



Dear friends

August will be a special time as the world starts to remember the hundred year anniversary of the First World War. There will be many special events and activities, starting next month, and lasting over the next four years.

Sue and I recently visited the Canadian Memorial at Vimy Ridge, and walked silently through the tunnels and trenches. It was a deeply moving experience. It is so important to honour the dead, and at the same time redouble our efforts to make peace. With so much violence and killing in Iraq and Syria, and elsewhere in the world today, working for peace is more important than ever. I am reminded of the words of George Santayana *'Those who do not remember the past are condemned to repeat it.'* In the last hundred years there have been more war dead in the world than in any previous century. There is indeed much to reflect on over these next four years.

There are many ways we can be part of the centenary. In August, these are some special events:

On **Monday 4 August**, we are invited to light a candle and blow it out at 11pm. This is the exact moment a hundred years ago when war was declared, and reminds us of the words of Sir Edward Grey, our Foreign Secretary in 1914, 'The lamps are going out all over Europe; we shall not see them lit again in our lifetime.'

The single candle at the Grave of the Unknown Warrior in Westminster Abbey will be extinguished at that moment. The special Vigil from the Abbey will be televised on BBC 2 from 10.00pm. The Vigil will include music, readings, poetry and contemporary reflection from 1914 (such as diaries and letters).

On **Tuesday 5 August** from 8.00am at St Peter's Bridge there will be a quiet Vigil of Reflection and Prayer (before the 9.30am Holy Communion service) and all are welcome to call in for a short or longer time.

Plant poppy seeds. We are invited to plant poppy seeds all over the country, in our gardens, school, worksplace, grass verges etc so that the whole country is covered with the flowers of remembrance. Let's cover our village with poppies!

You will notice from the schedule of church services that there are some changes in timing at St Peter's Church Bridge. The regular Sunday Service will now start at **11.00am** (2nd, 3rd, 4th Sunday) with Evensong remaining at 6.00pm on the first Sunday. The new start time of 11.00am will enable some of our more senior members to join us who currently find 9.30am too early for them, and also means that I can be at Bridge each Sunday as your vicar. I am most grateful to Canon Gordon Manley who has so faithfully served us on the third Sunday at Bridge for the last 12 years, and will now be part of my wider team of retired clergy who kindly cover at different times across our five churches. At St Peter's Bridge, coffee and tea will be served from 10.30am before the 11.00am service, and all are welcome. We are also planning a new Children's Group on Saturday evenings at 5pm, and further details will be in the next magazine.

Thank you to all who made the Bridge Village Fete such a wonderful day, and for all your hard work. It was a real celebration of the whole community. I warmly invite you to the Flower Festival at St Peter's Church Bekesbourne 12-14 September.

Celebration of 20 years of the ordination of women to the priesthood in the Church of England

On Saturday, May 3rd 2014, the Anglican Church celebrated 20 years of women's ministry. I was staying with my daughter, Mary, who is a priest in London and we woke to glorious sunshine and surely this epitomised the day.

Mary and her Husband Andrew, also a priest and Samuel and Jacob, their sons prepared to go to Westminster Abbey for 12 noon. We packed a picnic ready to eat with hundreds of others in Dean's yard, at the Abbey. This was chosen because it was in Paternoster Square in 1992 that the yes vote was relayed concerning women priests, and Mary & Andrew were there. Everyone there burst into singing Jubilate Deo.

On arrival at the Abbey, everyone was laughing, chatting and reminiscing. I remembered so vividly Mary's ordination to the priesthood in Coventry Cathedral in 1994, after five years of being a Deacon. Sheer joy!

From Westminster abbey, we set off marching to St Paul's Cathedral. I think there were a thousand or more there, and the atmosphere was electric. As we marched, cars hooted us, and people waved. We smiled and waved back, but were they supporting us or mocking us – who knows? But nothing daunted us.

