



What is a fair banana?

Most of us love bananas. In the UK alone we eat over 5 billion a year. In the last 10 years, a bitter price war has seen the UK supermarket sector almost halving the price of loose bananas, while the cost of producing them has doubled. This is trapping many of the farmers who grow them in a cycle of poverty. Does this seem fair to you?

Foncho is a banana farmer from Colombia. Before Foncho's co-operative Coobafrio was certified as Fairtrade, he often struggled to make ends meet. But now he receives a fair price for his bananas, which means he can support his family and send his daughter to college.

What can we do?

Supermarkets need to stay competitive and competition law forbids them to coordinate price rises amongst themselves. The government must step in to investigate the grave impact of unsustainable supermarket pricing and act to protect the many poor farmers who grow the UK's favourite fruit. Please help by signing the petition to Vince Cable, Secretary of State for Business. We will have a petition sheet and post cards to send in Bridge Church during March.





Bridge Parish Council www.bridgevillage.org.uk Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 13th February 2014_

Flood Situation Update- Cllr Moon updated the Council on the flood situation in Bridge. Pipes had been installed that day to avoid the 'pinch point at the bus shelter and water was now flowing over the road via two 8' pipes and one 6' pipe. No action would be taken that would increase flood risk further down stream. Cllr Moon paid tribute to the many Bridge volunteers who had helped with filling and deploying sandbags, making tea for the emergency services and helping vulnerable residents. All the professional emergency services had been working tirelessly. It was agreed that there should be a first aid course organised for councillors and volunteers after the current emergency had ended. It was also suggested that the sand bag store be moved to a location that would be easier to access than the recreation ground. Cllr Hodges thanked Cllr Moon for his continued outstanding work in helping those affected by the flooding and assisting with co-ordinating the emergency services.

<u>Nailbourne Pollution</u> – Clir Atkinson reported that Clir Cook and Julian Brazier MP had visited the area. Clir Gilbey had also been invited to come and see the situation. Ground water had already reached the highest measurement on the scale and was unlikely to reduce until the summer. This would continue to affect the levels in Church Meadow and the Nailbourne. Southern Water had tried to line the sewer but the present inundation could cause further problems. Clir Hodges thanked Clir Atkinson for his continued work on the problems of the flooding.

Recreation Ground – Cllr Ward re-iterated that the recreation ground had been temporarily closed on the advice of the Environment Agency and would remain closed until the Parish Council was advised that it was safe to re-open it. The EA had rejected a suggestion that a fence should be erected along the path from Riverside Close to the school gate.

Annual Parish Meeting It was agreed to ask Guy Gardener, the Emergency Flood Coordinator from Canterbury City Council, to speak at the Annual Parish Meeting.

<u>Mill Centre-</u> There had been no response from Mr Bursnell of CCC to the application for the Mill Centre to be added to the Parish Council's list of assets of community value. The Centre was suggested as a possible location for the sand bag store.

Response from Canterbury Police to Dog Attack Complaint The disappointing response from Inspector Mark Arnold was discussed. It was agreed to pursue the idea of re-instating the Police Forum, which would include a representative of each parish council and representatives of Kent Highway Services at regular liaison meetings. A reply would be sent to the Police requesting this and Action with Rural Communities in Kent would also be asked to support the proposal.

<u>Withdrawal of green sack collection service</u>; The Clerk reported that she had been unsuccessful in getting the City Council to re-consider its decision on green sack withdrawal or to visit those affected. Cllr Cook had been asked to continue to pursue this with the City Council.

<u>Village Litter pick</u> Cllr Ward announced that there would be a Spring village litter pick on Saturday 29th March at 9.30. Volunteers should meet at the Post Office. If the weather was bad the event would be postponed until 5th April. All volunteers would be very welcome.

<u>Recreation Ground Working Party</u> Cllr Hodges announced that there would not be a working party this Spring because of the current flood situation. Work with the Kent Stour Countryside Partnership Volunteers would be postponed until September as would work with the primary school children, who would do their planting in September._

Bridge Down Steps – Cllr Hodges reported that surveyors from Kent Highway Services had been seen taking measurements at the steps. No indication had been received as to when replacement work might begin.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 13th.March at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings._

A Country View

Shrinking Violets

As the evenings grow a little lighter and longer and we look forward eagerly through this stormy spell to the coming of spring, some of our wild flowers offer the hope of brighter times. Snowdrops have been out in the churchyards for a while and crocuses are making an appearance across the area.

Mild temperatures have also encouraged violets to make an early appearance in verges in some parts of Bridge. However, few of us will have seen them because someone has been spotted picking them all. This is of course very disappointing, but we have been asked: "Is it allowed legally?"

For clarification, digging up wild plants is illegal anywhere; picking wild flowers is not technically illegal, unless the plants are a protected species, or they are in private

grounds, or land maintained by the council. However, it seems most of the land in this area fits into one of those categories so we suggest it would be sensible to avoid picking wild flowers from a legal point of view.

From a moral perspective, how much more generous it would be to leave the flowers where they grow so that all those who wander past on their country rambles can enjoy them too.

For true nature lovers, those who really appreciate our countryside heritage, it is much nicer to see wild flowers in their proper place, out in the countryside, than it is to see them picked and sitting isolated in a vase on someone's coffee table.



Bourne Vets News

Vomiting and Diarrhoea is a common problem for dogs and cats at any time of year but we have seen a recent increase in cases and are worried it may be related to the flooded waterways and sewage issues that are causing such problems in our area.

If you notice that your pet is vomiting or has diarrhoea or both then initially it is important to withhold food for 24 hours but make sure that fluid is offered in small amounts regularly so that they don't get dehydrated. You can purchase ready-made dehydration support salts or make a homemade version by adding a pinch of salt and a teaspoon of sugar to 500mls of fresh water. Make sure you monitor them closely and keep them warm and after 24 hours of starvation if there is no more symptoms introduce a very bland white meat based diet (Chicken, white fish, rice or pasta).

If the symptoms carry on for more than 24 hours then we would recommend seeking veterinary advice. Also if your pet is showing any signs of dehydration such as dullness, sleepiness and dry gums or there is blood in the diarrhoea or vomit then we would recommend they are checked by a vet sooner and at Bourne Veterinary Practice we are open 7 days a week if you have any concerns. In the vast majority of cases some straight forward symptomatic treatment is very effective and fast acting.

We have also seen some dogs that have been dragged underwater in the fast currents recently and if they are pulled under bridges there is no airspace for them to take a breath and can aspirate water. Please avoid letting your dog swim in the waterways until these extreme conditions have settled down.


