empty tomb – it was the unusual gardener *not* the tomb that gave her some very good news to share and it wasn't in the place she expected it to be. We are reminded that if we are open to surprises, God will invite us to wonder at signs of resurrection all around us; the hopeful sight perhaps of new lambs in the fields around our villages and that we will find the light of Christ in the faces of others ... the risen Lord emerging in the midst of us like he did on the road to Emmaus with those disciples. So as you look back on today spend some time mulling this over – in the midst of the mysterious puzzle of life – Where's Jesus? Where has the resurrection life of God been present to you today? Has God surprised you? Did you notice? Or is it only in retrospect that you can say...that was God.

"In search of a new vicar" latest update! Where are we up to? Well, on Saturday 9th March an open meeting was held for all members of the nine churches to meet together for a "vision day" facilitated by Peter Ingrams from Diocesan House. This was a very helpful and useful exercise, which generated positive reflection and it was a great opportunity for us to update ourselves on what God is up to in each church. All of the discussion from this day is being fed into the profile writing (job brochure given to all applicants for the post), a large glossy document which is currently being drafted by a stalwart team of three church members across the Benefices; we hope this will be ready, approved by parochial church councils and by the Archdeacon by the end of April so that the post can be advertised at the beginning of May. All prayers gratefully received for those involved in the profile writing and process of selection as well as for potential applicants! Best wishes and prayers, Curate Julia. Derek Francis Atherton Prior (1927-2013)

Derek Prior, who died after a short illness and whose funeral was held in March in St. Peter's, was a well loved member of our community who will be very much missed.

Born in Essex on the 23rd February, Derek's career in the Royal Navy was followed by work for the Royal National Mission for Deep Sea Fishermen, and then many years of work as a Sales Manager for Remploy, a company providing work and opportunities for disabled people. Derek also took on additional jobs alongside his main work, first as as a barman in the evenings and later as a factory supervisor to provide additional support for his much loved family. It was typical of him that his working life was full of purpose, and that he was very committed to the jobs he did and brought integrity and kindness to his carrying out of them.

A devoted husband to Rita, whom he married in 1949, father to Lesley and Andrew and father in law to Brian and Teresa, family was very important to Derek. He loved being a grandfather to Nicky, Neil, Jim, Kelly and Carl, and great grandfather to Charley and Liam.

At home in Hemel Hempstead Derek and Rita were committed members of their church, helping others of all ages - from mother and toddler groups to taking elderly and unwell local residents to hospital appointments and helping clean the church and tend the church grounds.

After 54 very happy years of marriage, Derek suffered the devastating loss of Rita in 2003. His Christian faith, his church community in Hemel Hempstead and the support of his family sustained him at this terrible time, and in 2005 he moved to Bridge to be closer to Lesley and Brian.

From his flat in Mansfield Court, Derek was an inspiringly energetic figure in Bridge, continuing with many of the events he had been involved in in Hemel Hempstead. He could frequently be seen on his bicycle, and each year helped raise funds for St Peter's through participating (and encouraging others to participate) in the annual cycle ride here, just as he had done in Hemel Hempstead. He was a keen supporter and fundraiser for Christian Aid and other community projects like the Fish scheme. He joined the cleaning rota for the church, read the lessons, and did duty as a sidesman and other tasks in the parish. He cleared out the vicarage garden, and again became involved in volunteer driving. Derek delivered books to local housebound residents and made lots of friends in Mansfield Court. He took great pleasure in re-kindling his love of music, and made firm friendships singing in the church choirs at both Bridge and Patrixbourne. He was always busy but somehow always had the time for a smile and a friendly word. A truly good and loving man, the community in Bridge will miss him very much and extend our heartfelt sympathies to his family. We were lucky to know him.

We hope to have a new plant stall this month -'Invicta Herbs' - selling culinary and ornamental herbs, so if you have been planning a new herb garden for 2013 come along and stock up or just add a few herbs in amongst your borders or on the kitchen windowsill - a treat for the senses. Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 14th March 2013 _

Nailbourne Pollution - Cllr Alan Atkinson briefed the parish council on the current situation regarding the pollution of the Nailbourne. Screen diluted sewage was being pumped into the river from Bishopsbourne and flowing downstream through the village. The 24 hour use of tankers to over-pump sewage was causing its own serious problems in the village. The Little Stour & Nailbourne River Management Group (LNRMG) were working hard to put pressure on Southern Water to resolve the problem, which was caused by the seepage of ground water into an incompetent sewer system. The cost of replacing the sewer had been estimated at £10 million and was not a priority for Southern Water. A multi-agency meeting was being called involving the local authority, our MP, the Health Authority and Environment Agency in the hope of pressuring Southern Water to invest in the renewal of the sewers. Mill Centre- A report from Mr Colin Beesty, Chairman of the Mill Centre Management Committee (MCMC), had been circulated to Councillors. Negotiations with Canterbury City for the mixed use of the Mill Centre site had reached an impasse. The building was deteriorating and some of the youth groups currently using the Centre had indicated that they would be moving to alternative venues because of the continued uncertainty over the future of the Centre. The MCMC had been unable to obtain a long lease from the city council, whose primary objective remained to use the majority of the site for housing. After extensive discussion it was agreed to write to Cllr Simon Cook, City Councillor for Bridge, to ask him to open negotiations with the city council on behalf of the village to get agreement to make provision for continued youth activity on the site. It was pointed out that the Mill Centre is on the Parish Council's List of Community Assets.

Recreation Ground – Cllr Brigitte Ward reported that the new safety surface in the children's play area was a great improvement and looked very attractive. Canterbury City Council had agreed to meet 49% of the cost. The balance would be met by the parish council and potentially by a grant from Viridor. Work on a concrete floor for the youth shelter had been delayed by bad weather. Cllr Sue Hodges was investigating a cheaper and more environmentally appropriate form of planting for the new fence by the pavilion. Cllr Atkinson reported that the PCSO and rural Police team would monitor activities in the youth shelter periodically.

Cllr Hodges reminded councillors that there would be a working party on the recreation ground on Saturday 6th April. Volunteers should meet at the pavilion at 9.30am and bring Bridge Village Sports Trust Restructuring & Pavilion alterations— Councillors discussed the proposals for restructuring the BVST and renovating the pavilion. The short length of lease remaining on the recreation ground could present a problem when applying for grant funding. It was agreed that Mr Mervyn Gulvin, Chairman of BVST would put forward costed proposals for work on the pavilion at the next parish council meeting gardening tools.

Joint Transportation Board decisions— Cllr Bill Oakey reported that the Joint Transportation Board had agreed to put double yellow lines at the top of the High Street from the entrance to the allotments, between the chicanes and as far as Station Road, as the parish council had requested. A request for double yellow lines round Bridgeford Way, which had not been supported by the parish council, had been rejected by the Board.

<u>New Waste Collections Arrangements -</u> Councillors were briefed by Helen Bennington of Canterbury City Council on the new arrangements for the collection of waste, which would be introduced in the District starting from June 2013.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 11th.April at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.

Treatment and prevention are relatively simple using a prescription-only spot-on product or tablet. This also controls other worms, fleas and mites; this means you can deal with lungworm and a number of other common parasites in one monthly application. Fortunately, we have not seen many cases at **Bourne Veterinary Practice** but the disease is on the increase and we wanted you to be aware of the risks.