On arrival at the Cathedral, there were hundreds more on the steps. Excitement grew, and eventually we entered St.Pauls. We found our seats and waited. I knew that somewhere in that vast building, our vicar was there celebrating with his mother the Reverend Pamela LLoyd, who was ordained in 1994, after waiting so long as a Deacon. The Cathedral was absolutely full, and at 4.40, 700 women priests, simply dressed in an albe and stole began their long walk up the aisle. On our service sheet it said 'please remain seated when the women priests' process' – but no way did this happen! We scrambled to our feet and applauded. The volume increased despite the length of the procession. It was very moving, and when I saw Mary, near the end, I cried with joy and pride. I'm sure I wasn't the only one.

The organ resounded, and we sang The Church's One Foundation at the top of our voices. It was a wonderful service, with Archbishop Justin preaching. He said 'much has been done, but there is much more to do.' The Sermon was inspiring. We celebrated the Eucharist, and people on the steps outside also received communion. Everything was perfect. We laughed, we prayed, we sang. We ended with I, The Lord of Sea and Sky, and a blessing.

As I journeyed home, I felt peaceful, joyful, prayerful and inspired. Whatever people say, the Church is alive with the joy, the vitality and the glory of the Risen Lord. Alleluia, Amen.

THE PARISH OF PATRIXBOURNE WITH BRIDGE

Our Annual Vestry and Parochial Church Meetings, chaired by Canon Jonathan LLoyd, were held at Bridge School on 23rd April and attended by 19 parishioners.

As we are a parish with 2 parish churches we elect 4 churchwardens to the whole parish and arrange for them to perform separate duties at each church,. Accordingly Andrea Nicholson & Pauline Pritchard (Patrixbourne) with Laurence Dunderdale & Evelyn Andrews (Bridge) were re-elected. A diocesan results notice for all elections is displayed at both churches. Other appointments were Andrea Nicholson & Bev Latham - Deanery Synod representatives, Pauline Prichard – PCC vice-chair, Clive Medhurst - PCC treasurer, Alan Barber - PCC secretary with Sue Briant, John Hill, Sarah Wetherell and Katy Fuller – PCC members.

In reviewing the past year our various topics included (a) the interregnum with the vicar moving at the end of 2012 followed by the curate in July (b) the valiant support during the interregnum by visiting or retired clergy, our lay reader and family service team (c) the routine running of both churches (d) the preparation of our 'Parish Profile', informed by a 'Vision Day', and advertising the vacancy (e) the St Mary's Norman Wheel Window, for which funding has been achieved and work has started (f) Bridge Church being used as a Flood Control & Information Centre during the floods which disrupted village life last winter and (g) the good news that Canon Jonathan is our new priest and was duly licensed on 27 March 2014.

There are 81 names on the electoral roll and good attendances were recorded at our Christmas Carols and Christingle services. Sadly numbers attending other services and volunteering for church duties have declined, and whilst our costs are going up, our income is going down. We are told that falls in income and attendance are not uncommon during a period of interregnum but they present serious challenges for us all to address now that we have our new parish priest.

The first meeting of our new PCC is on 2nd July and any questions and/or comments will be welcome.

Patrixbourne's Georgian windows return...

Leonie Seliger, Head of Stained Glass Conservation at Canterbury Cathedral, reinstalls the glass of the wheel window at St Mary's Church, on 18 June.

'This is very special glass, made in 1837. Wheel Windows are very rare, and are the precursor of the Rose Window. This is a lovely window, with sharp colours, and is now safely restored.'

The stonework, dated 1170, has also been fully restored by specialist stonemasons. The PCC thanks Andrea Nicholson and Pauleen Pritchard for coordinating the project, and securing the fundraising and sponsorship for it to be successfully completed.

Dear Parishioners,

My name is Sally Daigneault (Vicki McPherson's sister) and I live in Washington State in the Pacific Northwest corner of America.

By the time you read this letter it will be more than a year that you have been praying for my recovery.

During the year 2013 I spent a total of 8 weeks in the hospital and underwent six surgeries (four in two weeks). After almost four weeks in a medically induced coma I spent almost five months in rehab. I finally came home on December the 17th. I still have no tendon behind the left knee so have to wear a brace all the time and use a Zimmer frame. I could undergo another surgery to reconstruct the knee but right now I cannot even conceive of going through surgery number 42!

