MURIEL PACKER

May 17th 2014. St. George, Westcombe Park

Luke 24 v.29 Stay with us, for evening draws on and the day is almost over. Words of the disciples at Emmaus to Jesus as they ask for his presence that first Easter day: words which we can imagine in Muriel's heart as she died this Easter day: words from her favourite Easter story: words read at John's thanksgiving service in Bridge in 2006, and which she also recalled from their wedding in 1942. We took her back to Queensbury in West Yorkshire last August on an appallingly wet day such as only the Yorkshire Pennines can produce, and she stood in church at the step where they had made their marriage vows, and remembered. The two disciples in the story were Cleopas and another-maybe his wife- and they stood in Muriel's imagination for her long and devoted marriage to John, lived in the assurance of Jesus' presence and love. When Muriel received the Maundy money from the Queen in 2002 in Canterbury Cathedral the citation spoke of her visits to The Close psychiatric home, which those of you from Bridge know well, and described her as a `faithful, charitable and selfless servant of others'. It is an apt description, and a challenge to us as we give thanks for her today. She was faithful: utterly reliable: someone you could always trust. It is appropriate that this service takes place in Christian Aid week, for she was faithful throughout her life in her commitment to this week's collections, whether in Bolton, in Bridge or here from St. George's-and we as a family remember the kitchen table piled high with coppers as we added up the money from the envelopes.

Faithful, and charitable. In giving, yes, but still more in generous judgement. My sister was telling me of a young neighbour in Bolton, divorced in the 1960s, who spoke of Muriel's support of her when others were determined to criticise. Muriel was a life-long pacifist, with a love of France, and especially Germany, where she was due to spend a year as part of her degree course in 1939-40. She did actually go to Germany in September 1939, was quickly forced to return, but retained her links with her exchange partner during and after the war: a mark of reconciliation, of charity: a charity she sought to convey to her pupils, particularly at Bury Grammar School for Girls, in her teaching of French, and particularly her favourite language of German.

Faithful, charitable and selfless. Muriel was someone who delighted in the qualities and skills of others-whether in her family of grandchildren and great grandchildren, amongst colleagues, at church or in neighbours. We have heard many memories in the last month of moments of pastoral care for others which have encouraged and inspired.

All of this hid a lack of self-confidence: even at times a failure to value herself: which could express itself in personal struggle. We have just heard Charles Wesley's 'Come, O Thou Traveller Unknown', a reflection on Jacob wrestling with God, demanding to know whether God really is love, and receiving the assurance 'Tis Love! Tis Love! Thou diedst for me! I hear thy whisper in my heart. – Thy nature and thy name is Love'.

When Muriel and John were apart in the last few weeks of his life she wrote out and shared with him the Celtic poem, 'May the road rise to meet you', with its conclusion, 'Until we meet again, may God hold you in the hollow of his hand'. We pray that now, for one another and for Muriel.

Bourne vets news

We are often asked by people how to help them deal with their doos dry, itchy skin, especially at this time of year.

There are a number of reasons why dogs scratch but the fleas, mites and other ectoparasites.

Flea bites cause irritation and some dogs have allergic re infestation can become a real nightmare if not properly tre will hop onto your pet outside and 'hitch a ride' into your h and multiply, quickly becoming hundreds of eggs in just a have fed, the female flea lays up to 50 eggs a day and in these eggs can hatch into fleas reinfesting your pet and y even biting you.

When it comes to protecting against flea infestation, preve fortunately, flea prevention is now easier than ever. There can be applied to the back of the neck every month to prc



from fleas and ticks and there is also now a new generation of flea collar which provides continuous protection against fleas and ticks for up to 8 months, so you don't have to worry about missing a monthly application. Ask your vet for more information about the Seresto Collars.

If your pet already has fleas (you may notice the small black dots of flea dirt in their coats), then it is important to treat all the bedding, carpets and soft furnishings in the areas your pet goes using an environmental spray, this is expensive and time consuming so it's better to protect your pet against a flea infestation before it happens.

There are other rarer causes of itching in dogs but this is by far the most common cause and will need to be ruled out before further investigation is undertaken. If you are worried about how much your dog is itching, please talk to your vet or call us at Bourne Veterinary Practice on 01227 832322 to discuss flea treatment and other possible causes.

Bridge Parish Council www.bridgevillage.org.uk Notes from Bridge Parish Council meeting 8th May 2014_

<u>Election of Chairman;</u> Cllr Sue Hodges was re-elected as Chairman of Bridge Parish Council for a further year. Cllr John Hill was re-elected as Vice Chairman.

Funding for Local Projects –City Councillor Simon Cook said that the Rural Area Members' Panel for South Canterbury had funding available up to a total of £7,500 for local schemes and it would be distributed on a 'first come, first served' basis. Any local organisation seeking funding should contact the City Council as soon as possible to obtain an application form.

Neighbourhood Plan – Adrian Verrall of Canterbury City Council was scheduled to meet with the Neighbourhood Plan Committee the following day. The Parking Survey was being undertaken and forms should be returned as soon as possible. Responses could also be made on line. Speedwatch volunteers would help with a traffic count. A consultation event planned for May 17th in the village hall had been postponed. **Mill Centre-** Cllr Cook reported that a decision on the future of the Mill Centre would be made by CCC's Executive in July. Some questions had been raised about the Business Plan and application to take over the lease. They would be answered by members of the Mill Centre Committee. A potential funding source had been found but any application would need to be lodged before 26th. June. It was hoped to get an informal response from CCC before that date.

<u>Nailbourne Pollution</u> – Cllr Atkinson reported that sewage was no longer being pumped into the Nailbourne upstream of Bridge but pumping continued on the other side of Patrixbourne. Money for flood alleviation would be a problem. Currently CCC was using money from contingencies for small alleviation schemes. Southern Water would be urged to recommence their operations on the local sewers.

<u>Audited Accounts for 2013-14</u> The internal auditor's report was noted and the Parish Accounts for 2013-14 were signed by the Chairman of the Parish Council and the Clerk as Responsible Financial Officer

<u>Canterbury Local Plan –</u> Cllr Hodges had drafted and circulated a response to the Canterbury Local Plan. As the official consultation period had not yet commenced, councillors were asked to send any further comments to Cllr Hodges for inclusion in the final, revised submission.

<u>Higham Lane Bus Shelter</u> – Cllr Hodges said that a KCC engineer had reported that moving the bus shelter would not make it any safer. Cllr Hodges had observed the bus stop on three early mornings and had not seen any problems with its use at that time. However, she did express concerns at the speed at which traffic travelled along the whole road. It was agreed that Cllr Cook would liaise with Cllr Northey about the possibility of making the whole of the stretch of the road from Bridge Hill to the Valley Road safer by introducing a 40 mph speed limit. In addition the parish council would write to Stagecoach asking them to ensure that drivers did not ignore the request bus stop at Higham Lane.

<u>Membership of the South Canterbury Alliance-</u> After some debate it was agreed to subscribe to membership of the SCA. At the end of the year the position would be reviewed and a decision made as to whether it was useful to belong to both SCA and the Alliance of Canterbury Residents' Associations (ACRA).

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 12th.June at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.
