

- 4) Reviewing our Christian Stewardship of time, talents and planned-giving to the Church.

We have many ideas, hopes and plans. Here are a few:

We are interested to find out what Bridge and Patrixbourne churches mean to you? What more could we be offering in the heart of our community?

I am meeting with a group of parents this month to explore what children seek in church to grow spiritually, and how we can work together to meet that need.

This is all exciting stuff. Watch this space for invitations to give your views and experience. What we seek is a church that is inclusive (for all ages and backgrounds), welcoming (new and old), prayerful and joyful, and deeply engaged with the community we are part of and serve.

Repairs to St Peter's Church Bridge

Many of you who visit or pass by St Peter's Bridge will have noticed the scaffolding in place around the main door in the west wall. This was erected to protect people entering the church, after stonework started to fall from high up on the wall. Inspection of the damage revealed that work was necessary to tie the west wall back into the structure of the church and to stop any further damage. Emergency repairs were carried out to brace the wall, but a proper repair of the wall is now urgently needed. A Quinquennial inspection of the church has shown many other problems with this aging building. Essential repairs which we need to carry out immediately are likely to cost £90,000 and other work will be required after that. In the meantime we are thinking carefully about how we may wish to use our church building in the future and your views on this will be sought in the coming months but first we need to ensure the safety of the building.

To enable these urgent repairs to be commenced we first need to raise the money. We are very grateful to everyone who responded to our recent Stewardship Renewal programme (there is still time to respond!) but that money is for the day-to-day costs of running our Parish and does not cover repair work to our buildings. We will be applying for grant aid to help us fund this essential building work, but we will be expected to cover some of the costs ourselves. At the moment we have very little money available for such a project, so this autumn we will have to start raising money. Any ideas on how we can achieve the sum of £90,000 will be gratefully received, but please look out for further details of our fundraising activities in future editions of this magazine. Abbreviated Minutes of a meeting of Bridge Parish Council held on Thursday 9 July 2015 in Bridge Village Hall at 7.30p.m.

The Clerk has written to the KCC Traffic Schemes to regarding the location of the bus stops in the village near the post office. Motorists are systematically driving on the pavement because of the location of the bus stops causing danger to pedestrians and damage to the kerbs and pavement.

Report from Canterbury City Councillor (Simon Cook)

The city council has a wide spectrum of responses to parking enforcement and is happy to take advice from parish councils. Councillors should write to him about specific concerns. He outlined the process for attempting to overturn the previous administration's decision to sell the Mill Centre. A final decision due in September 2015. The proposed sale of the centre is on hold until a final decision is reached.

Report from KCC Councillor (Michael Northey)

Cllr Northey assured the meeting he would follow up concerns raised in the village about traffic in the High St. He is happy to put his influence behind improving the environment in the Green Court area.

He updated Council on the latest developments in Operation Stack, Ofsted inspections of schools in Kent and the increasing numbers of unaccompanied immigrant minors.

Recreation Ground

Councillors agreed to delegate to the recreation ground committee the task of creating a vision for the future of the recreation ground. This will include consideration of the pavilion refurbishment, fencing off the children's play area, and the provision of picnic benches.

Neighbourhood Plan.

Joe Connor, Chair, reported that the revision of the plan is ongoing with a further meeting to be held on 10 July 2015 to discuss future housing in Bridge. The group will also give initial responses to a plan received on 9 July from Cantley Estates.

School Liaison meeting feedback.

Councillors will attend a school council meeting in September 2015. The school would like community volunteers to assist in the school. Relevant checks will be carried out by the school on behalf of potential volunteers.

Canterbury City Council Local Plan-how to respond to the financial request made by a parishioner at the last meeting and feedback on the village's representation at the forthcoming hearings.

Prof Clive Church is aware of the responses made by Bridge Parish Council in July 2014. It was felt he would be well suited to present the case for the village.

Speedwatch equipment.

If purchased, Cllr Fawke suggested the equipment would be used 2-4 times per month.

Improving the KCC maintained environment in Green Court.

It was decided to write to KCC highways about the prospect of grassing over the area. The issue will return to the next meeting.

Village tree survey

Cllr Fawke tabled a copy of the proposed questionnaire which is to be refined in the light of comments received.

Skateboarding event during October half term.

It was decided to hold the joint skateboarding event (with Bekesbourne) on Bridge recreation ground on Wednesday 28 October 2015.

