






## God is ready to welcome!

Waiting! It's one thing that at some time or another we've all done.Our Benefice at the moment is waiting for a new priest and in the news often, we hear about the time people spend waiting at airports or in hospitals. We've all done it and do it. Have you ever sat, for example, in a waiting room wondering when you will be seen to? Or in casualty in the wee small hours as the dawn begins to break on the horizon or in a queue at the bank or post office or waiting for exam results? It's all sounding rather familiar isn't it? When we're waiting we may get frustrated and those all too common thoughts start rushing through our minds: How much longer? Will we be seen at all? Is there some kind of problem? When will the wait be over?

Imagine too, the child waiting outside the headteacher's office, having committed a misdemeanour (not that any of us would knw, eh)! What sort of reception will we get? What kind of punishment will there be in store for us this time? Well, some people approach God like that, like sitting outside an angry headmaster's office with a sense of foreboding and dread...wondering whether God will receive them and worse still, being afraid of the consequences if he does. How can God possibly forgive my mistakes? Surely God can't have time for someone like me?

If you've felt like that, then take heart. Time and time again in the New Testament, we are shown a picture of God that isn't like that headmaster. God waits to greet us with his arms wide open on the cross, or like the father who runs to meet the prodigal son and we're shown that God is ready too to forgive us and restore us like he did with Peter on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. With God there is no question of being kept outside and being made to sweat and suffer. On the contrary, we need only to make the first tentative step of approach and God is there waiting to receive us, longing to welcome us home. So why not give it a go? With prayers as ever, Revd Julia.

Asparagus is now here and the season will be soon and normal so don't miss out on one of the joys of our climate - sweet tender special paragus picked and cooked on the same day. Other vegetables to look forward to be crisp radishes, spring onions, spinach and of course new potatoes. If the weather is right of salad leaves now in season. It's also the ideal time to plant out herby or any significant bedding plants.

The long days and the warmth also heralds the start of the great English soft fruit season with strawberries in abundance and also fine Kentish cherries - justifiably world famous.

Spring lamb is now at its very finest and a boned out shoulder or leg is perfect on the barbecue or simply roasted and served with baby new potatoes and minted broad beans and peas.

Henry of *Handmade by Henry* is sadly not attending the market regularly anymore, as he has moved further away, but the good news is that he hopes to attend our special markets - so you'll need to stock up on his delicious chocolate then. Henry specialises in handmade, high quality moulded truffles and chocolates. All his chocolate is handcrafted with attention to detail and made from a specially selected range of chocolates and natural ingredients without artificial enhancers or additives. Catch him when you can.

Our June dates are the 8th and the 22nd, and the 22nd is our special summer market celebrating all things summer, and the best of al fresco dining. Come along and sample the best of the market at our tasting table, try and buy some really local cider at our new cider stall and fill your own picnic basket with locally made cheeses from *Laurie Wakeham*, scotch eggs from *Penny's cakes* ( Have you tasted them? Some dogs are more prone to heatstroke than others. Long haired breeds, fatter or heavily muscled dogs, dogs with shorter snouts and very young or old dogs are all more vulnerable.

Signs that you dog may be suffering from heatstroke include heavy panting, salivation, very red gums and tongue, lethargy, collapse, lack of coordination, vomiting, diarrhoea and eventually loss of consciousness. If you suspect that your dog may be suffering from heatstroke it is important to move them to a shaded area, dowse them with cool (not freezing cold) water and offer them small amounts of water, then ring and seek veterinary advise as soon as possible. To avoid the risk of heatstroke never leave your dog in a car, caravan or conservatory. Always make sure they have access to shade and lots of water and walk them in the early morning or evening, not in the heat of the day.



# Bridge Parish Council www.bridgevillage.org.uk Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 9th May 2013

<u>Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman</u> – Cllr Sue Hodges was nominated as Chairman by Cllr John Hill, seconded by Cllr Brigitte Ward and elected unanimously Cllr Hill was nominated as Vice Chairman by Cllr Terry Wilmshurst, seconded by Cllr John Corfield and elected unanimously.

<u>Parish Council vacancy</u> — As no election had been called, the vacancy would be filled by co-option. Notices asking candidates to come forward would be posted on the parish council notice boards. The deadline for applications would be 31st May with interviews to be held, if possible, on 7th June.

Local District Development Plan The draft District Development Plan had been published. A development of 4,000 homes and other associated building was proposed for South Canterbury. City Councillor Cllr Simon Cook said that he would be holding surgeries in Bridge Village Hall on 22nd June and 6th July and urged residents to come and make their views about the Plan known to him. Residents could also write or email the City Council direct with their opinions. The consultation process would last for 8 weeks over the summer. Neighbourhood Plan —. The Committee would meet again on 24th. May before holding a Consultation Event in the village hall on 1st June. This would seek the views of residents about the most important issues to be addressed by the Neighbourhood Plan. Draft issues would also be available on the website. There would be an opportunity for residents to give feed back at the event, on line and by paper response forms. The City Council's website did not yet show the required information about Bridge's Neighbourhood Plan.

Mill Centre- Cllr Hill and Mervyn Gulvin had met David Kemp and Martin Bovingdon of the City Council to discuss the possible purchase of the Mill Centre. The officers had undertaken to consult with city councillors and advise on a price for the site.

<u>Nailbourne Pollution</u> – Cllr Alan Atkinson reported on the latest situation. Southern Water was now putting cameras through the sewers to assess the situation. The river level was falling but tankering would continue after the Nailbourne had stopped flowing.

<u>Audited Accounts for 2012-13</u> The internal auditor's report was noted and the Parish Accounts for 2012-13 were signed by the Chairman of the Parish Council and the Clerk as Responsible Financial Officer

Recreation Ground – Cllr Hodges reported that 28 children from Bridge Primary School had helped to plant snowdrops, sowed wild flower seeds and cleared leaves from the recreation ground the previous week. The remains of the last picnic table had been removed from the recreation ground. All the 4 tables had now been destroyed by vandalism. It was agreed to purchase two more tables as soon as possible at a cost of about £400. Although vandalism could well be a problem again, councillors thought that the picnic tables were enjoyed by many Bridge residents so it was important to provide them.

<u>Skateboard Ramp-</u> Following comments from a resident at the Annual Parish Meeting, councillors again discussed the possible provision of a skateboard ramp. It was decided not to go ahead with this. The initial cost was prohibitive and routine maintenance costs would also be high. At present there was insufficient time left on the recreation ground lease to have any prospect of fund raising. It was agreed that available funds should be directed to the purchase and refurbishment of the Mill Centre, which would be of benefit to all the young people in Bridge.

<u>Illegal Parking on Conyngham Lane</u> - This was something over which the parish council had no control. Complaints should be addressed to Cllr Simon Cook and Larissa Reed at the City Council. Parking enforcement was the responsibility of the City Council.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 13th.June at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.\_
