





Dear friends

As we turn into Autumn and light up our log fires, we also turn towards the season of remembrance. With the leaves falling from the trees, it is an appropriate time to remember. The leaves fall into the ground in great quantities and colours. They remind us of our loved ones perhaps, who we still love even beyond death. At 6.00pm on 2 November we will mark All Souls Day at Bridge with an Evensong of remembering. The Christian faith teaches us that love is stronger than death, and that nothing can separate us from the love of Christ. The dead are a 'great cloud of witnesses', and we continue to love our loved ones. The following Sunday we remember the 20 million people who perished a hundred years ago in the First World War, and the Second World War that followed less than half a century later. On Sunday 9 November we will lay wreaths at the War Memorials of our villages, and come together at Bridge Church at 1050 in silent reflection for our Remembrance Service. Both to remember and to recommit ourselves to building peace.

Remembering matters. On the washroom walls at Dachau in Germany, a place that I have visited and prayed in, there is the stark sign on the wall 'Those who do not remember will repeat the same again'.

But remembering is not nostalgic nor passive. To actively remember means working to build a better world. Building on the example of our loved ones, actively working to reconcile conflict in the world and to bring peace and reconciliation.

At the end of November, on 30th, we start the holy season of Advent. A time of expectant waiting for both the Christ-child at Bethlehem and the end of time itself.

The real challenge is to resist the Christmas commercial rush and chaos, and enjoy the stillness and expectancy of the four weeks of Advent. To slow down rather than speed up.

As we remember, let us also recommit ourselves to making the world a better place, in which freedom, justice and hope flourish.

Growing conditions have made it a difficult year to keep the grass in Bekesbourne Churchyard under control. A grant from the Parish Council and contribution from the Friends of the Church pays for the main areas of grass to be cut by a contractor. This year, the rapid growth has meant that at times some areas around the graves have not been kept as tidy as before.

It would be a great help to those mowing the grass if any metal markers on graves could be removed by the family before next season, once a gravestone is in place. If they are still there in the spring, they will be removed and stored in the church for a few months. It would also be helpful if any containers on a grave could be placed up against the gravestone to enable mowing across the grave (and also to comply with the official churchyard regulations).

We would welcome anyone who could give occasional help on the churchyard working parties for an hour or two on a Saturday morning from 9.30 am. The last one this year will be on 15 November to tidy up for the winter. Bring tools if possible and enjoy a mid-morning drink and a snack. Jane Millyard

Our next Branch meeting will be our AGM on Tues, 11th November and the next monthly meeting will be on Tues, 9th December both at the Recreation Club at 8pm.



Community First Responder for Bridge- Following a talk and demonstration by Ryan Truelove, Area team leader, it was agreed to encourage residents to volunteer as Community First Responders for Bridge. There was a need for these volunteers because ambulance response times are longer in rural areas. It was hoped to recruit up to 6 volunteers who would undertake to commit to 4-6 hours per week on duty to respond to 999 calls and offer first aid until the arrival of the ambulance service. Volunteers would be selected for training by the Ambulance Service. The Parish Council would make publicity material available in Bridge and consider supporting volunteers by assisting with their equipment costs

Bridge Emergency Plan – Cllr Kate Wortham introduced the new Emergency Plan for Bridge, which had been based on the Kent Resilience Plan. Its aim was to provide local support until the emergency services were available. It was a 'living document' subject to continuous revision. Residents who needed support should be aware it was possible to ask for inclusion on the register. Confidential information would be password protected and securely retained by the Committee members and Parish Clerk. Cllr Sue Hodges thanked the Committee for their hard work in preparing an excellent Plan._

Sand bag storage- It was agreed to approach the Area Manager of Shepherd Neame to ask for permission to site sandbags storage boxes in the car park of the Plough and Harrow

Sports pavilion renovations- Cllr Terry Wilmshurst reported that some work had been started on improving the pavilion. He had replaced 90% of the guttering and had obtained quotations for new floor covering and new showers. . It was agreed that councillors would decide what work was required before the start of the recreation ground working party._

<u>Recreation Ground</u> – The fence between the recreation ground and the health centre needed repairing. This was the responsibility of the surgery. The Play Inspection report had been considered in detail and it had been decided that at present none of the items listed were in need of action but they would be monitored closely. Cllr Brigitte Ward was willing to continue to hold the inspection folder. Cllr Hodges reported that children from the school had planted wild flower plug plants and would plant bulbs the following week. There was the possibility of a butterfly survey next year.

The youth shelter seat had been replaced and Cllr Hodges thanked Cllrs Moon and Wilmshurst for this.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> – The Neighbourhood Plan Committee had met twice in October and would meet again on 17th. October. A meeting had also taken place with representatives of Cantley Ltd, the major local landowner .A draft Plan was almost ready for distribution round the village for residents to comment on. It would be sent to Planning Aid for their assessment. There would be a consultation event in the village hall on 1st November.

Nailbourne – Footings for the floodgates were being installed at the ford in Brewery Lane and road patching was being undertaken in Brewery Lane and Bridgeford Way. It was planned to install a bund and floodgates across the back of Bridge