A fence around the childrens' play area on the recreation ground.

This will form part of the wider discussions about the recreation ground and return as a fully costed proposal.

To review the process for the appointment of a Local Warden.

Bridge's application to take part in a pilot scheme has been successful

Any other business

Cllr A Atkinson tabled plans submitted to him that very day by Cantley estates for a limited number of houses to be built in the village in return for the resolution of many outstanding issues affecting the village. It was agreed to return to the matter for full discussion at the September meeting.

Cllr Hodges asked about the relocation of an unstable parking sign in the layby on Western Avenue.

The next meeting of Bridge Parish Council will be on Thursday 10 September 2015 at 7.30pm in Bridge Village Hall.

Notes on a meeting of Bekesbourne with Patrixbourne Parish Council July 13th 2015

The Parish Council Meeting commenced with a minute's silence in remembrance of Joe Atkins, a former member of the Parish Council, who had made a large contribution to parish life over many years.

The current Parish Council does not have a full quota of councillors. Mr Tim Fagan was interested in becoming a Councillor and at the meeting was co-opted onto the Council. Councillor Fagan will represent the interests of Parishioners who live in the area of Lackenden Cottages. The Council's Emergency Plan had been circulated around the members and the meeting agreed to adopt the document. This will now be published on the Parish website and forwarded to the interested statutory authorities.

The Council in conjunction with Bridge Parish Council has been given the funding to run a Skate Park Day for local children at Bridge Recreation Ground during the autumn half term. Further details, such as information on booking for the event will be published in due course.

The Council was informed that the lease held by Bekesbourne Sports Club for the use of Bekesbourne recreation ground had been terminated. In future the Recreation Ground Management Committee would take over the letting of the field, and that agreements were likely to be made with local teams for the continued use of the ground for games of football.

The Parish Council agreed to make a contribution towards the work of further straightening the river channel as the river approaches the bridge in the middle of Patrixbourne. This work is to aid the flow of water through the culvert at times of flooding.

ansporting your cat to the vets

us experience for your cat. At Bourne Veterinary be as stress-free as possible. Here are some tips to surgery:-

iully. There are many different types of carrier available de one which will last, as your cat should make at least n annual health check and vaccination.

e top and has a side opening too, is ideal. This means

the top can be removed, leaving your cat in the base of the box to be examined. A side opening/door front also means that your cat can willingly enter the carrier.

Leave the basket out at home so your cat sees it regularly. It is a good idea to put treats and a familiar blanket or towel in there as this will make your cat feel more secure and reassured. Over time, you may actually find your cat will then use the carrier as one of his regular beds. Be patient!

If you need to bring your cat to the surgery and he is not yet accustomed to his carrier, then place it in a quiet room without too many hiding places, and encourage your cat to go into the carrier with some treats. If this is not successful, gently pick your cat up and place in the basket if it is a top-opening carrier. Some cats prefer to go in through the door bottom first i.e. reverse, so try this if you have a door-opening carrier.

If your cat panics at the sight of the carrier, use a thick towel or blanket to wrap the cat in and place both cat and towel in the carrier quickly and carefully.

The use of a facial pheromone spray (FeliwayTM) in the carrier can also help reduce stress and anxiety. Spray the four corners of the carrier about 15-30 minutes before you need to use it (the cat should not be in the carrier when you do this). The time allows the alcohol in the spray to evaporate and for the pheromone to diffuse in the carrier. FeliwayTM is available over the counter from the surgery.

Secure the carrier in the car with a seatbelt, avoiding the front seat if there is an airbag. Avoid playing loud music and drive smoothly. Your cat will pick up on your stress, so try to keep calm.

It is a good idea to place a towel or blanket over the carrier when carrying it to and from the car and in the surgery. Bringing spare bedding is also useful in case your cat has any little accidents during the journey.

When you arrive at the surgery, if you would prefer to wait in the car with your cat then pop into the waiting room and let the receptionist know this and which car you are in.

Alternatively, we have a designated cat waiting area to the right of the reception desk. Please feel free to place your carrier up off the floor on to the seat. We will also be happy to provide you with a towel or blanket to pop over your carrier, so your cat feels more secure, away from waffling doggy noses if they come past!

Taking your cat on short car rides that do not involve a trip to the vets also helps to reduce negative associations with both the carrier and the car.