I have come a long way from being clinically dead to where I am today. The doctors told my family that I would most likely not survive yet here I am living a somewhat normal life. It is truly a miracle and that miracle was bought about in part by your prayers – faithfully offered for my recovery.

I have been driving since the end of December (I am the only driver in my family at the moment so I thank God that my driving leg is still good). Meanwhile, I can never thank you enough for all of your prayers on my behalf.

Please know that you are in my prayers also.

Mill Centre- Mark Esdale reported that the City Council's Steering Group had rejected the Parish Council's bid to take over the lease of the Centre on the grounds that the plans did not provide enough value. As a result, the executive would probably reject the application and the Centre site would be sold for housing development. The Mill Centre Management Committee would be meeting later in the month to see if there was any way the Centre might be saved. It was reported that some of the money from the sale of the site might be given to the parish towards another youth centre, however it had already been demonstrated that here was no land available in the parish for such an alternative Centre and there was no indication from the City Council as to when and how much funding might be available.

Nailbourne Pollution — Cllr Alan Atkinson had circulated a detailed report. Around fifty flood alleviation projects had been identified in the area. Funding would be a problem and competition for money would be strong. It was suggested that Bridge might offer some contribution to fund flood alleviation schemes from its reserves. This might enable measures to protect the village to be implemented sooner. It was agreed to discuss some form of matched funding at the July parish council meeting. Meanwhile Cllr Atkinson had requested detailed costing of Bridge's proposed projects from the relevant engineer.

Patrixbourne Church Burial Ground Extension- Mrs Pauline Pritchard explained to the Parish Council that although Cantley Estates had given a new area of woodland to Patrixbourne Church to extend the burial ground, the legal costs of the land transfer would be £750 plus vat. The burial ground was currently available to residents of both Patrixbourne and Bridge. It was therefore agreed to contribute £450 from Parish funds towards the legal costs. Parking at Bridge School It was agreed that Cllr Robert Moon would be the parish council's liaison with Bridge Primary School on parking issues and would attend a meeting there on 26th. June. Councillors were asked to email Cllr Moon their thoughts about possible solutions to the problem before that meeting.

<u>Canterbury Local District Plan</u> - A paper copy and a disk of the Canterbury Local Plan had been received. Cllrs Sue Hodges and Ann Edmonds would attend a public meeting in early July .The parish Council's response to the Plan would be an agenda item in July.

<u>Bridge Neighbourhood Plan –</u> Adrian Verrall, the City Councils Planning Policy Manager had attended the May meeting of the Committee and commented fairly positively about the Neighbourhood Plan. Bridge was the only village in the District drawing up such a Plan. The traffic survey returns were being processed.

Recreation Ground – Cllr Brigitte Ward had now taken over the inspection folder again. She reported that the broken window in the pavilion had been temporarily boarded up, the picnic tables had been put out and the wooden frames had been removed from the ground. Cllr Hodges reported that Serco had said they would no longer collect orange refuse sacks from the recreation ground and that green bins should be used instead. As the various working parties had generated over 50 orange sacks of refuse this year, this did not seem a practical solution. Cllr Hodges was pursuing this matter.

Bridge Emergency Plan- Cllr Moon told the Council that Laurence Dunderdale had agreed to become a member of the Emergency Committee. Cllr Kate Wortham explained that the Committee was adapting an Emergency Plan template from KCC and simplifying it for Bridge's needs. A list of volunteers with appropriate skills was being drawn up.

<u>First Aid Course</u>_After some discussion it was agreed that the Emergency Plan Committee would identify possible volunteers to attend Emergency First Aid Courses. It was decided that the most cost effective way of doing this was for volunteers to join scheduled courses at either St John Ambulance or Red Cross Centres. The Clerk would investigate the possibilities and relative costs.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 1th. July at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall. The Planning Committee will meet prior to the Council Meeting at 7.15pm. All Bridge residents are welcome to attend these meetings.

be done under sedation or general anaesthesia as it can be uncomfortable otherwise.

It is a good idea to trim the fur around your dog's ears and feet in the summer months if they tend to be very active in long grass and we would recommend routinely checking for any lodged grass seeds after walks. If your dog does suddenly develop lameness, head shaking or sneezing during the summer months it




