So many people in the world today are seeking ... searching for something or someone to bring meaning to their lives and they look in all sorts of places to greater or lesser success. One need only turn on the TV to be bombarded by adverts for products that we are persuaded our life is meaningless without. But deep in our hearts we know that more stuff, a bigger house or a holiday in the sun or beauty product X or Y – though satisfying for a while - will not actually quench that deep soul thirst within us that craves for meaning and for true peace. A peace that I would argue comes only from God as gift.

The challenge today for us as a church is to be wellsprings of life to those who are seeking and spiritually searching...a challenge to let God be God and speak to those who are thirsty and give them to drink. Our calling as a church community is to come and receive from God, to be watered and then to give you, to give everyone to drink in the name of God.

David Adam in his gem of a book: *The Cry of the Deer*, also reminds us of how many seekers have found what they are looking for through service, through caring, through loving their brothers and sisters. This is one profound way in which all of us can meet with God, with meaning as we encounter Christ in the person alongside us, whom we seek to serve. This is expressed beautifully in this verse, whose author is unknown:

I sought my God My God I could not see. I sought my soul My soul eluded me. I sought my brother And I found all three.

If you are seeking – may this be a source of inspiration and a wellspring for you too as it has for me,

IF WHAT?

It was a moving moment as 45,000 people in Hyde Park fell silent to remember the 2 million children who died of hunger in 2012. We were there on Saturday 8th June for the **BIG IF Campaign Rally**, having walked in a procession of witness from Westminster. There we listened to Danny Boyle, Rowan Williams, Bill Gates and many others some famous and some not, calling on leaders of the G8 meeting in Enniskillen NI to take this opportunity to end world hunger.

That's a big ask you may say, but those signed up to the IF Campaign—more than150 UK organisations like Christian Aid, Oxfam and UNICEF as well as Jewish and Muslim charities—believe that there is enough food for everyone in the world IF We give enough aid to help the poorest people feed themselves;

- We stop big companies dodging paying tax in poor countries;
- We stop poor farmers being forced off their land so that large companies can grow biofuels;
- We force governments and big corporations to be honest and transparent about their activities.

Bill Gates reminded us that it was only the strength of 'people power' that has brought about democracy, women's rights and the end of slavery, so ordinary people must demand that world leaders make these changes. The fact hat 900 million people—that's 1 in 8 of the world population—go to bed hungry every night is just not acceptable in the 21st century. Poverty disempowers people and nations and provides a breeding ground for unrest and fundamentalism; eradication of poverty could lead to a more stable world.

By the time you read this the G8 will have met and we will know what commitment they have made to ending world hunger. Whatever the world leaders pledge to do it is important to keep up the pressure to ensure that they follow through on their promises. <u>Christian Aid Week</u> here in May began with an imaginative service in Bridge Church involving many young people, then a chocolate cake was baked to illustrate the story of Bolivian cocoa farmers supported by Christian Aid's partner, CIPCA. Collectors in the Bridge Benefice raised £2095.50 this year (£2366 with Gift Aid) - a good result in spite of us not being able to cover all the usual roads. Many thanks to all those who gave up their time to collect and to those who donated. One more important step in the fight against hunger!

Bridge Farmers' Market July 2013

At the last market someone asked me a few questions about Bridge Farmers' Market, and the whole concept of Farmers' Markets in general, and I thought it worth sharing a few of the things that were discussed - they may be questions that you have wanted to ask yourself.

How did the Farmers' Market come about? In June 2010 the **Bridge Going Green** group carried out a survey to see which, of a number of projects, the people of Bridge, and the surrounding area, would most like to see developed. A Farmers' Market came out resoundingly at the top of the list, and Saturday came out as the day that most people preferred for a market. So in November 2010 Bridge Farmers' Market was born at the Red Lion, with the very kind permission of Rene and Harry, without whom the market would not take place.

We got a lot of help from the Kent Farmers' Market Association while we were setting the market up, and continue to be affiliated to them today. KFMA formed in 2007 specifically to help markets such as ours that have a very positive effect on the local economy. KFMA estimates that in Kent, Farmers' Markets contribute nearly 3 million pounds a year to the economy.

So why buy with us? There are many reasons of course. The food and drink is *local*, it is grown in and around Bridge so is truly a *local* product. The food is *very good value for money*, you can buy directly from the grower or producer and enjoy competitively priced quality products. The food is *fresher, tastier and seasonal*. And, very importantly, buying at a Farmers' Market is a great chance to meet your neighbours and friends and have a chat, it provides a *focal point to meet* and linger for a coffee too.

Where do the stalls come from? At Bridge Farmers' Market our preference is that producers come from within 30 miles of Bridge, so for example our preserves stall is from the Alkham Valley near Dover, our vegetable stall from Upstreet just outside Canterbury and our new baker from Aldington. Our main stalls are food and drink stalls but we also like to have guest stalls to create diversification and choice especially at our four seasonal markets, sometimes we have a silk screen printer from Canterbury, a furniture restorer from Bearsted and alpaca wool stall from Boughton Monchelsea.

Who runs it? Bridge Farmers' Market is run by a small group of volunteers who help to set up and run the market on the second and fourth Saturday of the month, and behind the scenes liaise with stallholders, design leaflets and posters and generally promote the market. Mark Esdale has been our Market Manager since the beginning and has done a fantastic job, but now we are looking for a new Market Manager to run the market from the Autumn of 2013. Could this be you? Are you interested in local foods and keen to continue this community project? Perhaps you are already a shopper at the market? If you think you might be interested please contact Philip Wicker, the chairman of our group at <u>philip.wicker1@gmail.com</u> or look out for the posters at the end of the summer. We are also looking for new volunteers to help out at the market from time to time, putting up gazebos and bunting, also delivering leaflets and helping us with publicity. Please ask at the market if you are interested. We look forward to hearing from you. Our dates for July are July 13th and 27th.

We are seeing lots of itchy cats and dogs at the of year when there are lots of irritating parasites fleas. Fleas jump amazing distances and can easily ju outdoors. They are then brought inside on your house. A female flea will lay 30-50 eggs a day a can have a flea infestation problem in your hom



irritating bites yourself. A terrifying fact is that 25 autometas can multiply to 200,000 fleas in 30 days!

The best way to control flea problems is to prevent them happening in the first place. Fortunately, there have been significant developments in veterinary parasite control in recent years and there are now several new insecticides and insect growth regulators in easy to use forms that effectively eliminate fleas. There are collars, sprays and topical applications and it is well worth talking to your vet about the best product for your pet. Fleas evolve rapidly and are often resistant to many of the products you can buy over the counter, so it is well worth seeking veterinary advice if you have seen fleas on your pet.
