

Ian Hobson will be giving a video presentation in Kingston Barn on his attempt to climb Everest from the Chinese side, which is considered to be the most difficult route. Apart from the mountaineering, there is a chance to see the countryside life en-route, and should appeal to non-mountaineers. #### Completion of Wheel Window Project at St Mary's Patrixbourne.

On Sunday 21st September a Festal Evensong service was held at St Mary's Patrixbourne to give thanksgiving for the completion of the project to restore the Norman Wheel window, in the East wall of the Chancel. The Festal Evensong was led by Canon Jonathan LLoyd, the Preacher was the Dean of Canterbury, the Right Rev Robert Willis DL ,and the congregation was joined by a choir of choristers from Canterbury Cathedral, directed by Dr David Flood.

The project to repair the Wheel window also included repairs to the North Valley gutter and much needed redecoration of the chancel. Repairs were necessary on the Wheel window as the beautiful Norman stonework was showing signs of cracking and movement; holes had appeared in the window between the stonework and the glass inserts and the central 'axle' of the wheel was flattened downwards with the glass bowing outwards. The damage had been discovered when scaffolding in place during the restoration of the Swiss glass windows, below the wheel window, in 2010, allowed a close up inspection of this important Norman feature of the church.

The work, which was completed this summer, was funded by generous grants from organisations such as Viridor Environmental Credits, the Friends of Kent Churches and the Matthiesen Trust. The Friends of St Mary's Patrixbourne held concerts and talks to raise funds and generous donations were received from many individual Parishioners. Without such generosity the project would not have been possible.

The work was carried out by skilled craftsmen, and during work on the stained glass, by the Cathedral Stained Glass Studio, a maker's mark and the date 1837 were discovered etched into the glass. This dates the window glass with the same date as the donation of the Swiss glass by the Marchioness of Conyngham, in 1837. It is likely that the brightly coloured glass of the Wheel window was made by the same craftsman, as the one who made the coloured surrounds around the 10 panels of Swiss glass, in the three lancets below.

If you are passing the church, please drop in and view the restored window. The stonework is now clean and structurally sound, with details of the carved head and cat masks clearly revealed. From the inside the glass looks bright and clean, especially so in early morning sunshine which streams directly through the window. A wonderful sight!

Thank you to all who helped this project reach completion.

The Friends of Bekesbourne Church organised activities for the children and the Bekesbourne Brownies brought their hand bells to ring to us. Produce and plants sold well and lots of books found new homes. Many of the Ride and Stride visitors on Saturday were delighted to stop a little longer than usual to enjoy the festival and several cycled on with pots of jam and flowers in their rucksacks. For those of you who missed it, photos can be found on the church website.

The weekend came to a final climax with a well-attended Evensong, with singing led by the Bridge Church choir, at which the Vicar preached below a floral aircraft, floating above his head in the pulpit.

#### ARMISTICE DAY AND THE POPPY APPEAL - HELP NEEDED

Readers may be interested to learn that your current Poppy Appeal Organiser lived in Sarajevo in 1984, 70 years after WWI began, and on several occasions has stood on the pavement block where Gavrilo Princip fired the first shot of that war, killing Archduke Ferdinand.

In the more recent Bosnian war of 20 years ago my student dormitory block which used to house 1500 students in a suburb called Nedzarici, was blown to bits. In a visit after that war I found the plaque giving the street name and number in the ruins and still have it. The block has now been rebuilt and the one opposite, where there used to be a canteen, has become the Bosnian Ministry of Security!

It may also be of interest that at one time we had a very unusual book-keeper at our company: Kemal Pervanic author of "The Killing Days", about his time in a Bosnian concentration camp in 1992. He now spends his time trying to assist in conflict resolution.

These notes have been written with an eye to attracting your attention. This November we are in need of more volunteers to assist with the Poppy Appeal. It does not take up more than a couple of hours to go collecting during the fortnight preceding 11.11.14. #### **Trees for Autumn Planting**

# Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 11th, September 2014

**Neighbourhood Plan** – Prof Joe Connor reported that the first draft of the Neighbourhood Plan had been collated and was being formatted. It would be printed and distributed to every household in Bridge for comment. There would be an event in the village hall on 1st November at which residents would be invited to discuss the draft.

Bridge Emergency Plan – Cllr Kate Wortham said that an outline plan would be presented to the Parish Council in October. This would be an on-going document subject to amendment as situations changed. The Committee were contacting other services so that plans could be coordinated. A database of vulnerable residents would be compiled and this would be subject to Data Protection Legislation. It was agreed that the current location of the sandbag store was not appropriate. A decision on whether to purchase a new store would be taken at the October meeting. The best location for such a store was under consideration

<u>Community Flood Warden-</u> It was agreed to appoint a Community Flood Warden for Bridge. Richard McCarthy agreed to undertake the role. Others could be co-opted to assist in an emergency. Cllr Sue Hodges thanked Mr McCarthy for taking on the role.

Nailbourne Pollution – Kent County Council were planning to resurface Brewery Lane and Bridgeford Way in the autumn. While this work was going on the City Council would install the mechanism for floodgates at the ford. Non-return valves were being installed in some properties in Patrixbourne and it was hoped some would be installed in Riverside Close.

<u>Amendment to Standing Orders –</u> It was agreed to amend Standing Orders to comply with the Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulation 2014.

Review of Polling District & Polling Places - Councillors did not wish to recommend any changes either to the polling district or location of the polling station following the electoral boundary changes.

Recreation Ground — Cllr Brigitte Ward reported that the annual safety inspection report had been received. There were no significant risk factors identified. The Recreation Committee would consider whether any of the minor items mentioned in the report needed immediate attention. Cllr Hodges reported that volunteers from the Kentish Stour Countryside Partnership had cleared the area near the top gate. Children from the primary school would be planting 100 plug plants in the next few days.

Recreation Ground Working Party —Volunteers were asked to join the working party on the recreation ground on the morning of Saturday 18th October.

**Bridge in Bloom** – It was agreed to spend up to £50 on vouchers, flowers and engraving of trophies for 'Bridge in Bloom'. Cllr Hodges thanked Cllr Ann Edmonds and Mrs Vicky White for judging the competition. The presentation of awards would take place in Mansfield Court residents' lounge on 24th.September at 2.30pm.

<u>Planning Committee</u> Cllr John Hill agreed to sit on the Planning Committee when Cllr Robert Moon stood down temporarily from November until early 2015\_

<u>Date of 2015 Annual Parish Meeting</u> The Annual Parish Meeting would be held on Thursday 30th April 2015

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 9th.October at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.


